Budget Season

It is that time of year again, time to plan and prepare next year's budget. In everything we do, The City of Meadows Place strives to raise our standards and improve our processes. Preparing the budget is no exception. We work hard and pay attention to the smallest of details.

The fiscal, or financial, year for The City of Meadows Place runs from October 1st to September 30th of the following year. As you can imagine, this year we face additional difficulties and fiscal uncertainties as we must take into account state limitations, unfunded mandates, soaring fuel prices, uncertain costs due to inflation, supply chain problems and possible increases in medical coverage.

This year, our City Administrator, Nick Haby and Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston will meet with all City Department Heads to gather information in preparation of this next budget and present a proposed budget to Council for deliberation. Some tough decisions will have to be made by Mayor and Council. The first meeting will be June 6th. There will be additional budget meetings and two (2) Public Hearings. We will post the Public Hearing dates in the Fort Bend Star, the Website, the official Facebook Page and next month's newsletter. You are invited to attend, ask questions and make comments. Hope to see you there.

Dorrance Reconstruction Project slated to begin in June

The Dorrance Lane Reconstruction Project – Phase 1- is set to start in June and last 5 months. It is going to be a mess during construction but once complete, the new infrastructure is designed to provide greatly improved streets, sidewalks and utilities for many years to come. Did You Know... Eye on Water

Unfortunately many of our residents are not utilizing our Eye on Water utility monitoring program. Your meter measures the quantity of water used in your household. Flow is measured electronically and updated regularly for billing and leak detection and then electronically sent to City Hall. EyeOnWater lets you connect to and monitor your utility accounts so you can see how much water you're using, when you are using it and can even alert you to possible leaks on your property. It can display your water usage by year, month, day and hour. If you have a leak you can spot it, or even alert you. It can be VERY handy. To sign up, click EyeOnWater on our website.

Code Red Notification System

CodeRed is the name of our voluntary ultra-high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications. We also occasionally use it for general, non-emergency notification. You may sign up for one or both of types of messages and can tell which type of notification is coming in by the phone number. The Emergency Notification # is 866-419-5000. General Information # is 855-969-4636. General Information could be reminders of an event, a notice of a public hearing or a meeting. Emergency calls are more urgent like drinking water contamination, utility outage, or a missing person. To sign up for this FREE notification service, go to the Meadows Place website and click on Code Red. The city uses it, I hope you will too.

Trash Pickup Contract

Last month your City Council authorized our City Secretary to advertise a Request for Proposals for the City's residential solid waste and recycling collection. This is a multi-year contract and we should receive multiple bids even though right now the garbage industry is in a bit of turmoil. Buyouts, acquisitions, conversion to side loader only companies and skyrocketing fuel and dump costs are definitely going to affect who bids this project. We are large enough to require a full service provider and one that will meet the somewhat special requirements of our city. City Staff and Legal have prepared a very detailed document specifically for Meadows Place. Like we said last month- Sometimes it takes a lot of paperwork to keep Meadows Place... *Your Place for Life*.

Fireworks Prohibited in the City of Meadows Place

In an effort to maintain a desirable and peaceful community, the City of Meadows place has banned the discharge of fireworks within the city limits. As we approach the Fourth of July the Meadows Place Police

Department hopes everyone has a great holiday and to remind all; Fireworks are not allowed in the City of Meadows Place (at any time), violators are subject to be cited and incurring up to a \$500 fine.

City of Meadows Place City Ordinance:

§ 130.35 FIREWORKS.

(A) Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

FIREWORKS. The term shall include FIREWORKS, firecrackers, rockets, sparklers, torpedoes, Roman candles, fire balloons and all other substances or any combination whatsoever designed or intended to produce a noise or effects of fireworks or pyrotechnics, whether or not herein specifically designated and defined.

SET OFF. This term shall include setting off, firing, igniting, discharging or in any other manner setting into action, and shall also include the causing of any of such things to happen.

(B) Prohibitions. It shall be unlawful to manufacture, store, sell, possess or set off fireworks within the city

PENALITY. Any person who violates or causes, allows or permits another to violated any provision of § 130.35 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500. Each occurrence of any violation of § 130.35 shall constitute a separate offense. Each day on which any such violation of § 130.35 occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

If you observe a Fireworks violation, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department 281-983-2900. If calling after hours, ask for a Meadows Place Police Department officer.

The Meadows Place Police Department is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week (281) 983-2900



A Yearly Rental License Is Required



Important: If you are going to rent your house you need a Yearly Rental License. Once you have an occupant/renter agreement and prior to the move in, you must obtain an Occupancy Permit.

The most complaints: I received the most complaints last month on High Grass/Weeds.

Your help is needed: Maintain your lawn below 9" in height and have all dead leaves bagged. Remember this time of year, grass/weeds seem to shoot up overnight. Thank you for continuing to help keep Meadows Place Your Place for Life.

Garage Sale sign help needed: Remember to pick up all your garage sale signs when your garage sale is over.

Mowing the Yard and Watering

Summer is fast approaching, and the warm weather is here to stay for a while. The demand for water within the city has increased accordingly. Increased by 6.092%, up from 2409K gallons per

week to 2565K gallons per week. (This information and data can be monitored on Beacon). There are certain things that the homeowner can do save water and conserve the resource.

- 1. Water lawns in the early morning.
- 2. Fix leaky faucets and hoses they waste water and money.
- 3. Plan water cycles according to each type of plant or grass.
- 4. Watering in the heat of the day can waste up to 65% of the water. Windy days will make this number larger.
- 5. Water the grass not the streets and sidewalk.
- 6. Set timers to complete the cycle before 4.00 am. This timing will avoid the peak demand for other household uses.
- 7. Use a broom to clear away debris, instead of using the hose.
- 8. Also, the use of the broom will help prevent the stormwater pollution.

Mow only when necessary, set the mower to the highest setting during the warm season. Longer grass keeps the soil cool, minimizing evaporation and conserving water. Leave clippings on the lawn, will supply organic matter and supply one third of your fertilizer needs. Even as the temperatures rise, watering too frequently can be a big mistake. Water no more than 1 inch per week and only when it is needed. Frequent watering of the lawn will encourage shallow root pattern and the lawns will burn if not continually watered. Irrigation is only needed when rain is scarce. If rain is in the forecast, let mother nature do the job.

Water is Life.

Every living creature needs it to survive. Water less, save more. Choose to conserve!

Let's talk about giving wildlife a helping hand. The world has lost two-thirds of its wildlife in the past 50 years. Our relationship with wildlife is broken



and it's important to note that we share our yards with some of them. Sure, we can't save the Sea Turtles or the African Elephants but don't forget, Birds, Toads, Lizards, Bees, Butterflies, Opossums and even those, sometimes pesky, Squirrels are all "wildlife" and there are plenty of ways to help these small creatures.

Create a backyard wildlife habitat by adding stations for food, water, cover from the hot summer sun, some nesting material, and most important, places for them to raise their young. All of this can be added into your existing landscapes, front or back.

You don't even have to spend any money to provide nesting material or even shelter. Tiny twigs that fall from the tree are perfect. Don't throw them out, just leave them where they've fallen. Better yet, scoop them up and pile them up behind a tree or bush. You can even add in the last bits of yarn or small bits of dryer lint. Don't forget about that small broken garden pot. Lizards and toads will use them as a shelter and they will eat up some of those mosquitoes.

Once you have created a wildlife-friendly zone, you can then "certify" your yard and become a Certified Wildlife Habitat. Apply to be part of the National Wildlife Federation Certification. You can visit their website for qualifications and application. www.nwf. org/Garden-for-Wildlife/Certify
