Code Red

CodeRed is the name of our citywide notification system-not the type of call it generates. CodeRed is a fully redundant platform that delivers thousands of messages at a time and delivers both Emergency and General Information notifications. You may sign up for one or both of types of messages. You can tell which type of notification by the phone number. The Emergency Notification # is 866-419-5000. General Information # is: 855-969-4636.

General Information could be a reminder to go vote, a notice of a public hearing or a meeting. It could be anything. Emergency calls are urgent and should be answered right away. This is a voluntary program but I urge everyone to sign up for both. Find out how on our website.

TNR -Trap Neuter and Return

Last year Fort Bend County began a TNR program for cats. Since the City of Meadows Place uses Fort Bend Animal Control, it means we have joined hundreds of other communities around the nation provide lifesaving Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) programs for community cats. Basically you trap a cat, call the County for pickup and they will neuter the cat, vaccinate it of rabies, clip its ear, called Ear Tipping, and return the cat to the area from which it was picked up.

The primary purpose of this ordinance and this plan is, over time, to improve residential driveways throughout the City of Meadows Place. This will not only improve safety but improve our property values. This important plan continues to be very effective in preventing deterioration of driveways and properties in our city. If you have any questions, Ask a Question on the website, ask Code Enforcement or go to the website and look up Chapter 150: Buildings - Section 302.3 Sidewalks and Driveways. This sets the parameters for enforcement, which generally takes place at time of rental or sale.

The Ear Tipping is done while the cat is under anesthesia and is a sign to other cat trappers/caretakers that a cat has already been spayed or neutered. This is a long range program designed to naturally lessen the population of community cats, which can do a lot of damage and eat a lot of songbirds. The city has two Have-a-Heart traps which we will let residents use free of charge as long as they are returned or you can use one of yours or the County's. Fireworks Prohibited in the City of Meadows Place

In an effort to maintain a desirable and peaceful community, the City of Meadows

place has banned the discharge of fireworks within the city limits. As we approach the Fourth of July the Meadows Place Police Department hopes everyone has a great holiday and to remind all; Fireworks are not allowed in the City f Meadows Place (at any time), violators are subject to be cited and incurring up to a \$500 fine.

City of Meadows Place City Ordinance:

§ 130.35 FIREWORKS.

(A) Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

FIREWORKS. The term shall include *FIREWORKS*, firecrackers, rockets, sparklers, torpedoes, Roman candles, fire balloons and all other substances or any combination whatsoever designed or intended to produce a noise or effects of fireworks or pyrotechnics, whether or not herein specifically designated and defined.

SET OFF. This term shall include setting off, firing, igniting, discharging or in any other manner setting into action, and shall also include the causing of any of such things to happen.

(B) Prohibitions. It shall be unlawful to manufacture, store, sell, possess or set off fireworks within the city

PENALITY. Any person who violates or causes, allows or permits another to violated any provision of § 130.35 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500. Each occurrence of any violation of § 130.35 shall constitute a separate offense. Each day on which any such violation of § 130.35 occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

If you observe a Fireworks violation, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department 281-983-2900. If calling after hours, ask for a Meadows Place Police Department officer.



Did you know?

I enjoy the Mayor's did you know segment of our newsletter. I'm always asked good questions by our residents related to our City. The topics range from which streets are we going to repair next, to how much water to we recycle to our lake every year, or how many gallons does our wastewater treatment plant use in a day. Well, this keeps me on my toes and I would like to share with you some of the questions I receive but... in a "Did you know?" format. So, here we go...

- Did you know that Hurricane Season will be upon us very soon! I encourage everyone to talk to your insurance agent regarding flood insurance. Don't wait!
- Did you know that grease poured down your kitchen sink will harden in your sanitary sewer lines and may cause your sewer to back up? It's happened.
- Did you know that once utility repairs are made (main breaks, sidewalk repairs) to an area, the new grass placed around the repair will be the responsibility of the homeowner to water? It's true.
- Did you know that CenterPoint, Comcast, AT&T, and other utility providers can go on your property and make upgrades without telling the City what they're doing? It's true, however we do require a permit to work in the right of way.
- Did you know the City's Eye on Water Web Site is available for everyone to see their daily water usage? It's true, however you do have to sign up.

- Did you know that our City treats and recycles over 8 million gallons of treatment plant effluent to the lake? Very proud of our facility!
- Did you know that our City offers an additional recycling option on Friday's with Simple Recycling? It's true. Total pounds diverted from Meadows Place waste stream – 6,779 last year.
- Did you know that yard waste can weigh no more than 50 lbs? Branches must be in piles greater than 3' x 3' x 3', tied or bundled and no longer than 4'. Don't get caught braking the rules! Code enforcement may knock on your door...
- Did you know that the County will only spray for mosquitoes for two reasons, a positive mosquito pool for any disease is found, or trapping data shows a large increase in the amount of mosquitoes captured. The County does have a trap in Meadows Place. Take your mosquito repellent with you if you go outside!
- Did you know that the week of May 20th 24th was National Public Works Week? We did!

I also wanted to take this opportunity to say thank you to all the residents that have reached out to our department over the years. In some cases, we may not be able to assist everyone, there are some things we just can't do. However, we really do care about helping our residents as much as possible. Thanks for your support and patience!






Code Enforcement

CATS, CATS AND MORE CATS!

We have been getting more calls regarding feral, or community cats, roaming around the City and congregating in greater numbers. Some of these would just pass by but if they find food and water they will likely stick around.



PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE DO NOT FEED FERAL CATS! Not only are you exposing yourselves to rabies and other diseases that these cats may have, but you are also encouraging these cats to stick around and become a nuisance for your neighbors, or worse, pose a health and safety hazard for them.

If you trap a cat or secure a dog, you can call Fort Bend County Animal Services at (281) 342-1512 and have the animal picked up free of charge or you can call one of the many non-profit animal organizations to see if they can foster them for adoption.

Did you know that animal defecation on properties other than your own is a violation of City Code of Ordinance - \$90.03(A)-(B) and punishable by citation from MPPD or charges filed against you in municipal court?

We have received multiple complaints from property owners regarding animal feces in their front yards and properties. *Please be a good neighbor and pick up after your beloved pet(s). That is just part of your responsibility as a pet owner. Thanks.*

Keep in mind:

• You need to submit a permit application with the City *BEFORE* you start replacing your roof.

- You may also need a permit **BEFORE** replacing/ repairing your fence, depending on the scope of work.
- Failure to submit proper permits before working *may result in citation and/or charges filed against you in Municipal Court.* When in doubt or unsure if you need a permit or not, please call Permits Department at (281) 983-2932 for assistance.
 - Please remember to keep trees cut and trimmed. §130.07(B) - It is unlawful for anyone to maintain trees, shrubs or other vegetative material upon a public street and/or public right-of-way less than the minimum clearance measured from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk and over the public street/pavement (Sidewalk: not less than 10 feet and Public Street: not less than 16 feet).
 - Put our trash out only on trash days or not more than 18 hours before the next scheduled trash pickup. This includes lawn clippings, so be sure to tell your Lawn Contractor! - §130.09(A).





Sea Lion (*Basic technique*)- Sea Lion class will work on rhythmic breathing and retrieve submerged objects. They will learn basic arm motions and kicking.

Otter (*Skill development*)- Otter class will introduce the student to the deep water along with diving, strokes, and treading water.




