On June 1st, I was at the Fort Bend Chamber of Commerce to present the Meadows Place State of the City. It was a full house. Town Hall Meeting

Speaking of a Full House... On June 7th, your Mayor and Council met with residents, developers and other interested parties at a Town Hall meeting at City Hall. The purpose was to seek community input regarding a tentative mixed-use project that included approximately 297 apartments.

After the meeting opened and the developers were introduced, our City Administrator, Nick Haby, began the presentation with a set of visuals that explained the legal process and obligations that the City, and City Council, must follow.

Beekeeper Bob Barbour, a longtime acquaintance of Assistant Chief Ashton, came out to the Ewing's, put up a small temporary home called a Nuc and removed the bees from the grill. Bob the Beekeeper said they were "very calm and easy to work with" and thanks to the Ewings, they are still alive and making honey.

Did You Know... we received several inquiries about the future of the 9.4 acres on West Airport. Thank you all for touching base with us. We are happy to serve. Did You Know... Meadows Place has a fabulous program called Eye on Water. Summer is here, water use will be up, and you can use www. EyeonWater.com to check for leaks or wasted water. The program is free, it is fun and easy to use and can potentially save you big money on your water bill or alert you to a problem. Check Utilities on the website or call City Hall if you have any questions.

Did You Know... Many of our trees are reaching end of life and are being removed. Be sure to address the stump as well. Meadows Place Code of Ordinances; Sec. 91.050 deals with removal of tree stumps and says: 'Upon the removal of the tree, all tree stumps shall be ground or cut to ground level.' Our Code Enforcement Officer says some people are unaware of this rule and wanted to make sure we remember the stump is part of the tree. Thank You. **Did You Know...** I was going over the Revenue and Expenditure reports to prepare for Budget Season and came across some interesting information. Seems more of our residents are visiting the Nature Center and renting the Discovery Center for parties and other gatherings. Rentals are actually up quite a bit. At this point it looks like our Summer Camp Program is also drawing record numbers. This means we are continuing to provide the amenities and services Meadows Place residents want and that, with Council support, our Parks Director and staff are doing a great job.

Did You Know... back in February Krystin Stegemeier was elected the as President of the Meadows Place Children's Community Garden. They are doing marvelous things and having lots of fun as evidenced by the butterfly T-shirts they made using the kids' feet. Did You Know... Door-to-Door

Peddlers - door to door salesmen - solicitors, etc. are NOT allowed to operate in The City of Meadows Place without a City Issued Permit. Period. These - roof salesmen, solar salesmen, magazine peddlers, etc. may be legit but they may just be using this as a cover to Case Your House!! Or your neighbors. Either way they are not supposed to be here. Chief Stewart advises we do NOT let them in, don't answer any questions or engage with them in any way. Close the door and call the PD immediately. Nick explained the role of the Planning and Zoning Commission in a precise and professional manner. Then the developer gave his presentation, explained a few points and turned it back to the City. I asked Alderman Rick Staigle to handle the Question and Comments by the Audience as Rick frequently runs complicated forums like this for the County. He has a process that he follows, and it worked wonderfully. Anyone who wanted to speak was allowed to speak and decorum was kept throughout the meeting. Many who attended the meeting were impressed, including Amaya Labrador who participates in meetings like these regularly as part of her job as an architect. She said we were 'civilized' and was quite complimentary of our staff, Council and residents.

We had a special guest make an appearance, Mr. Billy Burge, owner of Ayreshire Corporation. As he stepped up to the microphone Rick Staigle reminded us that Billy and his family originally developed Meadows Place, known as Meadows. The audience warmly applauded as he grabbed the mic and said "Thanks for the kind words. We are very proud of the success of The Meadows. Through the years the strong leadership of people like yourself has kept the stability of the city of the Meadows what it is today" He then read from a 30-year-old Chronicle article written to young professionals back in April 1994. It stated, 'Meadows is Safe, Secure and Affordable' then compared us to West University and Southside Place as "a little pocket of special." It was a great way to close the Town Hall.

Note: Shortly after the meeting the developer sent us an email withdrawing from the project.

ARPA Funding from County

Thursday at the Meadows Place State of the City at the Chamber, our County Commissioner, Andy Meyers, indicated that we might be getting some good news, but he could not commit yet, but I was encouraged. Later his staff contacted Cameron requesting him to organize a video of the Commissioner and Mayor discussing our long-term collaboration efforts to secure unassigned ARPA funding. There is \$1.5 million allotted specifically for Meadows Place wastewater treatment plant! This is from the unassigned ARPA funds that we have been so ardently seeking for months. This does not cover the complete rebuild but it gives us enough to begin and a balance we can deal with. Council delayed this project to work out the financing. These ARPA funds allow us to do that.

I could not be at Commissioners Court when they awarded our funds, but I want to thank Tia, Rick and Nick for their hard work.

Fireworks Prohibited in the City of Meadows Place

In an effort to maintain a desirable and peaceful community, the City of Meadows place has banned the discharge of fireworks within the city limits. As we approach the Fourth of July the Meadows Place Police Department hopes everyone has a great holiday and to remind all;

Fireworks are not allowed in the City f Meadows Place (at any time), violators are subject to be cited and incurring up to a \$500 fine.

City of Meadows Place City Ordinance:

§ 130.35 FIREWORKS.

(A) *Definitions*. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

FIREWORKS. The term shall include **FIREWORKS**, firecrackers, rockets, sparklers, torpedoes, Roman candles, fire balloons and all other substances or any combination whatsoever designed or intended to produce a noise or effects of fireworks or pyrotechnics, whether or not herein specifically designated and defined.

SET OFF. This term shall include setting off, firing, igniting, discharging or in any other manner setting into action, and shall also include the causing of any of such things to happen.

(B) Prohibitions. It shall be unlawful to manufacture, store, sell, possess or set off fireworks within the city

PENALITY. Any person who violates or causes, allows or permits another to violated any provision of § 130.35 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500. Each occurrence of any violation of § 130.35 shall constitute a separate offense. Each day on which any such violation of § 130.35 occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

If you observe a Fireworks violation, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department 281-983-2900. If calling after hours, ask for a Meadows Place Police Department officer.

Water Quality Issues Possible Water Quality issues related to taste and odor.

Roa Hainey Public Works Director What does this mean? And why? Who does this effect and most importantly, how does this affect the City

of Meadows Place residents?

The good news is that Meadows Place does not have any problems related to this type of issue. The water moves quickly through the distribution system and is refreshed daily. We are fortunate not to have any major dead ends within the system. Occasionally we will find a home where the water has been off for an extended period of time and the first draw will be a little off. Solution to this is just run some fresh water through the internal system in the home, by running water through the fixture in the rear of the house.

The city only has Ground water as a supply.

Ground Water is pumped from the Aquifer below ground, from a depth of 800 - 1000 feet. This water is high in mineral content and in general is free of any harmful contaminates. On an annual basis the source of water in Meadows Place is tested and the results are compiled in the Consumer Confidence report (CCR). This report can be found on the City Web site and an updated version is posted annually. The list of tests includes Lead, Copper, Arsenic, Fluoride, Radioactive and Volatile organic compounds, and Chlorine residual levels in the water (The CCR shows the complete list). We are happy to report that NONE of the tested contaminates exceeded the Maximum Contaminate Level set by the TCEQ (EPA). Water is Natures solvent and will dissolve a small amount of anything that it meets, so as the water moves through the ground it will pick up a little bit of everything. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of contaminants. The presence of contaminates does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk.

To answer the original question about Taste and Odor issues in the drinking water, we need to recognize there are two different sources of drinking water, Ground water and Surface water. In the past most all the Public Water Supply came from Ground Water. And today to address declining water tables (Throughout Fort Bend, Harris, and Montgomery County) and subsidence issues, the source is changing to Surface water. The major difference between the two sources is how the drinking water is disinfected. Ground water uses free chlorine and Surface water uses Total chlorine. When the two different sources are mixed, there is a chemical interaction that results in taste and odor issues. Most of which can be related back to the high mineral scaling of the old pipes, the new mixture will cause a de-scaling of the minerals within the drinking water system. The water is still safe to drink, it will just have a higher concentration of the minerals than normal.

Meadows Place has Ground Water as it's only source and there are no plans to make any changes to our drinking water source.

We have three operational water wells, and we can meet our high summertime demand with two wells with a spare.

Water is Life.

Working Without Required Permits



Permit Required R150.01-R104.2| Comply by 3 Days

The City shall receive applications, review construction documents and issue permits for the erection and alteration of buildings and structures, inspect the premises for which such permits have been issued and enforce compliance with the provisions of this code.

Code Enforcement

Placement of Permit & Responsibility R150.7 & R150.8

<u>*Placement:*</u> The building permit or a copy shall be kept on the site of the work until the completion for the project.

Responsibility: It shall be the duty of every person who performs work for the installation of repair of building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing systems for which this code is applicable, to comply with this code.

Homeowner Ultimately Responsible: Required Permits must be applied for, paid for, issued, and posted on the front door or window PRIOR to any work beginning including removal or demo. However, if the contractor fails to comply then the homeowner will be held responsible to ensure permit(s) are obtained and pay the double fee as well as any citation fee assessed.

Work that will be STOPPED and a DOUBLE FEE assessed if no Permit was obtained:

- Foundation
- Remodeling
- Building
- Electrical
- Plumbing/Gas
- Mechanical/HVAC
- Roof
- Irrigation
- · Yard drainage
- Fence
- Driveway and Sidewalks
- Demolition




