Code Enforcement Efforts

The City of Meadows Place, our Code Enforcement Officer and City Attorney have been quite busy recently. In addition to patrolling on some weekends, Robert Revis has been busy issuing Notices of Violations, Warnings and Citations. This is good, but more importantly Robert is getting great

compliance response from the residents of Meadows Place. You may have noticed that several trailers and vehicles have been removed from the city and many, many stumps have been removed. Trash cans are being put away and several fences have been replaced or removed. There has been some significant movement at a couple of abandoned houses. These may end up with Robert bringing Substandard Housing charges before City Council. Randle Law Offices have gotten Cease and Desist injunctions, warrants signed and are working with Robert on several cases. Robert responds to and documents every complaint quickly, so everyone is encouraged to report Code Violations either by email, or anonymously through the city website.

Contract Review and Renewal

Several years ago, I began tracking and documenting all city contracts. This was a big improvement but I haven't quite been satisfied. Until now-thanks to major improvements in the process. Last month, Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston, City Secretary Courtney Rutherford, Police Chief Gary Stewart, Public Works Director Danny Segundo and Parks Director Colene Cabezas and I spent a good part of the day going through the through the hundred and twenty or so contracts and. I feel we (they) got a lot done, and because of our increased awareness, understanding and departmental input, we are better able to manage the contracts for the city. These folks do a great job for us and are a big reason Meadows Place is... *Our Place for Life*.
