However, it does violate the 2012 International Property Maintenance Code which the city has adopted. § 150.02 (G) 2012 International Property Maintenance Code Adopted.

Subsection 303.1 Swimming pools, spas, and hot tubs. Swimming pools, spas, and hot tubs shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, and in good repair.

Code Enforcement is responding to complaints on unkempt pools. If you have any questions, contact Karl Velasco at City of Meadows Place.

#### Acreage under the Powerline

The City of Meadows Place has great plans for the acreage under the power lines. It will affect the mowing. We have been working hard with Monarch Gateway, Texas Parks and Wildlife, Forever Quail, CenterPoint and others to turn that area under the powerlines into a useful bird and butterfly friendly habitat. This is a big deal and means the only areas we will be mowing is a 6' path along the fence line from Dorrance to Montecito and the pathway over near the trail by the drainage bayou.

They - Monarch Gateway - will be spraying, weather permitting, in May to kill all the invasive grasses like the Johnson grass and then some 10 days later be seeding native prairie grasses and several types of pollinators (flowers). Not only it will look great, it is going to be a great asset in establishing a food source and safe harbor for the Monarchs migrating to and from Mexico. We are all very proud that Meadows Place is taking such a prominent role in this project and is being used as an example throughout much of the State. Thanks to Colene Cabezas, our Parks Department and to all involved. Raising the standards and taking on projects like this propel and protect our property values and make Meadows Place... *Your* Place for *Life*.

### Don't be a Victim - Do your homework

Every digging project, no matter how large or small, warrants a free call to 811. Installing a mailbox or fence, building a deck or landscaping are all examples of digging projects that should only begin a few days after making a call to 811. Calling this number connects you to your local one-call utility notification center. A representative from the center will come out and mark the approximate location of utility lines with flags or paint.

Digging without knowing the approximate location of underground utilities can result in damage to gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines, which can lead to service disruptions, serious injuries and costly repairs.

Take the proper precaution while preparing to dig at your residence and place a free call to 811, this will put you on the right path to a successful project.





### **Code Enforcement**

Did you know that animal defecation in public properties and private properties other than your own is a violation of a City Code of Ordinance - \$90.03(A)-(B) and punishable by citation from MPPD or charges filed against you in municipal court? We have received multiple complaints from property owners regarding animal feces in their front yards and properties. Please pick up after your beloved pet(s) do their business in someone else's property or in public properties such as our trails and parks. It is your responsibility as the owner.

If you have received a "Notice of Violation" letter in the mail from Code Enforcement for violation(s) observed at your property, please do not ignore the letter(s). If for any reason you do not think the time that was given to you to come into compliance will be met, you need to contact Code Enforcement and let us know the reason why and if you need an extension. If you ignore it and upon our re-inspection we determine that the violation is still not abated and there is no communication with the property owner, charges will be filed against you (the property owner) in municipal court. We understand that some of these tasks can be a big burden to some of our residents, especially those who are elderly and/or in financial constraints. So we are doing our best to work with every single resident in a timeline that will both work for the homeowners and the City, bringing the properties up to compliance with our Codes of Ordinances but vou need to let us know.

#### Keep in mind:

- You need to submit a permit application with the City *BEFORE* you start replacing your roof.
- You may also need a permit *BEFORE* replacing/repairing your fence, depending on the scope of work.
- Failure to submit proper permits before working *may result in citation and/or charges filed against you in Municipal Court.* When in doubt or unsure if you need a permit or not, please call Permits Department at (281) 983-2932 for assistance.

Spring means that our grass and plants' growth are in full swing and that as a good neighbor and resident of the City, we must all make sure that we do our part to maintain our yards and property, by cutting and trimming grass/weeds, shrubs, trees and plants to be in compliance with the code.

- Please remember to keep trees cut and trimmed. §130.07(B)
  It is unlawful for anyone to maintain trees, shrubs or other vegetative material upon a public street and/or public right-of-way less than the minimum clearance measured from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk and over the public street/pavement (Sidewalk: not less than 10 feet and Public Street: not less than 16 feet).
- *§91.039 Limitation on height of grass and weeds.* It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lots or lots in the city to allow weeds and/or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of *more than nine (9) inches*.
- Put our trash out only on trash days or *not more than 18 hours before* a scheduled trash pickup. This includes lawn clippings, so be sure to tell your Lawn Contractor! *§130.09(A)*.
