

# MINUTES OF THE MEADOWS PLACE CHARTER COMMISSION MEETING HELD ON APRIL 14, 2021 AT 6:30 P.M., VIRTUALLY VIA ZOOM.

### 1. Call to Order and Announce a Quorum is Present:

The meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. with the following Commissioners present:

among legal counsel and the commission regarding abstention. The Commission discussed options to allow Council to abstain if they felt they had a conflict that was not covered by law. Commissioner Bezner made a motion that any Council Member wishing to abstain when not required by state law said Council Member may request permission from City Council to allow for the abstention and must have unanimous approval by City Council in order to not count as a negative vote. Commissioner Skemp seconded the motion. The vote follows:
