The Meadows Place Community Development Program (MPCDP). was adopted unanimously by City Council with the goal of getting people back in empty houses, and to protect the overall health quality of housing stock in the City. Actions like this keep Meadows Place- Your Place for Life.

**Did You Know...** You can sign up for Auto draft for your Utility (Water) Bill?

**Did You Know...** Meadows Place ordinance § 90.06 limits the number of cats and dogs you can keep – or feed. It states: It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, possess, maintain or allow to be kept, harbored, possessed or maintained more than four dogs or four cats or a combination of such animals with the total number not exceeding four, over four months old, upon or within any premises owned, occupied or under the control of the person within the city. The key word for many will be Maintain. If you are feeding them, you are maintaining them and are subject to a visit from Code Enforcement where you will be advised to remove them. Remember, the number is....4. No more.

#### **Construction Updates Continued**

1. Meadows Elementary is still on schedule to open January 2021. They have finished all major pours so we won't see any more long lines of concrete trucks. We are struggling to keep our irrigation lines in that area up and running and they are going to relocate one of the baseball light poles. We will see progress in chunks as the steel goes up. We are planning to produce a time lapse photo strip for us to look at when the project is over. Should be fun.

2. Kirkwood Roundabouts are completed but we are still waiting on CenterPoint to deliver the decorative light poles. They put in the supports and the underground lines

which means we can put in the irrigation lines and the landscaping. Hope to see it finished by end of April.

3. CenterPoint High Tension Towers in Meadows Place are part of a year-long tower replacement project. They are taking down the old wooden structures, one tall tower and replacing them. This means trucks, cranes, steel and equipment used and will be stored on their right-of-way and parking lot. We may have times when the parking lot is open but are at the mercy of the weather and other projects. Improvements like this taking place mean higher standards for our little city making sure Meadows Place will continue to be...*Your* **Place for** *Life*!





# Suggest 10 Cyber Crime Prevention Tips for 2020

#### 1. Use Strong Passwords

Use different user ID / password combinations for different accounts and avoid writing them down. Make the passwords more complicated by combining letters, numbers, special characters (minimum 10 characters in total) and change them on a regular basis.

#### 2. Secure your computer

- o Activate your firewall
- o Use anti-virus/malware software
- o Block spyware attacks

#### 3. Be Social-Media Savvy

Make sure your social networking profiles (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, MSN, etc.) are set to private. Check your security settings. Be careful what information you post online. Once it is on the Internet, it is there forever!

#### 4. Secure your Mobile Devices

Be aware that your mobile device is vulnerable to viruses and hackers. Download applications from trusted sources.

**5. Install the latest operating system updates** Keep your applications and operating system (e.g. Windows, Mac, Linux) current

#### 6. Protect your Data

Use encryption for your most sensitive files such as tax returns or financial records, make regular back-ups of all your important data, and store it in another location.

#### 7. Secure your wireless network

Wi-Fi (wireless) networks at home are vulnerable to intrusion if they are not properly secured. Review and modify default settings. Public Wi-Fi, a.k.a. "Hot Spots", are also vulnerable. Avoid conducting financial or corporate transactions on these networks.

#### 8. Protect your e-identity

Be cautious when giving out personal information such as your name, address, phone number or financial information on the Internet. Make sure that websites are secure (e.g. when making online purchases) or that you've enabled privacy settings (e.g. when accessing/ using social networking sites).

#### 9. Avoid being scammed

Always think before you click on a link or file of unknown origin. Don't feel pressured by any emails. Check the source of the message. When in doubt, verify the source. Never reply to emails that ask you to verify your information or confirm your user ID or password.

#### 10. Call the right person for help

Don't panic! If you are a victim, if you encounter illegal Internet content (e.g. child exploitation) or if you suspect a computer crime, identity theft or a commercial scam, report this to your local police. If you need help with maintenance or software installation on your computer, consult with your service provider or a certified computer technician.



# **Code Enforcment**

March is upon us, soon we will be seeing our greenery bloom! With this in mind, please remember that the time for cutting grass more frequently and trimming trees is close.

Let's all work together to ensure trees get trimmed so our new firetruck does not get damaged from low branches over the streets or sidewalks. Our Ordinance from 2008-22 Section 20-14 states: Trees must be trimmed so as to provide a minimum clearance from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk of not less than ten (10) feet and over the street/pavement of not less than sixteen (16) feet.

# **Mosquitoes Control**

# Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes <u>outside</u> your home

• Install or repair and use window and door screens. Do not leave doors propped open.

• Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near water.

- ► Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
- ► For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- ► Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.

• Use an outdoor flying insect spray where mosquitoes rest. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid areas like under patio furniture, or under the carport or garage. When using insecticides, always follow label instructions.



# Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes inside your home

• Keep windows and doors shut and use air conditioning when possible.

• Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs inside your home. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.

• Kill mosquitoes inside your home. Use an indoor flying insect fogger\* or indoor insect spray\* to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow label directions. Only using insecticide will not keep your home free of mosquitoes.

► Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid places like under the sink, in closets, under furniture, or in the laundry room.

# LIFEGUARDS & SWIM INSTRUCTORS

The City of Meadows Place is accepting applications for Summer 2020. Applications can be picked up and turned in at City of Meadows Place City Hall or Nature & Discovery Center @ 11938 Amblewood Dr. <u>Must be 15 years of age to apply.</u>

If applying for the lifeguard position, you must pass the prerequisite requirements, and available for one of the following lifeguard classes:

**Prerequisites:** Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit without using steps or ladder.

\*Must attend all 3 days to become certified \*
