Harvey - A Quick Look Back

Those who read last month's Did You Know may recall that I spoke about putting most of the finishing touches on our new Emergency Operations/Training Center. I finished it up with:

We believe we are now as prepared as we can be. I am proud of our staff for completing these types of preparedness

procedures. Now let's hope we NEVER have to use them!

Well, that didn't work out so well because we used them - and then some. As Harvey approached, our Emergency Response Team sprang into action and activated the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). As reports came in Police Chief Gary Stewart quickly ramped up to Level 4 which puts all the staffing and preparedness wheels into motion. Equipment was put into place, basic provisions were acquired, vehicles staged and staff called in. Part of our Emergency Operations Plan had predetermined the essential personnel, who were notified and began to arrive at the EOC. The rest of our Emergency Operations Team included Captain Jack Ashton and our entire police force including onsite dispatch that ran 24/7 throughout the event. Public Works Director Danny Segundo and his staff worked tirelessly to make sure our water plants were safe, that our drains were clear and the wastewater plant was fully functional, all of which presented varying levels of danger. City Secretary Courtney Rutherford and Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston were there producing the necessary forms, reviewing FEMA rules and making sure we followed FEMA protocols and documentation procedures. Parks Director Colene Cabezas acted as our Evacuation Coordinator, a position she held down in Brazoria County and Pearland. Most of these folks were with us 24 hours a day from Friday until Wednesday. I assure you we have never been more prepared and it showed. We had the Hummers humming, were part of the County coordination calls and on top of that, our new EOC facility exceeded expectations. It was a stressful but rewarding situation for me as I witnessed what looked to be a welloiled machine being put through its paces and performing flawlessly.

Did You Know... Cameron Miller asked "Will any of the release of water from local levees and reservoirs impact Meadows Place? If so, will it be city wide or isolated"?

This is a Great question as evidenced by recent events. Most people don't think about this but No, we are not subject to local levee or reservoirs directly impacting Meadows Place as is the case in other areas of Harris and Fort Bend Counties. A little additional information - we don't drain into the Brazos River watershed so all the concern over the Brazos rising does not affect us. We drain from here to Keegan's Bayou to Brays Bayou, which dumps into Buffalo Bayou about 10 or 12 miles east of Galveston Bay- just this side of the big 610 bridge on the east of Houston. Thanks Cameron, I appreciate the question. Hope this helps.

Budget and Tax Rate

Council has passed the budget and tax rate for the City of Meadows Place. The tax rate is the same as last year - \$0.832 per 100 dollar evaluation of your home. This year, due to increasing property values we should raise an additional 4.17%, or \$113,417.00. Overall, the budget for the city is \$5,956,347.00, down 0.39% from last year. This, based on our budget, and based on reducing costs in most areas, will leave us with a balance surplus of \$34,946. The itemized budget is on our website if you have any questions. You can be proud of our staff and your Council who worked so hard to put this very exacting budget together.







Harvey Recap

On August 24th Mayor Jessup, Chief Stewart, City Secretary Courtney Rutherford, Public Works Director Danny Segundo, Parks Director Colene Cabezas met to discuss Tropical Storm

Harvey. During this meeting topics such as the probability of Harvey becoming a Hurricane and impacting the Gulf Coast were discussed. With the increased likelihood of Harvey making landfall and directly impacting the City of Meadows Place, the decision was made to spin up the new Emergency Operations Center.

While the center was not 100% complete, Chief Stewart (who is also the Emergency Management Coordinator) felt confident in the Center and Team's abilities to operate during the unprecedented event. To make this happen, all city resources were needed. All Essential Personnel were scheduled to come on duty Friday and remain on location until the storm and conditions had subsided.

The Operations Center was home for six days to as many as 24 people at any given time, including Police Officers, Public Works, Parks and Rec, and the City's administration. They worked in 12 hour shifts, some shifts lasting 20+ hours. The police department maintained a 24 hour a day communications center in the Operations Center to serve the community, under attack from Harvey. Officers patrolled as conditions allowed and often resorting to the "Hummers" as high water vehicles and responding to emergency situations only. Public Works Director, Danny Segundo and Eric Sullivan maintained sewer and drainage conditions and responding to blocked drainage as able in addition to assisting with barricades for flooded streets.

Weather conditions and the status of the city was Monitored by Mayor Jessup and Chief Stewart around the clock. The City Secretary, Courtney Rutherford maintained operations for the city's business. Emergency operations were supported by Finance and Parks and Rec divisions. Parks and Rec Director Colene Cabezas and team monitored conditions and assisted wherever help was needed, this included paperwork, meals, and working with the Fort Bend County EOC, locating shelters for those in needed

This article is far from exhaustive and would require volumes to account for everyone and all that was done. We had many residents who assisted with updates on conditions, meals and supplies Thank you Meadows Place Residents! Still there is no way to tell you about all the selfless acts of the city employees and the sacrifices they made leaving their families so they could come to work and serve their community!



Mosquito Control



HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN DO TO CONTROL MOSQUITOES OUTSIDE YOUR HOME:

• Install or repair and use window and door

screens. Do not leave doors propped open.

• Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near water.

- o Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
- o For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- o Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.

• Use an outdoor flying insect spray where mosquitoes rest. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid areas like under patio furniture, or under the carport or garage. When using insecticides, always follow label instructions.



HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN DO TO CONTROL MOSQUITOES INSIDE YOUR HOME:

• Keep windows and doors shut and use air conditioning when possible.

• Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs inside your home. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.

• Kill mosquitoes inside your home. Use an indoor flying insect fogger* or indoor insect spray* to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow label directions. Only using insecticide will not keep your home free of mosquitoes.

o Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid places like under the sink, in closets, under furniture, or in the laundry room.
