City Election 2023

One of the items on the February Council agenda was to Receive and Accept the Certification of Unopposed Candidates for the May 7, 2023 General Election. This means we will have no election involving Meadows Place Council positions this year and I am pleased to announce both Kelle Mills and Kurt Kopczynski will remain in office, should they choose to

do so. Typically, we contract the operation of the election to the County which greatly reduces the cost and simplifies the process as they supply the equipment and the personnel. This is a budgeted item every year with the funds remaining in the General Fund account if not used for a City election. Meadows Place will serve as a polling place so we will retain the convenience of a having a polling station right here in Meadows Place. City Secretary, Courtney Rutherford, handles our elections so if you have any questions about our elections or the local election process, contact Courtney.

Situational Awareness

In today's climate, the Meadows Place Police Department is reminding everyone to be "Situationally Aware" of their surroundings.

Police Chief Gary Stewart Situational awareness, in the most basic definition, is being aware of your surroundings and the activities going on around you. With more and

more distractions in our everyday lives, it is important to have situational awareness. Whether you are driving down the road, at work, on vacation, or even at the mall you need to be aware of what is happening around you. This will allow you to take the necessary actions to avoid potential dangers. Not every situation can be prevented. In those cases, situational awareness may not help you avoid a dangerous situation, but it can increase your reaction time and thus improve the quality of the decisions you make. This information is not meant to create fear but rather to assist you in becoming more aware of the world around you. Situational awareness begins when individuals recognize that threats, hazards, or dangers can and do exist.

We all get distracted by our cell phones, electronic devices, talking with friends, or the like. However, when out in public you must be "present". Remaining present while in public is not always easy but the following tips may help:

- · Be focused and remain vigilant
- Allow all your senses to be present; take time to look around you periodically
- Do not fixate on your cell phone, tablet, books, or other visuals for a prolonged period
- Do not have headphones or earplugs in both ears

- When on public transportation don't fall asleep during the commute
- · Do not become complacent

While practicing good situational awareness, we may fail to focus on the entire environment. Focusing on a greater distance ahead of you will provide you with increased opportunities to move in a new direction or prepare for a potential threat.

When looking ahead look for the following:

- · Make decisions based on your environment
- · Look for exit routes
- Look for police or security, or other authorities that may be of help if needed
- · Look for suspicious people or others to avoid
- Look for hazards to avoid including any non-criminal elements such as puddles, potholes, vehicles, etc.

A valuable tool you can utilize to help improve your own mindset and awareness in an emergency is the "What If?" game. As you go about your day pose questions to yourself such as, "What if I feel like I am being followed?", "What if there was someone near my parked car that I don't recognize?, "What if a fire or shooting happens while I am shopping in a store?", Hopefully, you will never need to use them.

Flushable Wipes and F.O.G.

Cities and Utility companies have Uurged customers for years to ignore the "flushable "label on wipes and instead throw them in the trash. They've also communicated the fat, oil, and grease (FOG) should not be poured down the sink but

rather disposed of in the garbage, yet both materials have been making their way to the wastewater treatment plants and causing costly issues.

These problems are nothing news. Flushable wipes and FOG have been plaguing wastewater treatment facilities for decades. But for the last few years, water professionals have seen an alarming increase in the level of build-up at their plants.

On the city of Meadows Place Web site, you will find a "Did you Know "video that documents the wipes issue at our wastewater treatment plant.

Why You Should Never Flush Flushable Wipes

It's widely marketed that a flushable wipe is designed to disintegrate once we flush the toilet, but in reality, they don't. Unlike toilet paper that breaks down in roughly 24 hours, wipes remain intact once they make their way down the drain.

These sanitary products have been found in drainpipes months after being flushed. Because they do not break down, they build upon one another and form a massive mound that can clog pipes and back up plumbing systems, which is costly to repair.

If wipes make it to a treatment plant, they become caught on the edge of lift station pumps. As wipes continue to collect on these pipes, they begin to bog down the treatment system, damage equipment, burn up pumps, and in some cases, cause the water treatment system to fail.

Too many wipes in the treatment system can cause raw sewage to back up into homes, which is never a pleasant experience. And when these materials combine with FOG, they create an expensive foe for wastewater treatment systems.

How Bad is it to Pour Grease Down the Drain?

Restaurants are equipped with grease traps to handle the cooking grease they generate, but households are typically not equipped with this key wastewater industry tool. And with more people cooking at home, more fat, oil, and grease (FOG) are building up in treatment systems across the Lone Star State.

FOG combines with flushable wipes as they make their

way to a treatment facility. Once there, both materials will accumulate into a "greaseberg", which is a large mound of non-biodegradable sanitary materials combined with FOG. This material can completely clog a sewer system and requires frequent jetting and chemical additives to break down.

Greaseberg can also cause major issues with lift stations and sewage pumps downstream. When the build-up reaches a wastewater treatment plant, it can block screens and filter systems, clog sludge pumps, and increase sludge volumes – all of which are costly to repair.

Addressing these issues at Meadows Place wastewater treatment plant will include upgrade to the lift station pumps and controls and the installation of a mechanical bar screen to prevent these foreign materials from entering the system. And after the equipment has been installed, the city/operator will have to address the decades long build up of inorganic material in the bottom of the tanks within the facility. Fortunately, the facility can be cleaned without interruption of the treatment process.

Please do your part and don't flush "flushable wipes" and take some time to review the "Did you Know" video that addresses this issue, on our Web Site.





Did the Winter Freeze Kill Your Plants?



If you are not sure whether or not your plants, trees, or landscaping are dead: Try a scratch test to see if they are still alive.

Scratch test and video: Remember, if you can scratch the plant's surface and see a thin bright lime green membrane between the bark and the white of the plant, it is still alive! Important Notification: Starting on April 16, 2023, the city will resume addressing Ordinance 91.035 regarding Nuisance dead landscaping, trees, and grass. The time frame normally given is 21 days to come into compliance, but due to the winter freeze there will be a grace period of 30 days to come into compliance for any cases addressed during this April.

Ordinance: 91.035 Nuisance Declared; Duty to Abate-Whenever weeds, brush, rubbish and all other objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter of whatever nature shall exist, covering or partially covering the surface of any lots or parcels of any real estate situated within the city, or when any of the lots or parcels of real estate as aforesaid, shall have the surface thereof filled or partly filled with holes or be in such condition that the same holds or is liable to hold stagnant water therein, or if from any other cause shall be in such condition as to cause disease, or produce, harbor or spread disease germs of any nature or tend to render the surrounding atmosphere unhealthy, unwholesome or obnoxious, or shall contain unwholesome matter of any kind or description, the same is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance, the prompt abatement of which is hereby declared to be a public necessity. Any such nuisance shall be removed from the property by the owner or other person in possession or control of the property.

During January 17, 2023, thru February 13, 2023, there were a total of **144** Violations, **216** Notices issued, and **224** inspections completed. The following are the top **5** items that needed the most attention during this period.


