Mayor's Time Capsule Letter

Did you know Meadows Place Resident and Boy Scout Adam Kantarjian collected items for a Meadows Place Time Capsule for his Eagle Scout Project? The Time Capsule was buried in front of City Hall on May 15, 2021 to be opened in 31 years. Below is a letter from Mayor Jessup to the Mayor of 2052.

Dear Future Mayor and Meadows Place Residents,

My name is Charles Jessup and it has truly been my honor to serve as Mayor of The City of Meadows Place. – One Square Mile of Wonderful!

While serving as Mayor we have gone through a record drought, a flood of near Biblical proportions an economic upheaval and almost lost our school, yet Meadows Place, through the strength of its residents, City Council and staff have met the issues head-on and come out stronger and better than ever. The new Meadows Elementary is witness to that – well, its new now.

We are currently living in an extremely challenging and extraordinary time as we face the continuing coronavirus pandemic. For over a year our City has been living with fear, uncertainty, and isolation. We have seen hundreds of cases of COVID-19 right here in Meadows Place and the threat of infection lingers still.

Despite these trying times, this pandemic has also demonstrated, once again, Meadows Place's amazing strength. I'm forever thankful for the willingness of our community to support their friends and neighbors as well as our local businesses.

A few years ago, the city celebrated Meadows Place 25th anniversary with a huge community party – one of the things we do well in Meadows Place. As part of our celebration, we looked back into our own history, memories, and creation of Meadows Place. It showed we were a much different Meadows Place than the one we know today. In fact, even our name was different, we were 'The Meadows', a name which is still sometimes used in 2021.

Our city started operating in the original Meadows Mud building and then moved into the back of the Deauville Mall. In early 90's we moved into our new City Hall and Police Station at One Troyan Drive, which is named after our first mayor, Sue Troyan. Our population was 4,990 at that time and we were pretty much built out. An influx of young families puts us over 5,000.

Police Chief Gary Stewart says he is extremely proud that Meadows Place continues to be one of the safest places in Texas to live. The Chief strongly believes there is nothing more important than working together as a community to ensure that we maintain a safe environment in which families can grow, businesses can prosper, and visitors can enjoy. Community policing is truly at work here.

Meadows Place continued to pull itself up by the bootstraps and ran a very lean organization, a trait which currently continues. The city sold some property to CVS which allowed us to build a Fire Station which is now manned 24/7 365. Not bad for a little one square mile city. After modernizing the old MUD building to use as a training center, we were able to show Fort Bend EMS the benefits of staging in Meadows Place so we turned the facility over to EMS and they now house personnel and equipment there. Then, in 2019 we added an Emergency Operations and Training Center. Mayor, I hope that is still the case when you read this letter because Meadows

Place enjoys the fastest Police, Fire and EMS response times in Fort Bend County –plus a Level 1 Fire Rating.

Our residents feel safe here. That's why kids walk and ride their bikes to school and people walk our parks at all times of day.

Our Parks expanded our trail systems and in 2011 we built an award-winning lake that utilizes reclaimed water and serves as a recreational center and water storage for city irrigation. It dramatically changed the ecosystem in the city. This was followed by a new all-inclusive park, a Discovery and Nature Center next to the pool and - we are working with the County to expand our trail system and put a bridge over the bayou for kids to access the Center from the school.

As part of a mobility bond project, in 2019 we tore out a crumbling section of Kirkwood and replaced it with the four roundabouts and the linear park that beautifies the city today. These types of amenities were aimed at attracting young professionals to our city with hopes that property values would increase, and upscale businesses would follow. Businesses like Aldi and Starbucks, which were here in 2021 and I hope they are going strong for you today.

It is the mission of the Public Works Department to provide a secure and reliable infrastructure for all members of the community while continuing to find innovative ways to improve the delivery of services- and our residents trust us to do that.

To ensure our community's values are reflected in future decision making, the City is in the midst of developing a Home Rule Charter which is being created by an outstanding Charter Commission. I hope it goes to election in 2021 and passes. It will protect the city and clarify our path for the future. I hope you are operating under their charter as you read this.


We heard from the community that they want us to preserve existing neighborhoods; focus on making getting around town more manageable; and be intentional in managing growth. We are working hard to accomplish this. Oh, we have a GREAT City Council and a fantastic staff. I wish the same for you, Mayor.

Fireworks Prohibited in the City of Meadows Place

In an effort to maintain a desirable and peaceful community, the City of Meadows place has banned the discharge of fireworks within the city limits. As we approach the Fourth of July the Meadows Place Police Department hopes everyone has a great holiday and to remind all; Fireworks are not allowed in the City of Meadows Place (at any time), violators are subject to be cited and incurring up to a \$500 fine.

City of Meadows Place City Ordinance:

§ 130.35 FIREWORKS.

(A) *Definitions*. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

FIREWORKS. The term shall include **FIREWORKS**, firecrackers, rockets, sparklers, torpedoes, Roman candles, fire balloons and all other substances or any combination

whatsoever designed or intended to produce a noise or effects of fireworks or pyrotechnics, whether or not herein specifically designated and defined.

SET OFF. This term shall include setting off, firing, igniting, discharging or in any other manner setting into action, and shall also include the causing of any of such things to happen.

(B) *Prohibitions*. It shall be unlawful to manufacture, store, sell, possess or set off fireworks within the city.

PENALITY. Any person who violates or causes, allows or permits another to violated any provision of § 130.35 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500. Each occurrence of any violation of § 130.35 shall constitute a separate offense. Each day on which any such violation of § 130.35 occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

If you observe a Fireworks violation, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department at 281-983-2900. If calling after hours, ask for a Meadows Place Police Department officer.

The Meadows Place Police Department is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week (281) 983-2900

I would like to Congratulate Mr. & Mrs. Evenhouse on Kenzie Court for all the transforming work done to their home and property. This upholds Meadows Place as a beautiful place to live and *Your Place for Life*.

Did you Know, that having your address numbers on your home, both sides of your mailbox, or on the curb are of the utmost importance? In the case of an emergency this will help Fire/ EMS / Police Departments locate your home quicker when seconds count. To bring it home, we have an Ordinance that requires each house in the Meadows Place to display address numbers. This law specifies the size and font type for the numbers that are required to be displayed.

Ordinance is IPMC[F]304.3 - Buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches (102 mm) in height with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7 mm). Now you know!

Mowing the Yard and Watering

As the memories of the frozen plants fade away and we now turn our focus to the summer heat and watering the new grass and plants. There are certain things that the homeowner can do save water and conserve the resource.

- 1. Water lawns in the early morning.
- 2. Fix leaky faucets and hoses they waste water and money.
- 3. Plan water cycles according to each type of plant or grass.
- 4. Watering in the heat of the day can waste up to 65% of the water.
- 5. Water the grass not the streets and sidewalk.
- 6. Set timers to complete the cycle before 4.00 am. This timing will avoid the peak demand for other household uses.
- 7. Use a broom to clear away debris, instead of using the hose.

8. Also, the use of the broom will help prevent the stormwater pollution.



Mow only when necessary, set the mower to the highest setting during the warm season. Longer grass keeps the soil cool, minimizing evaporation and conserving water. Leave clippings on the lawn, will supply organic matter and supply one third of your fertilizer needs. Even as the temperatures rise, watering too frequently can be a big mistake. Water no more than 1 inch per week and only when it is needed. Frequent watering of the lawn will encourage shallow root pattern and the lawns will burn if not continually watered. Irrigation is only needed when rain is scarce. If rain is in the forecast, let mother nature do the job.






