Court of Record

At the August City Council Meeting passed Ordinance No. 2019-22 amending Chapter 34 of the City of Meadows Place Code of Ordinances, established a municipal court of record. A court of record is a trial court or appellate court in which a record of the proceedings is captured and preserved, for the possibility of appeal. This is a step up for the Meadows Place Municipal Court and gives us more authority in areas that will benefit Meadows Place, especially when it comes to issuing warrants that will help the City deal with problem houses. Prior to the passage of this ordinance we had to have our City Attorney - Randle Law Office - make the warrant request to the District Court which was VERY time consuming, if they could even get heard. This will help us expedite these issues and make sure Meadows Place is providing the highest, and quickest, level of service possible. Thank You Council. Improvements like this and make sure Meadows Place continues to be... Your Place for Life.

Did You Know... Ken and Estella Smith played a huge role in the latest Dulles Dolls and Band Booster Club auction and fundraiser. These Meadows Place residents were joined by Jimmy Fenwick, another Meadows Place resident active in our community. These three are GREAT examples of Servant Leaders. All are involved in other areas around the city. Ken has recently joined the EDC Advisory Council and will be influential in making important decisions about the future of our fair city. Did You Know... Public Works Director Erik Tschanz had a company named Texas Hydrant Services conduct an audit on our 139 Fire Hydrants. This audit was completed on July 24th and a preliminary report presented to Erik on the 25th . We found some that would not open because the cap was stuck or it had rusted flange bolts, etc. We marked those hydrants, notified Fire Chief DiCamillo and put this project as our #1 priority. Thank You, Eric for looking after us and testing our hydrants.

Did You Know...Sharon Leal reminded us that when you change addresses, you need to change your driver's license AND Voter Registration. Sharon is a VDR(Volunteer Deputy Registrar) and can help you register you to vote. She is available every Monday. Sharon is President of the Community Garden and would love to see you out there too.

Did You Know... There was a group of 50 young students from New Zealand at the Skeeters game. A few of them got to hear all about Meadows Place.

Did You Know... The city just spent around \$25, 000 because someone dumped some 4x4's and 2x4's down a manhole that led to the Waste Water Treatment Plant. They lumber got caught in the impellers of two of our pumps. In addition to broken blades on the impellers, a main pump shaft was bent which caused excessive vibration leading to additional problems. Somebody, a neighbor or their contractor whose laziness not only cost us (you) a lot of money and put us on standby as we had to prepare for further catastrophic pump failure. Not a good situation. Dumping materials down our manholes is not allowed. It is a crime. Now you know why. Please report this type of activity to PD immediately. Thank you.

Budget and Tax Rate Hearing

Meadows Place had a Public Hearing regarding the proposed Tax Rate last month and will have another on September 10th; 6:30 at City Hall. Council is proposing an increase in tax rate with the bulk of the increase going for two (2) full time and one part time police officer. Included is a significant increase in city controlled dispatch, which is a huge step in helping keep Meadows Place Police officers on the street protecting us. If approved, the city tax bill will go up about \$ 26.75 over last year on a house valued at \$225K.

National Night Out is a great opportunity for citizens and law enforcement to partner up against crime. Workplace Crime Prevention

Then you go to work, don't leave your crime prevention sense at home. Almost any crime that can happen at home or in your neighborhood can happen in the workplace. You

can minimize your chances of becoming a victim of crime if you know what situations to avoid and what preventive actions to take.

- Never leave valuables unattended and unsecured.
- Keep your purse, wallet, keys, and other valuable items with you at all times, or lock them in a drawer or closet.
- Always lock your office and any unoccupied room, even when leaving for only a moment.
- Check the identity of any strangers who are in your office. Offer your assistance and ask them who they are visiting and if you can help them find that person. If they make you uncomfortable, inform your supervisor or Security Office (this may include the local police) of your suspicions.
- · Always let someone know where you'll be, whether you're coming in late, working late, going to the mailroom, going out to lunch, or going to a meeting.
- If you bring personal items to work such as a coffee cup, a radio, or a calculator, mark them with your name or initials.
- If you find weapons, drugs, or other illegal items, do not handle them. Contact your supervisor and the Police; let them know what and where you found suspicious item.
- Be discreet. Don't advertise your social life and vacation plans or those of your coworkers to people visiting or calling.
- Be cautious in restrooms. Attackers can hide in stalls and

Fats, Oil and Grease

The fats, oil and grease (FOG) found in food such as meat, cooking oil, shortening, sauces and dairy products are major concerns for our sewer system. When you put cooking leftovers like grease, oil and food scraps down the drain, it sticks to the sides of your pipes. This clogs your pipes and causes back-ups resulting in an expensive visit from the plumber. Please take precautions to keep your pipes grease free.

How to Clean Dishes to Protect Your Pipes:

- Remove oil and grease from all dishes and pans before washing. Once grease or cooking oil has cooled, pour into covered collection containers. Wipe out the remainder using a paper towel. Never pour oil or grease down the drain.
- The garbage disposal does not destroy grease, it only
 makes it smaller. If you have accumulated grease in
 your pipes, putting food scraps down the drain can
 clog your pipes faster. Scrape food scraps from dishes
 into a trash can to avoid using your garbage disposal.

- Cover kitchen sink drains with catch baskets (strainers) and empty into the trash can as needed.
- Avoid using the garbage disposal and hot water. If grease does go down the drain, follow it with cold water.



If you are experiencing sewer issues please call USW at 832-980-0809, and a service tech will come out to determine if it's a private issue or a city issue.



Meadows Place is providing respite for Monarch butterflies enroute to Mexico during their annual migration thanks to the efforts of city officials, CenterPoint, Monarch Gateway and several nonprofit groups.

The city is the first permitted prairie restoration site in power line right of way, according to Barbara Keller-Willy, executive director and founder of Monarch Gateway and president of the Native Prairies Association of Texas.

As a Monarch Host City, Meadows Place is converting 13 acres of ROW to a pollinators' habitat, including milkweed on which Monarchs lay their eggs and caterpillars feed upon before they form a chrysalis.

Representatives of Wildlife Habitat Federation have treated the land for invasive plants and have seeded it with native plants to create a habitat for pollinators. But it's more than that. "It will bring back what we used to have - the animals and plants that existed at one time," said Jim Willis, president of Wildlife Habitat Federation.

The praire land will provide many opportunities for education. Meadows Elementary will use it as a subject source for creative writing, science studies of habitat and life cycle, and in math they will use days of growth and development to create charts and math problems.

Texas ATM students and professors are currently involved in research and development of a low combustible seed mix as well as future data collection from the site. This site will also provide teaching clinics about monarchs, prairies, plant life and pollination.

A grand opening will be scheduled at the new trailhead located directly behind the fieldhouse in McGrath Park on October 5, during the Monarch Madness Festival at 10:00am.
