Communications

One City function that I am very proud of is in the area of city/resident communications. There have been many improvements and changes that have occurred in the last 22 years, all with the idea of making information available to you. In the old days, one had to come to City Hall and talk to Patty or Elaine, drop a note thru the door slot, write a letter, or call. When I started on Council our Newsletter had gone through some changes with Mayor McGrath writing the Mayors Message every month and a Council Member was supposed to do an article. I came on Council and thanks to a resident suggestion, started Did You Know. We did the best we could and took advantage of technology changes as they became available. Fast forward a few years, and our EDC funded a part time advertising agency, Erickson Advertising, who helped us grow and direct our communications efforts. Several years later, with the explosion of Social Media, we looked for ways to improve and use that technology. Council wanted a full time communications program,

Robo Calls



How can I know if a robocall is a scam? If someone is already breaking the law by robocalling you without permission, there's a good chance it's a scam. At the very least, it's a company you don't want to do business

with. Don't rely on your caller ID. Scammers can fake/Spoof the name and number that shows up, (or the number they may give you to call) making it look like a call is from a government agency such as the Social Security Administration or a local number. Watchout for common phone scams like government imposter or major business such as Amazon scams. If someone calls you out of the blue and asks you to hand over personal information or wire money or pay with a gift card, it's a scam.

You shouldn't be getting all those calls

If a company is selling something, it needs your written permission to call you with a robocall. And if you're on the National Do Not Call Registry, you shouldn't get live sales calls from companies you haven't done business with before. Those calls are illegal. If someone is already breaking the law calling you, there's a good chance it's a scam. At the very least, it's a company you don't want to do business with.

How to Stop Calls from Scammers:

- Hang up
- Consider call blocking or call labeling
- Don't trust your caller ID

April Showers Bring May Flowers

((It is time to find out if your landscaping/trees survived the drought of 2023 and freezes of 2024.)



"Magnolias were hit hard by the drought and Pine trees were being affected by the pine engraver beetle. If there are no brown sprouts on a Magnolia tree, it is gone. If a pine tree has brown needles, that tree is gone and needs to be removed because it will now become a falling hazard," per Boone Holladay with Fort Bend County Texas A&M AgriLife Extension. With that being said, cut down the dead trees and ensure that the stumps are cut or ground down to the level of the ground to follow codes 91.035 and 91.050.

91.035 - Nuisance Declared (dead landscaping/trees) Whenever weeds, brush, rubbish and all other objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter of whatever nature shall exist, covering or partially covering the surface of any lots or parcels of any real estate situated within the city, or when any of the lots or parcels of real estate as aforesaid, shall have the surface thereof filled or partly filled with holes or be in such condition that the same holds or is liable to hold stagnant water therein, or if from any other cause shall be in such condition as to cause disease, or produce, harbor or spread disease germs of any nature or tend to render the surrounding atmosphere unhealthy, unwholesome or obnoxious, or shall contain unwholesome matter of any kind or description, the same is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance, the prompt abatement of which is hereby declared to be a public necessity. Any such nuisance shall be removed from the property by the owner or other person in possession or control of the property.

91.050 – **Removal of Tree Stumps** (A) All premises and exterior of a property shall be maintained free from tree stumps of any height. Upon the removal of the tree, all tree stumps shall be ground or cut to ground level. (B) Upon failure of the owner or agent having charge of the property to cut, destroy or grind the tree stump after service of notice

of a violation, he or she shall be subject to prosecution in accordance with the city code and prescribed by the authority having jurisdiction. Upon failure to comply with the notice of violation, any duly authorized employee of the jurisdiction or contractor hired by the jurisdiction shall be authorized to enter upon the property in violation and cut and grind the tree stump down, and the cost of the removal shall be paid by the owner or agent responsible for the property.

If you are having trouble meeting the comply-by date for a violation let me know at least <u>3 business days before that</u> date listed. I am here to help you.

How to Clean Dishes to Protect Your Pipes:

- Remove oil and grease from all dishes and pans before washing. Once grease or cooking oil has cooled, pour into covered collection containers. Wipe out the remainder using a paper towel. Never pour oil or grease down the drain.
- The garbage disposal does not destroy grease, it only makes it smaller. If you have accumulated grease in your pipes, putting food scraps down the drain can clog your pipes faster. Scrape food scraps from dishes into a trash can to avoid using your garbage disposal.
- Cover kitchen sink drains with catch baskets (strainers) and empty into the trash can as needed.
- Avoid using the garbage disposal and hot water. If grease does go down the drain, follow it with cold water.



If you are experiencing sewer issues please call USW at 832-980-0809, and a service tech will come out to determine if it's a private issue or a city issue.

Fats, Oil and Grease

The fats, oil and grease (FOG) found in food such as meat, cooking oil, shortening, sauces and dairy products are major concerns for our sewer system. When you put cooking leftovers like grease, oil and food scraps down the drain, it sticks to the sides of your pipes. This clogs your pipes and causes back-ups resulting in an

expensive visit from the plumber. Please take precautions to keep your pipes grease free.
