COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR By Charles Jessup



2022-2023 Budget and Tax Rate Set

Your City Council, in two separate meetings, passed the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 municipal budget. As in years past, it represents long hours of hard work and the dedication of many. This year the process was different than in years past. This year your Council gave input as to what the city should spend and what

the priorities should be (roads and infrastructure). Then instead of multiple meetings with Council, our Department Heads and City Administrator met amongst themselves to hammer out a budget to bring back to Council. They prioritized expenditures, modified department expenses to meet Council goals and then our City Administrator and all those departmentally responsible for budget expenditures met with Council. A recommended budget was formed based on projected revenues, changes made, documented and then submitted to the City Council for approval.

Your Council worked closely with our City Administrator, City Secretary and Finance Director, Anna-Maria Weston, to make sure we were working within legal parameters and state guidelines. It can get confusing but fortunately the City has the expertise on staff and on Council to make sure we are within guidelines. Once we set the General Maintenance and Operations portion of the budget, Council debated and deliberated over how to address funding for future infrastructure improvements. After much debate, your Council decided to continue moving forward with a 15 year Capital Improvement Program on a Pay-As-You Go basis. This method helps prevent us from overspending and not having the means to pay for our projects. It also allows us to slow things down if the economy dips as it has in the past. A conservative spending approach to be sure but very manageable - and, we won't accumulate millions of dollars in debt that we have to pay interest on. Your tax rate was reduced slightly (0.806000/100 from 0.832000/100) and those figures are on the website as well. You will see that in addition to covering the operating expenses of the city, the 2022-2023 tax rate provides \$286,676.00 for a dedicated Infrastructure Fund to be used on future infrastructure programs like The Dorrance Project. More than ever, the budget is a planning tool, providing guidance and direction to city staff throughout the budget year and it is my belief that our outstanding staff and City Council did a marvelous job of meetings todays needs while providing for the future.

Dorrance Project

As most of you know, the Dorrance Project has begun. This, as all construction projects are, will be a mess. There is no way around it but thanks to a concerned City Council and project expertise from our engineers and contractors but also our in-house volunteer project manager, Rick Staigle, we are doing everything we can to minimize the "Mess" and inconvenience to those directly affected. Mail and garbage pickup are moving smoothly and the traffic is too. Thanks to our PD for the extra care they are providing us. If you have questions you can call City Hall, the Mayor or click the 'Ask A Question' on the website. You can get updates and follow along by clicking the Projects tab on our website. All projects are "a mess", especially when they are on one of the busiest streets in town, so we want to do the best we can to minimize the mess and keep you informed. Weather permitting, this phase of the project is scheduled to be finished in November.

Important: Trash and Trash/ Recycle Cans are to be kept off city right of way and out of public view on days that are not trash days. At end of each trash day *Tuesday or Friday* ensure you place your trash/recycle cans out of public view behind

your fence or in your garage.

Placing cans on the side of your home, visible from the street is NOT in compliance. Leaving Trash or Trash/Recycle cans at curb until next trash day is NOT in compliance unless you have received a CODE RED alert from Mayor Jessup letting you know to do so.

Ordinances:

130.09(A) - Refuse Prohibited at Or Near Streets and Curbs (not trash day)

The most complaints: I received the most complaints in this period on Trash or Trash/Recycle cans at curb on days not trash days.

Your help is needed: Make sure you store your trash, trash/ recycle cans in your garage or behind your fence at the end of each trash day stored out of public view. That is one thing that you can do to help keep Meadows Place *Your* Place for *Life*.

During July 27, 2022, thru August 11, 2022, there were a total of **67** violations and **138** inspections completed. The following are the top **5** items that needed the most attention during this period.

ATM Safety

ATM's have added a real convenience to our lives but, at the same time, an element of risk has also popped up. Using an ATM safely requires awareness and a little planning. Just because an ATM is open for business and available 24 hours

a day doesn't mean it is always safe to use. A little common sense can keep most of us out of trouble, but you should periodically review the safety of the ATM you are going to use.

Before using an ATM:

Pick a Safe Location. ATM's are used 24 hours a day. They are susceptible to misuse, vandalism, robbery, and can jeopardize safety of customers. Therefore, use only an ATM in high visibility, high traffic areas with a defined parking area, adequate lighting, and proper landscaping. Do not use ATMs that are remote or hidden behind buildings, behind pillars, walls, or away from public view. Beware of overgrown shrubbery or trees. They make good hiding places and robbers like to have the element of surprise and no witnesses.

Using the ATM:

Try to Limit Your Use to Daylight Hours. Take someone with you, if you can. Use ATM's You're Familiar With. Be Observant. When you drive up to an ATM location, look around. If you see anyone suspicious standing around or just sitting in a car, drive away. Look Over the Machine Before Inserting Your Card. If you see something unfamiliar on the machine, it could be part of an ATM scam. If it looks funny, go to another ATM. Have Your Card in Your Hand. Be ready to use it right away. You don't want to stand around and take extra time looking for your card in your purse or wallet. Keep Your Car Secured. Lock your car if you have to get out to use the ATM machine.

Memorize your personal PIN number to prevent loss and to expedite the transaction. Shield your transaction. Use your body or hand to shield the ATM keyboard when you enter your PIN. Don't give someone else the opportunity to see the number you are entering. Put your cash away immediately in your pocket, wallet or purse, extract your card and walk away. Do not display your cash or count it at the ATM. Cash can be tempting when it is out in the open. Don't leave your receipt. Be sure to take your receipt or transaction records with you when you leave. Never accept an offer of help or request help from a suspicious person at the ATM machine. Robberies are somewhat more likely to occur at walk-up ATM's than at drive-thru ATM's.

Controlling Mosquitos Around Your Home

The City of Meadows Place currently sprays for mosquitos, on a weekly basis. With the dry weather and almost complete lack of rain, the standing water has not been a major issue. When we return to a wet weather rain cycle, please be vigilant about removing standing water in your yard.



Mosquitoes range from being a nuisance to carriers of diseases such as malaria, West Nile Zika, and more. There are many ways to get rid of mosquitos, but they are not all equally effective. Personal chemical repellents include DEET, but most people would rather use a natural repellant with the use of essential oil sprays.

In the yard you can use yellow lights, burn Citronella candles, use a Thermacell, use Cedar mulch in the flower beds, consider a bug Zapper, keep your yard trim, and tidy, (Mosquitos love long grass and rest in dark, humid places). Set mosquito traps, eliminate standing water, attract natural predators like purple martins, swallows, and migratory songbirds to name a few. Consider natural plant deterrents, the following flora can help keep the pers away. Lavender, Marigolds, Citronella, Catnip, Garlic, Peppermint, Rosemary, Geraniums, and sage.

By eliminating the resting places around the yard and keep the grass trimmed is half of the battle. Killing them on the ground can be accomplished with the use of a spray application of herbicide that can be readily purchased at the local hardware store, this will interrupt the growth cycle of the pests.

Mosquitos lay a hundred eggs at a time so populations of this pest can get out of control quickly. When eliminating mosquitos, it is key to use multiple methods, since not all approaches kill mosquitos at every stage of the life cycle. The City will continue to spray for mosquito control until the cooler weather is upon us. When the nighttime temperatures are below 70 degrees, these pests start to go dormant. High winds also effect the spraying for mosquitos.

If your mosquito problem is too serious to tackle on your own, hire a professional pest control company to banish the bloodsuckers.






