IRS Scams



The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim,

please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or IRS (800-366-4484) to report suspicious activity.

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information.

Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.
- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.
- Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.


The IRS will not:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying. *If you don't owe taxes or* have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

Code Enforcement

Spring is upon us and we can and should take this time to make sure to take a good look at our homes and property in general for a much needed repair, improvement and/or just cleaning. As we conduct inspections throughout the City, we can't help but notice a lot of homes that needs to repair or especially clean their exteriors due to mildew, dirt or deteriorating materials over time.

We have been sending out notice of violation letters to homeowners that needs to either clean and/or repair the exterior of their homes and we will continue to do so in the coming weeks. We understand that these tasks can be a big burden to some of our residents, especially those who are elderly and/or in financial constraints. So we are doing our best to work with every single resident in a timeline that will both work for the homeowners and the City, bringing the property up to compliance with our Codes of Ordinances but you need to let us know if you need extra time. Or else we may file charges on the property owner in municipal court for non-compliance if we conduct a follow-up inspection and the violation is still not abated and there is no communication with the property owner.

Keep in mind:

- You need to submit a permit application with the City BEFORE you start replacing your roof.
- You may also need a permit **BEFORE** replacing/ repairing your fence, depending on the scope of work.
- Failure to submit proper permits before working may result in citation and/or charges filed against you in Municipal Court. When in doubt or unsure if you need a permit or not, please call Permits Department at (281) 983-2932 for assistance.

Spring also means that our grass and plants' growth are in full swing and that as a good neighbor and resident of the City, we must all make sure that we do our part to maintain our yards and property, by cutting and trimming grass/weeds, shrubs, trees and plants to be in compliance with the code.

• Please remember to keep trees cut and trimmed. §130.07(B) - It is unlawful for anyone to maintain trees, shrubs or other vegetative material upon a public street and/or public right-of-way less than the minimum clearance measured from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk and over the public street/pavement (Sidewalk: not less than 10 feet and Public Street: not less than 16 feet).

- §91.039 Limitation on height of grass and weeds. It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lots or lots in the city to allow weeds and/or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of more than nine (9) inches.
- Put our trash out only on trash days or not more than 18 hours before a scheduled trash pickup. This includes lawn clippings, so be sure to tell your Lawn Contractor!
