Did You Know... the City requires any house with a pool to have a fence and the pool to be clean. Mosquito season is here and a stagnant pool produces huge numbers of mosquitos, some of which can carry Zika or West Nile Virus. If you cannot manage your pool, please have it removed or filled in. No one should have to live next to a massive mosquito breeding pool. Please call Code Enforcement if you have any questions on stagnant pool enforcement.

Did You Know... New P.O.D. Ordinance

City Council unanimously passed a new ordinance that regulates the length of time a portable storage unit can be on a property. If a unit is to remain on the property for longer than 3 days, a permit from the City is required. The longest one of these units can stay on a property is 90 days. They can be no larger than 160 sq.ft. (16x10) and must be placed on an improved surface – like a driveway.

If you're going to be using one of these units in the future and plan on keeping it for more than 3 days, please visit Meadows Place City Hall for a permit. This Ordinance is designed to help maintain a healthy and attractive community.

Parks Bond Project Moving Forward

Rick Staigle, Public Works Director Rod Hainey, Nick Haby, our City Administrator and I met with the City of Stafford City Planner and the engineering firm who will be designing both the Meadows Place and Stafford segments of the very exciting Parks Bond Project. Because it is part of the County bond project, Fort Bend County will pay 80% of

it. EDC will be paying a portion for Meadows Place, making a significant impact as well.

Construction Projects Picking Up

After much review, evaluation and prioritization, Public Works Director Rod Hainey reported to Council that he has released the remaining road and sidewalk repair projects. By the time this hits print we will see concrete work going on in various places in the city. As Rod explained the selection process he also showed that he already has "a list" of potential sidewalk and street repairs documented into the 2021-2022 budget year. This type of planning and preparation is how we manage to get the most out of our somewhat limited budget. Here is an IMPORTANT REMINDER about Dead Landscaping / Tree(s) 91.035

On April 15, 2021 Notices and/or Door hangers had begun being re-issued. Compliance has been extended from a 7-day to a 30-day time frame. If you receive a Notice in the mail or a yellow Door Hanger you will have 30 days from the date issued to come into compliance. If you know you are unable to be compliant by that date, please give me a call or email at least 4 days prior to your Comply-By date and request a reasonable extension. Any outstanding violations after the 30 days will be issued a citation and no 2nd Notice of Violation will be sent.

Spring is upon us, and this new season is a good reminder that it's important to keep up with lawn maintenance in Meadows Place. Chapter 91 of the City's Code of Ordinances prohibits grass and weeds from being higher than 9 inches. Should a yard have growth higher than 9 inches, Code Enforcement will make contact with the property owner with a Notice to maintain the yard to be in compliance.

There are some rare instances when properties are not maintained even after ample notice is provided to the property owner to do so. In these circumstances, the City will make the decision to mow the property and file a mowing lien with Fort Bend County, especially given the health and safety hazard that an unkept lawn can produce for our community.

Residents rely on each other to maintain the value and character of our neighborhood, and a large component of this is making sure that lawns and landscaping are kept looking sharp and maintained. Taking a healthy pride of ownership in lawn maintenance goes a long way in maintaining our community's health and quality of life!

Water Shut-off Valves

During the most recent freeze residents became very familiar with the main water isolation valve for their residence. Unfortunately, sometimes too late to prevent water damage inside the home.

In general, there are two isolation valves for each home, one that belongs to the city and the second belongs to the homeowner. All homes will have the city cut of valve which is called the "Curb Stop." And this can be found inside the meter box close to the street. This is a brass valve which when operated will only move a ¼ turn. USW and city staff have the correct tool to operate this valve. Proper operation of this valve should **ONLY** be done by staff and not the homeowner. The second valve can be found on the main service line just before the water line enters the exterior wall of the home. Plumbing Code requires that this valve be installed when the home was built but over the years when these valves break, they have not been properly re-installed and in some cases removed. This leaves the homeowner with only the city valve to isolate the water service.

The original homeowner valve was a gate-valve with an

operating wheel to open and close the service line. These old valves fail and can break in a partial open or closed position. If you have a gate valve it would be recommended that the valve, be replace with a new ½ turn shut off valve. The convenient location is on the side of the house where the service line enters the home, but an alternative location will be directly adjacent to the meter on the homeowner's side of box. Either location will be acceptable to the city. The second location isolates the line from the meter box to the house. Please see the "How to" video on the city Web Site.

It would be highly recommended that the exterior supply line which goes into the house be well insulated and the valve left exposed for emergency and or maintenance operation. In the winter during freeze conditions these valves should be covered for protection. In addition, all exterior spigots should be also covered during the winter freeze conditions.


Please do not hesitate to call City Hall for assistance with the operation of the city "Curb Stop," when repairs on the service line are required or scheduled.




