Farewell - and Thank You

Time moves on and things change. Meadows Place will soon have a new Mayor. The last time there was a new Mayor things were a bit different. There was no City Administrator, we had part-time Parks Directors, a part time bookkeeper, no Finance Director, the water bills were sent out on post cards printed on a dot matrix printer and the only form of communication was the monthly Newsletter, which usually didn't get to the

homes until mid-month.

Yes, times have changed. Meadows Place now has a trained full time and professional staff in place. You see improvements everywhere because from top to bottom our staff works hard to improve our City and raise the standards everywhere they can. Be proud of that. I am.

The role of the Mayor has changed and is mostly legislative in nature. The Mayor can influence policy, has impact on the agenda and runs the meetings but now has no direct input on day to day operations. We have good people in place to do that. Thanks to them and a great Council, I believe Meadows Place is well positioned to face the future and in a good position to continue to operate smoothly and efficiently as we move forward. I am glad, because I live here too.

Remember, one change that took place not that long ago saw Meadows Place hire and install a very qualified City Administrator. In addition to working with Staff, our City Administrator serves as the executive arm of our government, working with Mayor & Council, then translating their policies into action to meet the needs of Meadows Place efficiently and effectively. The world we live in is more fast paced and sophisticated than when I took the helm some 17 years ago. It has changed a lot. The City Administrator is also responsible for keeping up with all those changes - meaning a lot less work for the Mayor.

I am also very proud to say that we have a very stable Police Department and that every Police patrol position has been filled. To the best of my knowledge, we are the only City in the County that can say that. Thank You, Chief. Over the years, as Mayor, I have seen changes in another important area of our City, that of City Secretary.

Did You Know... A Few Final Thoughts

As I conclude my tenure as Mayor, I admit I have had some surprises and disappointments. One that I just can't get over is why so few people (379) use the Eye on Water software that alerts us to a leak and easily allows a check of water use from annual to hourly. A quick check can save a lot on the water bill. Everyone should have it. Another thing that I may share some blame on, is that all homeowners should know that we have ordinances and procedures already in place to deal with nuisance neighbors like pool owners who let the pool go bad or have backyard grass as high as an elephant's eye. This is serious business and the City is prepared to deal with it. Call City Hall or Code Enforcement. It is important to get the problem recorded, especially if it is a Short Term Rental.

Fortunately, we have a City Secretary that is well trained in administrative oversight as well as coordinating our elections, which is the assigned role by the Texas legislature. We are stable in this position now, and that is important.

Another area of strength is due to the fact we have one of the best finance directors in Ft. Bend County. Check out her reports and look at the results online. Thanks to the professionalism in the Accounting and Finance areas, our books are always current, Council and Staff know where we stand and questions can be answered immediately with accuracy.

Oh, how times have changed. The last time we got a new Mayor, our baseball league played on fields with no lights, no water, no covered dugouts and most of the parkland was a big open field, often covered by fireants. Now we are blessed to have a Parks Director that is recognized as one of the best in the State and a Public Works Director that has years of experience, works well with both his staff and contractors and makes sure he and his staff are trained to be the best they can be to look after our City. I can testify they all worked well with the outgoing Mayor and Council and I am sure they will work well with the new one.

I want to say Thank You for allowing me to serve your City for

so long. I have really enjoyed my time in office and having the opportunity to meet so many nice people. I have seen some really nice things done for others along the way and have been witness to efforts by individuals with one goal in mind, help others. What a blessing that has been. Leaving Kids Home Alone

Advice for parents on making sure kids are safe while home alone.

Many parents must choose between leaving their children home alone during the day while they are at work or busy with other commitments, or finding

alternative care. Parents often worry when their children are home alone, but there are precautions they can take to ease their worries and help protect their children when they're not around.

What parents can do

- Stay in touch. Call children throughout the day to ask how they are and what they are doing. Ask children to check in before they leave the house and to call again when they return.
- Keep kids connected. Post important numbers by the telephone, including parent's work and cell phone, the doctor's office, and a neighbor or a nearby relative who can help children quickly if they need it.
- Practice what to do in an emergency. Teach children how
 to dial 911 or "0" and when to do it. Ask questions like "If
 someone is trying to get in the house, what should you do?" "If
 you get hurt, what should you do?" and "If you want to play at
 a friend's house, what should you do?"
- Set firm rules. Make clear what children are allowed to do and what they aren't allowed to do. Can they use the Internet when home alone? Can they invite a friend over? Can they invite several friends over?

Make Sure Your Children Are Ready

All children mature differently, so there is no precise age when they are ready to stay home alone. This makes the decision to leave children alone even harder for parents. Many states have laws concerning the legal age when children can be left unsupervised, but there is no guarantee that when children reach this age they will be ready. However, there are questions parents can ask themselves to help determine if their children are ready.

Can your children

- Be trusted to go straight home after school or after playing at a neighbor's house?
- Easily use the telephone, locks, and kitchen appliances
- Follow rules and instructions well?
- Handle unexpected situations without panicking?
- · Stay home alone without being afraid?
- Say their full name, address, and telephone number?

If you feel comfortable leaving your children home alone and feel that they are ready, discuss it with them and start practicing what they should and shouldn't do. Role play different scenarios to prepare them for anything that might happen when they are home alone.

High Grass/Weeds



April showers bring May flowers and HIGH GRASS/WEEDS.

Ordinance 91.039 - Limitation on Height of Grass and Weeds:

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot or lots in the city to allow weeds and/or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of more than nine inches. Weeds and/or grass of a height exceeding nine inches are declared a nuisance.

(B) The requirements of this

section apply to any public right-of-way or easement, or portion thereof located on the real property or portion thereof required to be cut, including specifically the areas of any real property that extend to or abut upon any curb or paved portion of a public street, the area between a public sidewalk and a public street or highway, and ditches and drainage channels located thereon.

Important Reminder:

In keeping up with your increased lawn maintenance, make sure that you or your lawn crew places yard waste/ trash/fallenor cut limbs at the curb *no sooner than NOON* the day prior to designated trash days of Tuesday and Friday. (No sooner than Noon on Monday or no sooner than Noon on Thursday.) Any days or times other than the forementioned ones is a violation.

If you are having trouble meeting the comply-by date for a violation let me know at least 3 business days before that date listed. I am here to help you. If you have questions about a Notice of Violation, please email or call me as soon as possible.

What is Storm Water Pollution?

What is Storm Water Pollution?

Storm Water runoff is water from rain that does not soak into the ground. It flows from rooftops, over paved areas, bare soil, and sloped lawns. As it flows,

stormwater collects and transports animal waste, trash and litter, pesticides, fertilizers, oil, and grease and other potential pollutants into the storm drains.

Rain washes pollutants from impervious surfaces streets, parking lots, construction sites, shopping centers and residential yards into storm sewers and flows untreated into nearby bayous, creeks, fish and wildlife habitat, downstream recreational areas, and drinking water supplies. Toxic substances from motor vehicles, as well as the careless application of pesticides and fertilizers also threaten water quality and can kill fish and other aquatic life. Bacteria from pet and animal waste get washed into lakes and waterways making them unsafe for water sports like wading, swimming, water skiing and fishing.

A sanitary sewer system and storm and a storm sewer system are not the same. Water that goes down toilets, sinks, showers, or other inside drains flows to the wastewater treatment plant. Storm sewer flows are not treated, so it is important to remember that any type of surface water runoff—not just rainfall—will be collected in the stormwater management system. When you wash your car on the driveway, for example, all that water, road oils, dirt and grime end up in the storm drain.

All the runoff from our streets and yards ends up the Galveston Bay and if that run off is polluted then we are polluting the Bay.

Three Types of Storm Water Pollution

- Litter: cigarette butts, food wrappers, plastic bags etc.
- Natural Pollution: leaves, yard clippings and animal feces.
- *Chemical pollution:* fertilizers, oil, paint, and detergents.

Please be aware of the effects of pollution the water in our State. Also - all drainage from a pool must be directed to the sanitary sewer system thru an approved "P" trap. And may not be drained on the street.
