City Election 2023

By the time you get this, the election will be over. For all who voted, you know the only thing on the ballot was the School Bonds and the selection of School Board members, very important stuff. Yes, Elections ARE important and all play a role in the future of the item, bond or position being voted on.

This is why at the last Council meeting your City Council spent time deliberating about the future of elections in Meadows Place. You see, the Home Rule Charter Commission spent untold hours deliberating and debating about the election of your Mayor and Council. They unanimously recommended a change, a change which has been sort of percolating on the back burner as a good idea that may need to be brought up again. Council has decided to bring that idea up and will be having a workshop with elections and election cycles as one of the topics. Don't worry though, any change that is considered will have to be brought up to the public and voted on. This is important so we will keep you posted.

Rental Homes and Short Term Rentals

As you know, Meadows Place has several rental units located here. We also have three Short Term Rentals (STR) in our city now. Even though they are operated professionally we are finding they can be subject to loud renters, create parking problems and cause unrest, yet many of you, like Council have used them. Not all rentals are bad. That said, If you have a noise problem, a parking problem or just a concern, please call PD ASAP-281-983-2900. This goes for regular rental houses too. Council is concerned, this is why we had an agenda item concerning rentals. Council had a very energetic discussion regarding this topic. The Police Chief and our City Administrator were there answering questions when appropriate, as was our City Secretary. It quickly became apparent that more time, and legal counsel, was needed so the group will be meeting again.

Please know that all rental houses are supposed to pull an annual permit and there are inspections attached to those permits. Also know that we have ordinances in place which deal exclusively with rental houses. They are, after all, a business in the middle of our city and are to be dealt with a little differently than you or your (non-renting) neighbors. Again, please call the City, or PD with any concerns.

Solicitors and Peddlers City Ordinance

The Meadows Place Police Department receives many calls about person(s) going door to door for various reasons (soliciting/ peddling). The City of Meadows Place has an ordinance regulating this type of activity.

The following is a brief summary of the ordinance. Permits are issued by the City of Meadows Place permits division at City Hall. Permits are issued on a case-by-case basis, not to exceed a three-month period. Questions about permits should be directed to the Permits Division at city hall at 281-983-2932. For concerns about a solicitor/peddler, contact the police department at 281-983-2900.

Soliciting/peddling in the city limits of Meadows Place is allowed under certain circumstances. A permit issued by the City of Meadows Place is required in most cases; noncommercial is an exception to the rule. Each solicitor/ peddler is to have in their possession and ready to display when requested a City of Meadows Place issued permit to solicit/peddle. Solicitors/peddlers who have a valid permit are allowed to operate from one-half hour after sunrise to one half-hour before sunset.

Some examples of Solicitors/Peddlers:

- Someone knocking on the door selling for Comcast, AT&T, or other sales.
- Mobile vendors, such as food or ice cream trucks in the neighborhood

In closing, the property owner has the right to specify "No Solicitation" posted on the front of their premises. This makes it a violation for any person to enter the premise who may be soliciting or peddling. Please contact the Meadows Place Police Department if you see someone who appears to be soliciting or other suspicious people in the neighborhood.

What is Water age?

Water age is a general indicator of water quality, with lower water age indicating better water quality. If treated water stays in a system a long time before it reaches consumers, disinfectant concentration may not be strong enough to control microorganisms

that can cause health problems. Understanding and limiting the water age in a distribution system are important tasks for all water utilities.

The first question for Meadows Place residents is: should we be concerned about water age within the city. **NO**. Since our system is by comparison small, the length of time between production at the well, storage the ground storage tanks, and pumping into the system is relatively short. From there the water travels within the distribution system to each individual home. Then only the individual consumption volume changes the water age. If you are away on vacation for an extended period, the first draw at the tap might seem a little stale. To correct this issue just run the tap for a few minutes until fresh water is drawn into the house from the distribution system.

Water often becomes stagnant or degrades in dead-end mains, which are often found in cul-de-sacs. Many water systems find it necessary to set up special programs to flush these dead-end mains periodically to maintain acceptable water quality. Our operator USW flushes lines to ensure the residents have no issues.

How does the city monitor the water age? As indicated disinfectant residual concentrations will decline if the water stays in the pipes too long. But as part of our regular testing, we sample disinfectant residual, daily at the water plants and Monthly at eleven different sample locations throughout the city. The State has a minimum residual, and we comply with this requirement. Meadows Place water is safe.

Is Water Age regulated, **NO**. Public Utilities that transport water through miles of transmission pipelines, monitor the disinfectant residual and will boost, as necessary.

There are certain beverages, such as milk, that we rely on when we buy them, and that is the shelf life or use-by date. Bottled water has no use-by date, and a variety of other beverages have a use-by date. Meadow Place water is monitored for quality daily and our source is the Aquifer underground.

High Grass/Weeds:



April showers bring May flowers and HIGH GRASS/WEEDS. Ordinance 91.039 - Limitation on Height of Grass and Weeds:

Ordinance 91.039 - Limitation on Height of Grass and Weeds:

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot or lots in the city to allow weeds and/ or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of more than nine inches.

Weeds and/or grass of a height exceeding nine inches are declared a nuisance. (B) The requirements of this section apply to any public right-of-way or easement, or portion thereof located on the real property or portion thereof required to be cut, including specifically the areas of any real property that extend to or abut upon any curb or paved portion of a public street, the area between a public sidewalk and a public street or highway, and ditches and drainage channels located thereon.

Important Reminder:

In keeping up with your increased lawn maintenance, make sure that you or your lawn crew places yard waste/trash/ fallenor cut limbs at the curb **no sooner than NOON** the day prior to designated trash days of Tuesday and Friday.(No sooner than Noon on Monday or no sooner than Noon on Thursday.) Any days or times other than the forementioned ones is a violation
