Kelle did tell me she came up two short for the PD so she used Halloween gift bags to make up the difference. She did call Assistant Chief Ashton and told him so he wouldn't think she had totally lost her mind. Lots of people spread love and joy on Valentines Day. Thank You Kelle!

Did You Know... we shredded over 100 boxes or records last month. The law dictates how we are to house, handle and destroy all records. Our City Secretary, Courtney Rutherford. is in charge of Records Retention and does a good job at it. Thank You, Courtney.

Did You Know... Meadows Place has an ordinance on the books that is intended to give us some leverage in dealing with Short Term Rentals like VRBO and Airbnb. Thanks to the State, it is a very complicated issue, but ultimately gives

us the right to withdraw a Short Term Rental permit for some period of time. This is only able to be enacted after there have been two Citations issued upon the licensed property within a 12-month rolling period. These must be reported by you. Offenses include excess noise, disturbances, profanity, etc. The ordinance number is ORDINANCE NO. 2022-30. Please check it out, and understand, the City recognizes Short Term Rentals can be a quality of life issue for those who live adjacent to the rental property and will do whatever we can to lessen the disruptions. I will say, Airbnb has been very responsive and helped quickly rectify problem situations in the past. If there is a problem, please call the PD while the disturbance is going on and let them address it. Thank You.

Did You Know... Each February, for four days, the world comes together for the love of birds. Over these four days, The Great Backyard Bird Count invites people to spend time in their favorite places watching and counting as many birds as they can find for 15 minutes and then reporting them. These observations help scientists better understand global bird populations. Meadows Place residents like Kay Ewing, are a part of this and have reported several species of backyard birds including the beautiful scaley breasted munia, tufted titmouse, chickadees, cardinals, purple finches, the ever-popular yellow breasted sapsucker and more. This is an easy and fun event which connects our one square mile of wonderful to the rest of the world.

Did You Know... Public Works Director Rod Hainey, has completed his sidewalk survey and identified 60 locations with the worst trip hazards. Repairs are underway and will continue. As we work through these, Rod will refine the list, keeping an eye on funding to get the most repairs for the buck. He will continue to monitor our sidewalks and add to the list. He cares. WEEDS and/or GRASS





It is unlawful to allow your WEEDS and/or GRASS to grow higher than 9 inches. Remove weeds and/or mow lawn to stay compliant. (The top of the blue tape on yardstick in photo is 9 inches in height.)

91.039 - Limitation On Height of Grass and Weeds: (A) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot or lots in the city to allow weeds and/or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of more than nine inches. Weeds and/or grass of a height exceeding nine inches are declared a nuisance. (B) The requirements of this section apply to any public right-of-way or easement or portion thereof located on the real property or portion thereof required to be cut, including specifically the areas of any real property that extend to or abut upon any curb or paved portion of a public street, the area between a public sidewalk and a public street or highway, and ditches and drainage channels located thereon

Parking Violation

The City of Meadows Place and the Meadows Place Police Department strive to ensure the safety of pedestrian and vehicular traffic throughout the city. As a friendly reminder, the Texas Transportation Code tells us that a vehicle on a street designed for two-way traffic must be parked with the right-side

wheels next to the curb. If you are parked with the driver's side door next to the curb, you are in violation and subject to be cited.

The City of Meadows Place further restricts parking according to the city ordinance by requiring motor vehicles to have a current motor vehicle registration and inspection sticker. Violation of this ordinance may result in a citation. Such ordinances are in place to ensure the quality of our neighborhood and the safety of our residents and their guests. "Water is Life" and Do You Have a Latent Leak?

Texas Water Utilities Association has used the above slogan for a few years. Water is also a commodity and a very valuable resource that we rely on and pay

for each month. "Eye on Water" is an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's free to the residents of Meadows Place.

Do you have a latent leak? The entire State has just gone through a major freeze sometimes damaged pipes can have a leak that will go unnoticed for a period.

How can you tell if you have a leak?

- 1) Monitor EyeOnWater for a change in consumption.
- 2) Use your meter as a leak detection tool.

How much water does the average person use daily/monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location. The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half.

Meadows Place water consumption

The City of Meadows Place utilizes three Gateways to gather information about water consumption within the city. The Gateway is a radio receiver that communicates with each water meter within the city limits.

Current status of system:

- 99.4 % of meters with an OK status, which amounts to 1583 separate meters that are functioning properly.
- Average daily consumption for the city is between 200,000 and 300,000 gallons per day
- Total amount of water consumed in a week average 1.659 gallons per week
- There are currently 109 meters that are leaking.

80% of the residents with a water leak do not have "Eye on Water". 20% of the residents with leaks have the "Eye on Water" software program.

There are only 320 User accounts. That is up from last

year 261 number. The average leak duration: 15 weeks.

To make things easy to sign up for "Eye on Water" use the QR CODE which will take you directly to where you can sign up for EyeOnWater.



SCAN ME

If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the "Eye on Water".

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

USING YOUR METER AS A LEAK DETECTION TOOL

Undetected water leaks can account for 5-15% of total water us for single-family homes and even more for businesses. An undetected leak can waste nearly 500 gallons per month. Finding that leak can be a challenge but well worth stopping the drain on your wallet.

- 1) Turn off all faucets inside and outside your house.
- 2) Locate your water meter and check the leak indicator to see if it is moving. The leak indicator could be a small triangular [1] shaped dial that rotates when water is flowing through the meter. If the dial is moving, chances are, you have a leak.
- 3) You can also take a meter reading and wait one hour and take another meter reading (make sure NO water is used during this time). If the reading has changed, you have a leak. If you detect a leak, the next step is to determine if the leak is inside or outside your house
- 4) Locate your home's main shut-off valve and shut off the water at the valve.
- 5) Again, check the leak indicator for movement OR use the meter reading method, making sure not to use any water during this period. If the leak indicator stops moving, then you have a leak inside the house. If the leak indicator continues to move or there is a change in the meter readings, then the leak is outside between the meter and the house.

If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall, for assistance in turning off the water supply to the house at the curb stop in the meter box.

Tello Neighbors!

Spring is just around the corner, which means all our backyard critters will be having babies soon. Here are some tips to follow if any of any of those cuties fall from their nests.



- First make sure they are truly orphaned or injured.
- · Proceed on looking for a rehabber.
- In them mean time, Do Not give them any water or food.
- Keep them warm in a box with a Non-Shutoff heating pad, set to Low.
- Keep them in dark and quiet room away from other pets and children.
- If you found a baby squirrel or a nesting bird, call the rehabber for instructions.
- Remember that fledgling birds that are learning to fly do not need to be rescued unless they are injured or in danger.
- Mother opossums will not return for a lost baby. Call a rehabber if the baby is smaller than a coke can, excluding their tail.

Remember, it's always best to call a wildlife rescuer ASAP, as they are experts on caring for orphaned or injured wildlife babies. They can do a much better job than we could. Here are some resources you can contact.
