Budget Season & Public Hearings
Mayor and Council have met with
Department Heads to balance the
wants, needs, revenues and expenses
of the City for Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
There is another budget meeting set
for August 4th and sometime next
month, or early September, there will

be two (2) Public Hearings. We will

post the Public Hearing dates in the Fort Bend Star, the Website, the official Facebook Page and next month's newsletter. By then we will have the final numbers from the Fort Bend CAD and the Tax Assessor Collector. The bottom line is this - your taxes and the amount you pay will probably change. Please keep an eye out for the public hearings and ask Mayor or Council if you have any questions. Thank You.

Utility Increases – Groundwater Reduction Fees

Due to a 23% increase in Groundwater Reduction Fees, we will be raising the portion of our Utility bill pertaining to the 'Surface Water Conversion Fee...'. This fee is part of our agreement to meet a State Mandated Groundwater Reduction Plan. Preliminary figures show that if we don't raise the fees we will lose money. The study is not complete and rate hasn't been set but Council is in agreement that we must raise the fee but just enough to cover the cost.

Sex Offender Lawsuit Against City Dismissed

I am pleased to announce that the Sex Offender Residency Restriction lawsuit against The City of Meadows Place was finally dismissed. As you may recall, The City of Meadows Place was one of the very few small cities that stood and fought a lawsuit regarding residency restrictions for Registered Sex Offenders.

Originally dismissed in County Court, the suit was appealed in an attempt to force the city to submit due to burdensome legal fees. Citizens of this city packed the Council Chambers and in a unanimous decision, asked Council to fight on. We did. And we won. First with legislative changes and then in the courtroom. Now there is no doubt about the validity of restrictions set by The City of Meadows Place for Registered Sex Offenders. I thought you would like to know.

Calling 911

When calling 911 from a cell phone in Meadows Place, lead with..."I am in Meadows Place in Fort Bend County". If you reached Ft. Bend 911 you are OK, just answer their questions. However, if you got Harris County 911 they need to know so they can transfer you. This saves valuable time. We are right on the border with Harris County and sometimes the call goes to a cell tower in Harris County, prompting a response from Harris County 911. There are some national and legislative issues at work to correct the problem but these will take years to implement. In the meantime, you can help yourself by starting off with "I am in Meadows Place in Fort Bend County".







Distracted Driver

The Meadows Place Police Department is a Community Conscious Department and would like to take a moment to caution everyone about Distracted Driving, and the dangers it poses.

We ask for your pledge to reduce Distracted Driving.

What is distracted driving?

Distracted driving is any activity that could divert a person's attention away from the primary task of driving. All distractions endanger driver, passenger, and bystander safety. These types of distractions include:

- Texting
- Using a cell phone or smartphone
- · Eating and drinking
- · Talking to passengers
- Grooming
- · Reading, including maps
- Using a navigation system
- · Watching a video
- Adjusting a radio, CD player, or MP3 player

At any given daylight moment across America, approximately 660,000 drivers are using cell phones or manipulating electronic devices while driving

In 2015, 391,000 injuries were caused in distracted driving related accidents. In that same year, distracted driving was cited as a major factor in 3,477 traffic deaths. 9 people in the U.S. are killed each day as a result of crashes involving a distracted driver, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The fight to end distracted driving starts with you. Make the commitment to drive phone-free today.

- Protect lives by never texting or talking on the phone while driving.
- Be a good passenger and speak out if the driver in my car is distracted.
- Encourage my friends and family to drive phone-free.

Reducing Fats, Oils, and Grease in Your Home or Apartment!

Following these dos and don'ts will help you and your neighbors avoid expensive sewer backups, plumbing emergencies, and rate increases to cover sewer maintenance and repairs, while helping protect water quality in

your community.

Do

- Recycle used cooking oil or properly dispose of it by pouring it into a sealable container and placing the sealed container in the trash.
- Scrape food scraps into the trash, not the sink.
- Wipe pots, pans, and dishes with dry paper towels before rinsing or washing them, then throw away the paper towels.
- Place a catch basket or screen over the sink drain when rinsing dishware, or when peeling or trimming food, to catch small scraps that would otherwise be washed down the drain. Throw the scraps in the trash.
- Rinse dishes and pans with cold water before putting them in the dishwasher. Hot water melts the fats, oils, and grease (FOG) off the dishes and into the sewer pipes. Later on in the sewer, the hot water cools and the FOG may clog the pipes.

Don't

- Don't use a garbage disposal or food grinder. Grinding food up before rinsing it down the drain does not remove FOG; it just makes the pieces smaller. Even non-greasy food scraps can plug your home's sewer lines. So, don't put food of any kind down the drain.
- Don't pour cooking oil, pan drippings, bacon grease, salad dressings, or sauces down the sink or toilet, or into street gutters or storm drains.
- Don't use cloth towels or rags to scrape plates or clean greasy or oily dishware. When you wash them, the grease will end up in the sewer.
- Don't run water over dishes, pans, fryers, and griddles to wash oil and grease down the drain.
- Don't flush any type of wipe down the commode. Even flushable wipes only break down into smaller pieces. This gives FOG something to cling to and build up more quickly.

Reducing the fats, oils, and grease (FOG) going down your kitchen sink helps prevent sewer problems.



McDonald Park Restroom:

The restroom is operating efficiently using a solar grid for power. The cost to maintain the facility is .08 cents per use. The vault capicity will require it to be emptied once every 4 months at a cost of \$240. Annual expense will be approximately \$960.

Little Libraries:

McDonald Park is home to 3 Libraries built by YAC. The libraries offer a borrow and return honor system. There are books for all ages / Interest.

Playground 4 All:

An inclusive swing has been installed in McDonald park. This marks the first item of many more to come towards completing a playground 4 all. This playground is soley funded through donations. The Youth Action Council YAC has been working hard i to raise money for the completion of the project. They've raised \$34K and need an additionsl \$41K to complete Phase I. 


