Did You Know... I was visiting the park with a couple of my Grandkids and was overwhelmed by the number of families playing and enjoying themselves. Did You Know... Your Council recently established a Special Fee titled Utility Infrastructure Fee. This small monthly \$10 fee will help fund repairs and rehabilitation as well as contribute to construction to meet present and future public water and sewer utility needs.

Did You Know... Code Enforcement has issued a Notice of Violation for more than 4 four legged animals – which includes 'Community or Outdoor Cats which you are feeding. According to a study cited by the Washington Post, Outdoor Cats are the leading cause of death among birds killing over 1.4 billion birds each year. Outdoor cats not only bring other animal species to extinction levels, but they also spread diseases (rabies &Toxoplasmosis).Indoor cats can be cute and cuddly but Outdoor cats are always killers. George H. Fenwick, president of American Bird Conservancy, said the findings should serve as "a wake-up call for cat owners and communities to get serious about this problem before even more ecological damage occurs." Food for thought.

Did You Know... by the time you get this Newsletter, Tim Hortons, or Timmie's as it is known to it's many fans, should be open. Go by check Timmie's out and welcome them to Meadow Place Their store is in the Sam's parking lot along West Airport. IRS Scams

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or IRS (phishing@irs.gov) to report suspicious activity.

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information.

Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.
- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear

- legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.
- Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide
 an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a
 receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that
 contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an
 email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS
 letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their
 victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.

The IRS will not:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you
 for not paying. If you don't owe taxes or have no reason to
 think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang
 up immediately.

Winter In Texas - When It's 80 Degrees Outside

Being prepared for our Winter season has been a topic of prior Newsletters. But when the weather outside has a high of 80 degrees forecast it can be difficult to take the information seriously. None the less the

weather will change, and temperatures will drop. In Texas if you don't like the weather wait for a short while and it will move into another season, probably not the one you expected.

By now we should be ready to wrap outside water pipe with insulation, if this has not been done *and wrap shut off valves* that will freeze. Plants should be protected from the freeze also. Sprinkler systems should be adjusted down to account for the wet rainy season and save water.

FROZEN PIPES INSIDE YOUR HOME WILL CAUSE THE MOST DAMAGE

When we have a Hard Freeze, pipes will freeze. If you think that there are frozen pipes in your home, shut the water off immediately. There are two locations to shut off the water, one at the meter and the second is close to the house where the line enters the building. Please familiarize yourself with both locations. If you need emergency assistance to shut your water service, call the <u>USW 24-hour call line at 832-756-2143</u>. Some leaks are small but consistent and will run up your water bill monthly.

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1) Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2) Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3) Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4) If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5) If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6) If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7) If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

Trash/Bins at Curb on a Day not a Trash Day is Prohibited









Trash/Bins at Curb on a day not a Trash Day is prohibited & Mold/Mildew wherever present on Exterior of homes shall be cleaned off.

Refuse Prohibited at or near streets and curbs (Not a trash day) 130.09(A): It shall be unlawful and in violation of this code and punishable to the maximum extent permitted by law for any resident, citizen or inhabitant of the city to keep, store or to maintain rubbish of any type upon or adjacent to public streets or public street rights-of-way in the city except for the purpose of depositing for a normal and customary trash pickup, which shall only be permissible not more than 18 hours before a scheduled trash pickup.

Exterior Structure (General) IMPC 304.1: The exterior of a structure shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and sanitary so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare.

Please Remember that Mailbox March is around the corner. 2 easy qualifier steps to get 10.00 off your next billing cycle after March.

- 1 Take a photo of your Mailbox before and one after renewing/repainting/replacing your mailbox.
- 2 Submit your before and after photos together between MARCH 1st MARCH 31st to Courtney Rutherford at citysecretary@cityofmeadowsplace.org.

Submittals after March 31st will not be accepted.

Our Home & Garden Club members hope everyone stayed warm and safe during the January Artic Blast.

If you weren't able to cover some of your outdoor plants, not to worry. Some plants may look dead, but parts of the stems and roots might still be alive. Cut off the dead parts as soon as the sub-freezing temps are gone. If the roots survived the plant will start to come back.

Remember not to fertilize your lawn until the temps are above 60 degrees.

February to March is the time to plant your tomato plants. If planting in pots, it's recommended to wait until nighttime temps are above 55 degrees.






