

MINUTES OF THE MEADOWS PLACE CHARTER COMMISSION MEETING HELD ON FEBRUARY 24, 2021 AT 6:30 P.M., VIRTUALLY VIA ZOOM.

1. Call to Order and Announce a Quorum is Present:

The meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. with the following Commissioners present:

There was discussion among the Commission, Legal Counsel, and staff regarding salaries of the Mayor and Council. There was discussion regarding when new salaries would go into effect.

Commission Young withdrew her motion.

Commissioner Fenwick made a motion that Council set salaries via an ordinance with a record vote by Council and the new rate being effective in the fiscal year after the City general election.

There was more discussion regarding the salary rates and when new rates would be effective. The Commission agreed to let legal counsel draft the Charter to this point with language regarding Mayor and Council per the discussion.

Commissioner Fenwick withdrew his motion.
