Kirkwood Project Out For Bid

With the engineering complete, the landscaping design done and the bid packet compiled, The City of Meadows Place posted a bid notice requesting construction proposals be submitted for evaluation, and hopefully, selection of a construction contractor for the Kirkwood reconstruction project.


On August 22nd, Copies of Plans, Specifications and Contract Documents were made available with the sealed bids due on the 19th of September. There is a process to bidding a project like this that includes meetings, forms and bid bonds. Then more meetings and evaluations to make sure the bids are complete. Should a contractor be selected. Council will look at the final numbers and discuss payment options. Fortunately Meadows Place is in a strong financial position. HDR did the engineering with Asukura Robinson doing the landscape design and planning. They worked well together to get us ready to bid. Rick Staigle, a professional traffic engineer by trade, has been invaluable in this process. In addition to spending long hours working with HDR, Asukura Robinson and CenterPoint Energy, Rick has served as our liaison with the Fort Bend County which is fortuitous since this is part of a Fort Bend County Mobility Bond Project. We will keep you posted as we progress but one thing to know is that once construction starts, it is going to be a mess, but it will be more than worth it when it is finished.

2018-2019 Tax Rate Hearings

Prior to setting the 2018-2019 Tax Rate, from which the budget will be set, the public gets an opportunity to see where the rate is set and why, to ask questions and make comments. City Staff and Council have worked hard preparing and hope you are pleased with the result. The first Public Hearing date for the proposed tax rate was August 28th at the regular Council Meeting. The next is September 18th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Join us, all are welcome.

Neighborhood Watch Program

Did you know...Storm Drain Management, Mosquitos and Water Meters

Hello everyone, here is another issue of Did you know? This segment will be related to storm drain management, mosquitos, and water

meters. We hope you find this information provided to be informative and useful. Please visit the City's website at www. cityofmeadowsplace.org where you can find more information about the City of Meadows Place and current city news.

Here we go...

- Did you know that the City has contracted with Cypress Creek Pest Control to spray the City for mosquitos? Currently, our spray days are Thursday evenings.
- Did you know that only female mosquitos blood feed? Strange but true...
- Did you know that mosquitos can cause heartworm disease in dogs? Be sure to have your dog vaccinated or treated for heartworms...
- Did you know that West Nile Virus is a virus transferred from birds to humans by mosquitos? Mosquitos are a vector for the virus
- Did you know that the City of Meadows Place must have a permit from the State of Texas for storm water discharge? It's true, the City has a Stormwater Management Plan that is regulated by the State of Texas.
- Did you know that only rain water is allowed in our storm drains? It's true!
- Did you know that swimming pool water is not supposed to be drained into our storm drains? Pool water contains chlorine, which could be hazardous to aquatic life in our bayous.
- Did you know that lawn clippings are not supposed to be blown or sweep into city storm drains? It's a violation of our stormwater management plan.
- Did you know that a water meter is a device that measures how much water you use? It is like your gas or electricity meter and it is read in/per thousand gallons.
- Did you know that a water meter slows down with age? The meter cannot arbitrarily run faster than it was designed to run, the mechanical parts are not capable of "speeding up" or registering a higher reading. Thus, a water meter will never read in favor of the city.
- Did you know that tampering with a water meter is against the law? It's true and we have a sensitive meter reading system that indicates to us when a meter has been tampered with.

I hope everyone has had a good summer. It's hot outside so take precautions with the heat and mosquitos!



Water Meters

On July 24th, 2018, City Council approved Ordinance No. 2018-16 amending section 51.99 of Chapter 51 of the City of Meadows Place Code of Ordinance regulating penalties for provisions applicable to water and sewer for tampering with, or rendering our water meters unusable, raising the penalty to \$500.00 to cover costs.



This means if we receive an alert for a possible "Tampered" Meter and find your meter has cut wires, damage, etc. you will be given a citation and fined up to \$500.00. This just covers the cost of replacement. Call Utilities for help.
