Zoning vs. Deed Restrictions

After the meeting where the six person Chicken Research Committee presented its results and recommendation to City Council, I received a question asking why the city could not enforce the existing homeowners deed restrictions. The short answer is, the City enforces Zoning, homeowners enforce Deed Restrictions.

Zoning is the power of a municipality to protect the health, safety and public welfare of the community. This is a legislative power exercised by a governmental entity, in this case, the City of Meadows Place.

Deed restrictions are contractual agreements made between property owners restricting land to a particular use. Deed restrictions can restrict a piece of property to virtually any use and can also govern such features as the presence and dimensions of trees, fencing heights, or the ownership of livestock – including poultry.

In the case of Meadows Place, the deed restrictions were in place long before we were a city. However, the Meadows Place Homeowners Association is no longer a viable body(and why we do not pay HOA fees). However, as I understand it, that does not take away the homeowners ability to enforce deed restrictions individually by taking someone to district court.

Basically, by law, cities cannot assume the legal right of the homeowner to enforce the covenants contained within a homeowner's deed restrictions. Cities enforce Zoning.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection



Household hazardous wastes are disposed of improperly when poured down the drain, on the ground, in storm sewers or in the trash. The dangers of such disposal may not be immediately obvious, but certain household hazardous wastes can contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems; harm children

and pets and cause injury or sanitation workers. When poured in storm drains, contamination of the local water body occurs.



Many homes and garages in Fort Bend County are currently storing products, which are classified as hazardous by the EPA. An estimated 1.6 million tons of household hazardous waste are generated by Americans each year. Officials estimate that between three and 10 gallons of cleaning products, solvents, automobile fluids, garden chemicals, fertilizers and other materials hazardous to human health or the environment can be found in the average household. When these products are no longer needed or wanted, they are called household hazardous waste and should receive special storage, handling and disposal.

The Fort Bend County's Solid Waste Advisory Committee is proud to offer a Household Hazardous Waste Collection for Fort Bend County's citizens. The collection site will be staffed by personnel trained to handle hazardous waste and the materials collected will be disposed of according to EPA regulations.

How about this wacky weather that we've been having! Cold, Warm, Wet, cold then warm all over again! God Bless Texas weather! Now the problems set in...Mold on our homes, grass and weeds getting out of control...Literally, a few minutes of work on the weekend can save you a load of trouble later in the coming months.

I will be out providing friendly reminders to the residents of homes that are starting to show mold, rotten siding, fascia and fences....I suspect that I will be busy, as there are a lot of homes here that need this attention.

Here are three friendly reminders:

1. Our ordinances require that your dog remain on your property unless restrained on a leash. This means that you may not just open your front door or gate to allow your pet outside to do its business and when you walk your dog, you SHALL maintain control of the animal via a leash/rope or other device that is sturdy enough to maintain positive control of the animal. In addition, you are required by ordinance to pick up after your dog. .

2. March is Mailbox Month. Mail/E-Mail/Deliver, before and after pics of your remodeled mailbox to me or City Hall and receive \$10 off your utility bill.

3. If you are having work done to your home, verify that your contractor is registered with the city. This helps protect you from scams as well as guarantees that the proper permits are pulled and inspections are performed.


A question arose recently concerning the process from getting a warning to receiving a citation. The resident thought a 10 day grace period was required and that is not true. To obtain code compliance the city will give occasionally give warnings but is not required to do so. The city can, and has, issued citations for Code Violations without issuing written warnings. There just has to be at least 10 days in between the receipt of the citation and the court appearance date.


