Demolition

A house in Meadows Place was demolished by the City last month. It was regretful and a painful process but after years of dealing with a substandard and problem property on Dorrance Ln. the property was ordered demolished by order of a Fort Bend County District Court. The action took place after the city had moved slowly through our

substandard housing process. The City has been dealing with this for some time and made it clear on many occasions, including public hearings, and multiple court summons, that this was a possibility.

To be clear, the City did not take over the property and our lawyers have been involved for years.

The City and our attorneys were diligent in our efforts to work with the homeowner. Council even granted the owner another extension and let the owner set the dates to come in compliance. The failure to meet even the extended deadlines and responsibilities outlined in the court order is what predicated this action. This is not something we want to do, it is extreme, but for the sake of the neighbors and the well-being of the city, we will do our duty to maintain the health, safety, and welfare of Meadows Place even when it is painful. Dorrance Construction

The pre-bid meeting has taken place and the Dorrance Construction bid packets have been sent out. This is an odd year, what with war in Europe, inflation and supply chain problems so we have no idea how our project will be received by the contracting community. Rick Staigle and Nick Haby researched other road projects and were unsure what the bid response to our project would be. Bids will be back before this reaches your door so I am keeping my fingers crossed.

Did You Know... Investing in Meadows Place

All the construction you see – and will continue to see – is an indicator that the city is investing in itself but others are investing in Meadows Place as well. New businesses have just arrived, and more are on their way. But wait, there's more! Homeowners are investing in our city too. From February 2021 thru February 2022 we had over 50 homeowners apply for over a million dollars in remodeling permits. Twelve had renovation values between \$10,000 and \$20,000; 9 families invested between \$20,000 and \$40,000 with 9 families over \$40,000. - 2 of which were over \$70,000. Flushable Wipes and F.O.G.

Cities and Utility companies have urged customers for years to ignore the "flushable" label on wipes and instead throw them in the trash. They've also communicated the fat, oil, and grease (FOG) should not be poured down the sink but rather disposed of in the garbage, yet both materials have been making their way

to the wastewater treatment plants and causing costly issues.

These problems are nothing new. Flushable wipes and FOG have been plaguing wastewater treatment facilities for decades. But for the last few years, water professionals have seen an alarming increase in the level of build-up at their plants.

On the city of Meadows Place Web site, you will find a "Did you Know" video that documents the wipes issue at our wastewater treatment plant.

Why You Should Never Flush Flushable Wipes

It's widely marketed that a flushable wipe are designed to disintegrate once we flush the toilet, but in reality, they don't. Unlike toilet paper that breaks down in roughly 24 hours, wipes remain intact once they make their way down the drain.

These sanitary products have been found in drainpipes months after being flushed. Because they do not break down, they build upon one another and form a massive mound that can clog pipes and back up plumbing systems, which is costly to repair.

If wipes make it to a treatment plant, they become caught on the edge of lift station pumps. As wipes continue to collect on these pipes, they begin to bog down the treatment system, damage equipment, burn up pumps, and in some cases, cause the water treatment system to fail.

Too many wipes in the treatment system can cause raw sewage to back up into homes, which is never a pleasant experience. And when these materials combine with FOG, they create an expensive foe for wastewater treatment systems.

How Bad is it to Pour Grease Down the Drain?

Restaurants are equipped with grease traps to handle the cooking grease they generate, but households are typically not equipped with this key wastewater industry tool. And with more people cooking at home, more fat, oil, and grease (FOG) are building up in treatment systems across the Lone Star State.

FOG combines with flushable wipes as they make their way to a treatment facility. Once there, both materials will accumulate into a "greaseberg", which is a large mound of non-biodegradable sanitary materials combined with FOG. This material can completely clog a sewer system and requires frequent jetting and chemical additives to break down.

Greaseberg can also cause major issues with lift stations and sewage pumps downstream. When the build-up reaches a wastewater treatment plant, it can block screens and filter systems, clog sludge pumps, and increase sludge volumes – all of which are costly to repair.

Addressing these issues at Meadows Place wastewater treatment plant will include upgrade to the lift station pumps and controls and the installation of a mechanical bar screen to prevent these foreign materials from entering the system. And after the equipment has been installed, the city/operator will have to address the decades long build up of inorganic material in the bottom of the tanks within the facility. Fortunately, the facility can be cleaned without interruption of the treatment process.

Please do your part and don't flush "flushable wipes" and take some time to review the "Did you Know" video that addresses this issue, on our Web Site.

Solicitors and Peddlers City Ordinance

The Meadows Place Police Department receives many calls in reference to person(s) going door to door for various reasons (soliciting/peddling). The City of Meadows Place has an ordinance regulating this type of

activity. The following is a brief summary of the ordinance. Permits are issued by the City of Meadows Place permits division at City Hall. Permits are issued on a case by case basis not to exceed a three month period. Questions about permits should be directed to the Permits Division at city hall. For concerns about a solicitor/peddler, contact the police department.

Soliciting/peddling in the city limits of Meadows Place is allowed under certain circumstances. A permit issued by the City of Meadows Place is required in most cases; noncommercial is an exception to the rule. Each solicitor/peddler is to have in their possession and ready to display when requested a City of Meadows Place issued permit to


solicit/peddle. Solicitors/peddlers, who have a valid permit are allowed to operate from one-half hour after sun rise to one half-hour before sunset.

Some examples of Solicitors/Peddlers:

- Someone knocking on the door selling for Comcast, AT&T, or other sales.
- Mobile vendors such as a food or ice cream trucks in the neighborhood.

In closing, the property owner has the right to specify "No Solicitation", posted on the front of their premise. This makes it a violation for any person to enter upon the premise may be soliciting or peddling. Please contact the Meadows Place Police Department if you see someone who may be a solicitor or other suspicious person in the neighborhood.








CAMPOUT IN THE PARK


