A New Business Coming to Town

In addition to all the residential renovations and modifications, The City of Meadows Place is seeing quite a bit of business activity taking place. Cabo Bob's conversion from JCI has started, the two dentist offices - one adult and one pediatric - are moving toward completion, permits have been

issued for the O'Reilly Auto Parts next to CVS and Virtue Tattoo is expanding.

We may also have a new Jiffy Lube coming to town. Prior to the last Council Meeting there was a Joint Public Hearing where Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) heard opinions and comments from the public. Then, as the Council Meeting began, P&Z retired to discuss the request for a Special Use Permit and to make a recommendation to Council. A split 3-2 vote in favor of the request was the official Planning and Zoning recommendation to Council. Council, with a 3 yes and 1 no vote granted Jiffy Lube its permit. Thanks to Planning& Zoning Commissioners Meredith Smith, Anne Green, Sammy Skemp, Mike Elmore and Chairman Sean Ulrey for all their thoughtful discussion and community concern. It is important that we have Board and Commission members, and alternates, so if you are interested please contact the Mayor, a Council Member or City Administrator Nick Haby.



This means we will be part of a coalition that will be negotiating with CenterPoint rather than doing it all on our own. As Alderman Rick Staigle said "it is better for us to let Houston and the other big users do the heavy lifting for us rather than take it on ourselves." Council agreed unanimously.

What is Water Age?

Water age is a general indicator of water quality, with lower water age indicating better water quality. If treated water stays in a system a long time before it reaches consumers, disinfectant concentration may not be strong enough

to control microorganisms that can cause health problems. Understanding and limiting water age in a distribution system are important tasks for all water utilities.

First question for Meadows Place residents is: should we be concerned about water age within the city. **NO**. Since our system is by comparison small, the length of time between production at the well, storage the ground storage tanks, and pumping into the system is relatively short. From there the water travels within the distribution system to each individual home. Then only the individual consumption volume, changes the water age. If you are away on vacation for an extended period, the first draw at the tap might seem a little stale. To correct this issue just run the tap for a few minutes until fresh water is drawn into the house from the distribution system.

Water often becomes stagnant or degrades in dead-end mains, which are often found in cul-de-sacs. Many water systems find it necessary to set up special programs to flush these dead-end mains periodically to maintain acceptable water quality. Our operator USW flushes lines to ensure the residents have no issues.

How does the city monitor the water age? As indicated disinfectant residual concentrations will decline if the water stays in the pipes too long. But as part of our regular testing, we sample for disinfectant residual, daily at the water plants and Monthly at eleven different sample locations throughout the city. The State has a minimum residual, and we comply with this requirement. Meadows Place water is safe.

Is Water Age regulated, **NO**. Public Utilities that transport water through miles of transmission pipelines, monitor the disinfectant residual and will boost, as necessary.

There are certain beverages, such as milk, that we rely on when we buy them, and that is the shelf life or use-by date. Bottled water has no use-by date, and a variety of other beverages have a use-by date. Meadow Place water is monitored for quality daily and our source is the Aquifer underground.

Only Rain Down the Drain



Important:

When maintaining your yard, make sure to pick up dead leaves not only from your yard but also from the street gutters. Accumulated leaves left in these areas may clog the storm drains during storms/flash floods and not allow water to drain properly. Accumulations are Prohibited by Ordinance 91.020.

The most complaints:

Last month, I received the most complaints on High Grass/Weeds.

Your help is needed:

Help by having your lawn regularly maintained to stay below 9" in height and remember to have all dead leaves bagged up as well. Thank you for continuing to help keep The Meadows Place *Your Place for Life*.



Listen to the sounds of Radio Frequency playing high energy tunes to set the mood.






