Did You Know... we are still fighting to protect our children from Sex Offenders but have a case stalled in the 14th Court of Appeals. We have been waiting for them to rule so last week I requested our legal team file a brief to force the issue. I gave them the go ahead after reading an update that says we could be arguing the case should be dismissed because it is moot due to recent Texas law allowing General Law Texas cities like Meadows Place to enact sex offender ordinances (which we have). On April 6, the Texas Supreme Court dismissed an appeal filed by Texas Voices and hopefully our brief will help the 14th Court of Appeals to do the same for us.

Code Red

The Code Red Emergency and Alerting System has gone through some changes recently. I got some great feedback after a Council meeting and learned we need to make sure everyone:

- 1. Knows about our Code Red notification system
- 2. Knows there are both General and Emergency notifications and each have a different number so you can identify the type of call coming in and
- 3. Know that you have the ability to 'manage' your account, and how. We are working on a Code Red information rollout which should be ready by the end of the month. We will let you know when we make it available. Thank You.

Thanks to the hard work and planning of Danny Segundo, our Public Works Director, Meadows Place smashed the record for internal street and sidewalk repair for one fiscal year. We have had over 50 projects completed at a (budgeted) cost of \$260,000.00. Danny told Council he is already working on, and prioritizing, locations for the next fiscal year. CodeRed allows a user to sign-up for important notifications about the City of Meadows Place. This includes notifications about emergency services and evacuations prior to and during pending emergency events. Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes outside your home

- Install or repair and use window and door screens. Do not leave doors propped open.
- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near water.
 - ► Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
 - ► For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
 - ▶ Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.
- Use an outdoor flying insect spray where mosquitoes rest. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid areas like under patio furniture, or under the carport or garage. When using insecticides, always follow label instructions.



Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes inside your home

- Keep windows and doors shut and use air conditioning when possible.
- Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs inside your home. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- Kill mosquitoes inside your home. Use an indoor flying insect fogger* or indoor insect spray* to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow label directions. Only using insecticide will not keep your home free of mosquitoes.
 - ► Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid places like under the sink, in closets, under furniture, or in the laundry room.

Swim diaper required for non-potty trained students Sea Lion (Basic technique)- Sea Lion class will work on rhythmic breathing and retrieve submerged objects. They will learn basic arm motions and kicking.

Otter (Skill development)- Otter class will introduce the student to the deep water along with diving, strokes, and treading water.


