The award is named after Norman Hogue, TexITE member and champion of roundabouts. The Texas District (also called TexITE) of the Institute of Transportation Engineers is a professional organization for individuals in the field of transportation that are made up of more than 17,000 professionals and students who are responsible for meeting transportation, mobility and safety needs. Founded in 1930 the ITE wanted to gather input from traffic engineers, transportation planners, roadway designers, consultants, contractors, inventors, researchers, professors, and policy makers who work to maintain and improve surface transportation systems worldwide. These are the types of professionals who reviewed our project and gave us our award.



# Did You Know?...

**Did You Know...** Sugar Grove Church Youth (13) thirteen of them, ages 11-16yr cleaned and painted our 5 Free Little Library Boxes and they look GREAT! These Free Little Libraries see a lot of use so this is a wonderful way to spruce up Meadows Place and set an example for us all. **Did You Know...** there is need for egg cartons at the East Fort Bend Human Needs Ministry and Meadows Place residents are helping to fill this need. The food pantry buy eggs in bulk and need egg cartons so the Food Pantry can hand out 6,9, or 12 eggs depending on the number of folks in the family and the availability of eggs. A couple of months ago Larry Ewing sent them a crate of cartons and people like Elaine Herff, Janet Piwonka, Susan Gallardo, Jane Stilly and others, including my wife Elaine, all contributed.

**Did You Know...** Council Members Tia Baker and Kurt Kopczynski are personally involved in the Meadows Marlins Swim Team, and not as City officials but as parent volunteers. It takes a lot of volunteers to run a swim meet, a lot, and these two have stepped up big time. Tia is in charge of the Meets and Kurt is a stroke judge. Both are tough assignments but I hated being a Stroke Judge and having to DQ (disqualify) a swimmer but that's what Kurt does every meet. Rumor has it he even DQ's his own kid! Thank You to all the parent volunteers who make these meets possible

**Did You Know...** Last month your City Council and legal team conducted a Public Hearing to determine whether a home here in Meadows Place violates City of Meadows Place Code of Ordinances for Continued Use and Occupancy. We had a good turnout and a great discussion. There was also a

discussion on another unoccupied home, one of 10 in the City, to see whether we move to demolish it, buy it, or what. The matter is ongoing but we hope to have a legal decision by mid-July. I am proud to say that we have made great strides in reducing the number of unoccupied and substandard homes here in Meadows Place. We have some of them being sold, repaired or refurbished, greatly reducing the number of problem homes. Strict inspections and Rental Registry have and Rental Units down significantly as well. Meadows Place may well be the city with the lowest rental percentage in Fort Bend County. I am trying to confirm that for you. Thank You Code Enforcement and Council for your decisive action.

**Did You Know...** Code Enforcement has also been active in treating stagnant pools for mosquito larvae. If you have any questions on stagnant pool enforcement or a possibly stagnant pool next door to you, please call Jennifer with Code Enforcement. Thank You.

**Did You Know...** City Council took action on getting the big baseball field repaired and back to being a ball field. The four major areas in need of being refurbished are: irrigation; a new fence; replacing the missing light pole, and laser leveling the infield. Public Works director Rod Hainey also gave us the option of converting the lights to LED which will save the city a lot of money in the future. Council approved the funds and we should see some repair activity soon.

**Did You Know...** Josh Merritt of Merritt Media said he shot some final footage at Meadows Elementary and is putting the finishing touches on our school construction documentary. This is part of Meadows Place history and something we can share with the world. Can't wait to see it!!!

Well, it's Budget Season in Meadows Place once again. Council and Staff had our first budget meeting over at the Training Center a couple weeks ago. This was an overview, which included an in-depth Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) presented by Public Works Director Rod Hainey. The CIP reviewed project requests, expected expenditures and funding sources to help alert Council and help them in setting spending priorities based on revenue projections. This is a very important process made much simpler by the hard work of Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston. City Administrator Nick Haby played a major role this year in budget discussions. This means that your City Council and Department Heads can move through the process with confidence as it seeks to meet the needs and expectations of the residents of Meadows Place in a financially responsible manner. As both the Mayor and a Meadows Place resident, I thank them all for their hard work.

**County Parks Bond Project Moving Forward**

Alderman Rick Staigle, Public Works Director Rod Hainey, Nick Haby our City Administrator and Parks Director Colene Cabezas have been working hard to make sure Meadows Place is prepared to move forward on this very exciting Parks Bond Project. City Secretary Courtney Rutherford has made sure the City is on top of the paperwork with both Fort Bend County and the City of Stafford. We have submitted our Interlocal agreements with both entities and are just about ready to go. The project, which includes trails, a parking lot, a crossing signal on Airport, connector sidewalks in the City, lighting and more will be funded mostly by Fort Bend County. ## Meadows Place Police Department's Vacation Crime Prevention Tips

Summer is upon us; it is a great time for family trips and vacations. Being on vacation can lead to crime victimization if appropriate crime prevention measures are not followed. Most families do not think about being victimized while on vacation because of all the excitement of going on vacation. The following crime prevention tips are designed to allow the vacationer to enjoy a safe and secure trip and to return to a secure residence.

### Before Leaving...Secure Your Residence

- Make sure all the locks on the doors and windows function properly and use them.
- Make sure your residence looks lived in and not empty.
- Leave the shades and blinds on doors and windows in a position that you would normally have them.
- Ask several neighbors to keep an eye on your residence while you are away. Leave your vacation address and telephone number with the neighbors so you can be reached in an emergency.
- Make sure your smoke and burglar alarms are functioning properly and armed.
- Arrange for a neighbor to pick up your deliveries: mail, newspaper, and any other packages.
- Arrange for someone to maintain your yard so your home appears occupied.
- Have someone place your garbage cans at the curb for normal pickup and put them away after the pickup has been made.
- Make sure you have timers for lights, television, or radios so they turn on and off at the appropriate times.
- Turn the ringer on the telephone down low or off. A possible intruder will not be alerted to your absence by a ringing telephone. If you can, forward your calls to your cellular phone or a trusted individual.

- Leave a normal message on your answering machine; do not announce your absence on the answering machine.
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway while you are gone so it will appear that someone is home. If you leave your car at home, park as you normally would.
- Consider taking valuables that you cannot live without to a safety deposit box.
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department for a vacation watch.

### On The Road

- Try not to carry large amounts of cash; use traveler's checks. If you must carry large sums of money do not openly display it.
- Do not carry more credit cards than you will need. Keep a list of all traveler's check numbers and credit card numbers in a safe place. Have telephone numbers to call if either are lost or stolen.
- Never advertise your plans to strangers; this includes travel routes and the amount of cash you are carrying.
- Do not stop for hitchhikers or stranded motorists. If you want to help, call for assistance for them.
- If you suspect that someone is following you, drive to the nearest well-populated place and call 911 or use your cellular phone for emergency assistance.
- Do not leave any tickets (airline, train, bus) in open view. They are as valuable as cash.
- Males are advised to carry wallets in an inside pocket or the front pocket of their pants. Females should carry their purses under their arm with a firm grasp.

### Car Security

- Always lock your vehicle after entering or leaving it.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Check the backseat before entering your vehicle.
- Always place valuables out of sight, preferably in the trunk. Do not leave wallets, checkbooks, or purses in your vehicle.
- Try not to advertise that you are a tourist.

This is the season to stay on top of maintaining your lawn. With heavy rains, the grass and weeds grow quickly and seemingly overnight. Overgrown yards are a haven for mosquitos to breed. Please visit: <https://www.fortbendcountytexas.gov/government/departments-e-n/health-human-services/special-initiatives/mosquito-surveillance> to learn more.

Lawns that are 9" or taller are not in compliance with ordinance 91.035- Limitation on Height of Grass and Weeds. Which states the following:

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot or lots in the city to allow weeds and/or grass to grow on the lot or lots to a height of more than nine inches. Weeds and/or grass of a height exceeding nine inches are declared a nuisance. (B) The requirements of this section apply to any public right-of-way or easement, or portion thereof located on the real property or portion thereof required to be cut, including specifically the areas of any real property

that extend to or abut upon any curb or paved portion of a public street, the area between a public sidewalk and a public street or highway, and ditches and drainage channels located thereon.

### Controlling Mosquitos Around Your Home





Mosquitos range from being a nuisance to carriers of diseases such as malaria, West Nile Zika, and more. There are many ways to get rid of mosquitos, but they are not all equally effective. Personal chemical repellents include DEET, but most people would rather use a natural repellent with the use of essential oil sprays.

In the yard you can use yellow lights, burn Citronella candles, use a Thermacell, use Cedar mulch in the flower beds, consider a bug Zapper, keep your yard trim, and tidy, (Mosquitos love long grass and rest in dark, humid places). Set mosquito traps, eliminate standing water, attract natural predators like purple martins, swallows, and migratory songbirds to name a few.

Consider natural plant deterrents, the following flora can help keep the pers away. Lavender, Marigolds, Citronella, Catnip, Garlic, Peppermint, Rosemary, Geraniums, and sage.

Eliminating the resting places around the yard and keeping the grass trimmed is half of the battle. Killing them on the ground can be accomplished with the use of a spray application of herbicide that can be readily purchased at the local hardware store, this will interrupt the growth cycle of the pests.



City of Meadows Place has increased the frequency of the mosquito spraying to twice a week, which will help with the control efforts. Mosquitos lay a hundred eggs at a time so populations of this pest can get out of control quickly. When eliminating mosquitos, it is key to use multiple methods, since not all approaches kill mosquitos at every stage of the life cycle.

If your mosquito problem is too serious to tackle on your own, hire a professional pest control company to banish the bloodsuckers.






