Cats & Critters

Meadows Place depends on you and Fort Bend Animal Control to keep the animal population in check. Recently there have been some changes by the Fort Bend Animal Control as they adopted the TNR program (see June Newsletter) which Traps, Neuters and Returns cats back to the area where they were trapped. It takes a while to produce results but eventually

it will. The catch is, YOU have to trap the cats and hold them until Animal Control comes to pick them up. It is pretty simple and the city has two traps for you to use.

Speaking of Animal Control, it does no good to call them if you do not have the animal you are calling about secured. They charge the city each time they come out and if the animal is not there they mark it GOA – Gone On Arrival – and go on to another call. Frustrating but Council, Code Enforcement and even PD are working toward a solution. You will be included.

Kirkwood

Councilman Rick Staigle meets with the Engineering and Construction companies once a month to review the project, make sure they are doing what they are supposed to do and to check on the time frame. We are about 2 months behind so he "reminded" them of the (stiff) penalties for being late and "encouraged" them to add people and work on Saturdays. So far they have. I can't wait for this to be done. It is a mess... Thank You Rick.

Budget

Meadows Place is a one square mile city that looks after its money. Monarch Gateway News

Just wanted everyone to know that I met with Barbara Willy of Monarch Gateway as they seeded the CenterPoint powerline easement with native grasses and flower seeds of various types. Our little project is now dependent on nature...we just need rain. Barbara reported that all went well and we might even see a smattering of flowers late this summer or fall. We should see the early signs of native grasses coming up but those are mostly the shallow root type grasses. In about a year we will start seeing native grasses whose roots go down 10 to 12 feet and actually break up and reconfigure the gumbo soil. Next spring we should see a real variety of pretty flowers as a mix designed to attract several types of birds and butterflies has been planted. More seeding after CenterPoint is done working in the right of way. Barbara was excited to tell me that there has been more news on the CenterPoint front. She has been invited to a national meeting of District Representatives to explain our project and to find ways to expand it. CenterPoint is behind it 100%. This is turning into a big deal and thanks to Barbara and Colene, Meadows Place will be getting some regional, if not national attention. Pretty exciting. Thanks Colene and Barbara. Jugging and Skimmers

Chief Stewart and the Meadows Place Police Department are alerting the community of two potentially dangerous situations occurring in the Houston Metro-Plex "Jugging" and "Skimmers"

Jugging is a term used by Law Enforcement, to describe the stalking of potential victims as a prelude to burglary or robbery. Jugging takes place when a criminal sees you with something he wants, and he follows you until an opportunity is presented to take that "something" from you. It is employed in this manner... Criminal A is staking out the gas station/mall/bank/store parking lot and sees Victim B exit with purse/merchandise/bank bag/etc. They then wait until the victim loads the car and drives to the gas station/home/restaurant and leaves valuables in the car.

When Victim B parks the car and heads inside, out pops Criminal A, who breaks into the car, steals the merchandise and slips away unseen. Some even pull up beside the car while you are gassing up, opening the passenger door or reaching through the window; grabbing the purse or other valuables and driving off (Sliders).

What Are Skimmers?

Skimmers are essentially malicious card readers attached to the real payment terminals so that they can harvest data from every person that swipes their cards. These are attached to the card reader at ATMs, Gas Pumps or other devices used to read credit cards.

The typical ATM skimmer is a small device that fits over an existing card reader. Most of the time, the attackers will also place a hidden camera somewhere in the vicinity in order to record personal identification numbers, or PINs, used to access accounts. Some criminals install a fake PIN pads over the actual keyboards to capture the PIN directly, bypassing the need for a camera.

Check for Tampering

When you approach an ATM, check for some obvious signs of tampering at the top of the ATM/Gas Pump/Other Card Readers, near the speakers, the side of the screen, the card reader itself, and the keyboard. If something looks different, such as a different color or material, graphics that aren't aligned correctly, or anything else that doesn't look right, don't use it.

Wiggle Everything

Even if you can't see any visual differences, push at everything, Card Readers are solidly constructed and generally don't have any loose parts. Credit card readers have more variation, but still: Pull at protruding parts like the card reader. See if the keyboard is securely attached and just one piece. Does anything move when you push at it?

The Meadows Place Police Department reminds everyone to be Vigilant in the use and security of their belongings and the use of credit cards. Always call the Police if you suspect any suspicious activity. Meadows Place Police department 281-983-2900.



Notice of Violation Letter

What is it? It is the City's formal notification to the property owner(s) of the ordinance violation(s) at the property address.

What to do if I received one? Read the entire letter carefully, including attached pictures and determine which city ordinance is in violation. Pay extra attention to the section "Corrective Action". This is where you will find the exact steps you need to take to fix the violation. DO NOT IGNORE THE LETTER.

How many days do I have to fix it? The number of days given to you to fix violation(s) varies from 7-10 days for grass/weeds and up to 30 days to trim tree or clean exterior of the home. The countdown starts from the date the NOV letter has been created.

What if I cannot address the violation within the time frame given? Whatever the reason(s) you may have, make sure to contact Code Enforcement at (281) 983-2938 or code-enforcement@cityofmeadowsplace.org and let us know ahead of time. This is to make sure you do not get charges filed against you in municipal court for non-compliance upon our follow-up inspection of the property.

When will my property be re-inspected? Properties in violation will be re-inspected for compliance on the last day of given timeframe to fix the issue on the letter. For example: high grass/weeds violation – these will be re-inspected on the 7th or 10th day.

What will happen if I ignore the letter and do not fix the violation? If during our re-inspection we observed that your property is still in violation, charges will be filed against you in municipal court and you will get a Notice to Appear in court with a date and time for you to see the judge. At this point, fines are imposed on you as the owner/responsible party at the said property address. As per our ordinance, you can be fined every single day the violation is still present at the property.

Keep in mind:

• You need to submit a permit application with the City *BEFORE* you start replacing your roof.

- You may also need a permit BEFORE replacing/ repairing your fence, depending on the scope of work.
- Failure to submit proper permits before working *may* result in citation and/or charges filed against you in Municipal Court. When in doubt or unsure if you need a permit or not, please call Permits Department at (281) 983-2932 for assistance.
 - 1. Please remember to keep trees cut and trimmed. §130.07(B) It is unlawful for anyone to maintain trees, shrubs or other vegetative material upon a public street and/or public right-of-way less than the minimum clearance measured from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk and over the public street/pavement (Sidewalk: not less than 10 feet and Public Street: not less than 16 feet).
 - 2. Put our trash out only on trash days or **not more** than 18 hours before the next scheduled trash pickup. *This includes lawn clippings, so be sure* to tell your Lawn Contractor! \$130.09(A).

Don't be a Victim – Do your homework

How often do you hear of someone being taken advantage of by a contractor? Unfortunately, it happens all too often, thus giving reputable and legitimate contractors a bad name. While the majority of contractors may be trustworthy, there are others who are unscrupulous and unreliable. Some will fix items that don't need fixing, or grossly overcharge you for services or parts. Worse, there are plenty of con artists posing as tradesmen who will simply take your money and run.

Take time to do your homework and select a trustworthy contractor to do the job. As the spring home improvement season approaches, look out for these "red flags" which can indicate a contractor may be unscrupulous. Beware if the contractor:

- Drives an unmarked van with out-of-state license plates
 Be suspicious of anyone who simply shows up and operates in nondescript vehicles with no business markings.
- Offers a special price if you sign today or wants the money upfront or only in cash - A good contractor will never want CASH or the entire payment up front. There is usually a reasonable down payment and payments are in progression based on the construction schedule. It's practice for a contractor to ask for 1/3 of the total cost up front to cover purchasing material.
- Has no references Get at least 3 references from other customers. Ask to talk to the contractor's last three customers, not his favorites. This ensures that the contractor is consistent in quality. If he refuses to get you past customer references, that should be a sign that there will be a problem.
- Does not provide written estimates or contracts Never trust a contractor who doesn't require a written contract. Never sign a blank contract or one with holes in it. If something goes wrong, you have no legal recourse because nothing was in writing. Get a contract that spells out cost of materials, labor, an outline of the project,

and other important work details. If there are changes along the way add detailed "change orders" signed by all parties.

- Is not licensed Always ask a contractor to see their licensing credentials, then verify this information with the local building inspector's office. Look up the contractor's Better Business Bureau rating. Even if your state doesn't require licenses for certain projects, your contractor should still be insured. Call their insurance carrier and make sure their policy is current and can cover your project.
- Does not look professional and does not have business cards or letterhead on invoices - Get a business card.
 Call the number on the card and make sure he picks up. (Some numbers are voicemail services that can't be traced.) Call the Better Business Bureau, go on Yelp and see if there are any complaints about him.

If you hire a contractor, you're trusting this person to come into your home and change the most expensive thing you own. So take the necessary precautions to avoid becoming a victim.
