Meadows Place City Council approved the purchase of the property next to the pool and Community Center. This is great for the city. This was planned for, but not for this year. The "long term" plan was to obtain this property by the year 2025 so if Meadows Place wants


to create an Aquatic Center, we would have the room. With this acquisition, we will have met that goal but it has already created new opportunities. Once the transaction is complete, groups like Baseball, Swim Team, Garden Club and more will have a place to meet and not shut down, or have to fight over, the Community Center. What a blessing that will be. Our Community Center has been in such demand that we simply didn't have a place for many groups to gather and we were not able to meet your requests for seasonal or short term programs. Other "short term" plans include using it as a multi-function meeting place for Parks programs such as Summer Day Camps. This was sudden but, when the opportunity arose, the City did it's due diligence through inspections, etc. and after hours of deliberation and evaluation it was decided it was best to take action now and let the city begin benefitting immediately. Fortunately, we were able to move half the cost of the property from another capital project and half from reserves. Our strong financial position played a big role in being able to obtain this property now. Strategic moves like this ensure Meadows Place can always be -Your Place for Life!

But are you a safe walker?

The Meadows Place Police Department offers the following suggestions:

- 1. Use the sidewalk (when possible). If the street isn't designed for pedestrians, don't walk on it. Never walk on highways or in restricted zones
- 2. You know those "walk" and "do not walk" signs? Listen to them. Don't jaywalk.
- 3. Don't make assumptions. Don't assume that a vehicle will stop for you just because you are waiting to cross. Try to make eye contact with the driver before initiating crossing. If you're in a busy city, don't cross without looking both ways—even when you have the pedestrian "walk" symbol—as drivers do occasionally run red lights.
- 4. Do not walk long distances under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Just as you should never drive under the influence, do not walk long distances or in traffic-heavy areas when you are under the influence. Call a taxi or use public transportation.
- 5. Be courteous. When a driver stops to allow you to cross, give him or her a quick wave to demonstrate your appreciation.
- 6. You wouldn't drive distracted, so don't walk distracted. Stay aware of your surroundings by not texting, using headphones, or talking on your cell phone.

When you're in the driver's seat, avoid an accident by abiding by these five tips:

- 1. Always be on the lookout. Pedestrians can—and will—be found anywhere, even places where you are not expecting it (like highways or busy, multiple-lane intersections). Therefore it's crucial that you frequently scan the road ahead of you, including shoulders and sidewalks, so that you spot pedestrians before you approach them.
- 2. Stay alert and avoid distracted driving. Assuming that they have the right-of-way, many pedestrians walk into the street without confirming that oncoming traffic is aware of their presence. Furthermore, pedestrians—especially children—are often hidden in between parked cars or behind other objects. To avoid an accident, stay alert by avoiding distractions. Do not eat or drink, fiddle with the radio or navigation units, or use a cell phone while driving.
- 3. Show caution. There are likely areas in your community where you can anticipate pedestrians. In crosswalks and intersections, drive slowly and stop for pedestrians looking to cross—even if they are not at a marked crosswalk. When stopping at an unmarked point, stop far enough in advance so that the drivers behind you can also prepare to stop. Furthermore, when approaching a red light, be sure to stop far enough behind the line for pedestrians to cross safely.
- 4. Be respectful. Don't show hostility or aggression to drivers who are yielding to pedestrians. Never honk or get frustrated when the driver in front of you has stopped, and don't attempt to pass the stopped vehicle in front of you.
- 5. Watch for children. Because of their small size, children can be difficult to spot. Drive slowly and be on the lookout in school zones and residential neighborhoods.

You may still leave your contact information if you wish, but it is no longer mandatory. Please

be sure to include the address of the violation as well as the date and time that you observed it. Also, look at the drop-down menu for violations as there are some new selections, as well as a space for comments that allow you to address issues that may not be listed.

Make the report WHEN YOU SEE it. If there is something that is wrong or bothering you, don't rely on someone else reporting it. They may not care as much as you and I!

Secondly:

I wish to remind you that I Am Your Neighbor. I care about what happens here. I have lived in the City for 14 years now. Raised teenagers and still have a son in Meadows Elementary. In addition to being the Code Enforcement Official, I am a Lieutenant in Stafford Fire Department, this means that if you call for help, I am one of the first responders that will be there in your time of need. I enjoy being able to drive and walk our city streets and see friends and neighbors working to keep our City in great shape. But I do also have a job to do by reminding some that they have a responsibility in doing their part. I try to give warnings when possible, however it is not required. I would much rather knock on your door, and with a few kind words, see that violations are taken care of promptly. I don't like being the bad guy, but I have a responsibility to All of You to get compliance and, in the words of a neighbor, "Keep Our City from Looking Like Trash!"

How can you help?

Make sure that you talk to your neighbors. If you see something wrong or that they are having an issue, be a good neighbor and TALK to them. Maybe they didn't realize it was an issue for them to park so close, or leave something out or not put their cans away. Maybe they are out of town and it takes you an extra 2 minutes to put their trash cans in their back yard. Wouldn't you appreciate it if your neighbor did something like that for you? Or would you rather they just report that you left something undone and let you get a warning or worse yet, a municipal citation?

Infrastructure Update

The City of Meadows Place Public Works Department takes an active role in addressing capital improvement projects throughout the city. With the support of City Council, the department is able to address pothole repairs, water ponding issues, sidewalks,

and storm sewer drainage inlet repairs. Here is a review of what our department has been able to accomplish this year.

Water Ponding – the city repaired 29 water ponding sites with a total cost of \$31,941.48 Our department already has a list 44 sites to repair for next year. Hopefully, we will be able to get to all of them.

Sidewalks - the city repaired 3 trip hazards on sidewalks, replaced and installed 9 handicap ramps, repaired 11 curbs, and 10 storm sewer inlet repairs. Total cost for these repairs were \$54,425.00

Roadway Repairs - the Dorrance Ln. asphalt overlay project which was completed by Fort Bend County at a cost of \$34,666.02

We are very happy with the results of our improvements and by the work accomplished by our



contractors. A very big thank you to the Fort Bend County Road crew for the great work they did on Dorrance Ln. Our department will continue to locate and address water ponding issues and sidewalks, and handicap ramps, within our capital improvement projects. Our next round of projects should start in late October or early November of 2017.






