COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR By Charles Jessup



2019-2020 Tax Rate

You asked for it and you got it. Council shared your concerns and, along with staff, reviewed the previously posted proposed tax rate and found ways to move purchases, use the current budget funds and tap into our reserves to reduce the proposed tax rate without giving up the main drivers of the increase, which included additional police officers and dispatch. No easy feat but job

well done. The tax rate for 2019-2020 which was unanimously adopted by City Council is 0.832 per per \$100 of assessed value, which is the same rate assessed for the past several years. Budget Season is always interesting and requires a lot of hard work on everyone's part. A big Thank You goes out to Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston, Department Heads, Staff and Council for putting the city in such a strong financial position.

The last City Council Meeting was a busy one. It included several important actions and an executive session with the attorney. The two pieces of legislation that most people were interested were the budget and the all-important tax rate which determines how much city property tax we pay. Council heard comments and questions. After the tax rate passed Terry Henley thanked Mayor and Council for all their hard work on this budget and for not raising the rate. Then Stewart Barrowman poured over the budget proposal and asked about one line item, for a City Administrator. He and I are meeting later to discuss the matter. Thank You to everyone who turned out and asked questions. It is that type of resident inquiry and input that help Council determine the future direction of the City.

Court of Record

As we mentioned last month, Council passed Ordinance No. 2019-22 which established a Meadows Place Municipal Court of Record. This is a step which gives the Meadows Place Municipal Court more authority when it comes to issuing warrants to deal with things like non-compliant houses internally. This will allow us to expedite these matters to make sure Meadows Place can respond and offer an improved level of service. Our 'Court of Record' will go into effect within 30 days. Thank You.

The Meadows Place Police Department Encourages everyone to have a safe Halloween with these Safety Tips

- Instruct your older children to TAKE FRIENDS when "Trick or Treating."
- Make sure a TRUSTED ADULT, accompanies your younger children when "Trick or Treating." Older children should travel in groups.
- Children should not enter homes without your prior permission.
- Only approach homes that are well-lit both inside and outside.
- Teach your children to NEVER approach a vehicle unless they are accompanied by you
- Make sure your children wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight or glow stick
- Make sure your children are able to see and breathe easily when using facial masks.
- All costumes and masks should be clearly marked as flame resistant.
- Teach your children to always stay in well-lit areas, and never go into isolated areas.
- Teach your children to stay alert for any suspicious incidents and report anything unusual to you and law enforcement.
- Teach your children if anyone tries to grab them to draw attention to themselves and yelling loud as they can: "This person is trying to take me," or "This person is not my father/mother." Teach your children to make every effort to escape by walking, running, or pulling away; yelling; kicking; attracting attention; and otherwise resisting.
- Consider organizing or attending parties at home, in schools, or in community centers as a good alternative to "Trick or Treating."

Public Works had a great year doing the parking lot at the Community Center • Emergency Storm Drain enhancement to the bayou on Montecito near the power lines • Major Bar Screen upgrade at the Waste Water Treatment Plant • Siding Repairs & Painted the EMS Facility • Converted lighting at City Hall to energy efficient LED's • Did a full audit on every Fire Hydrant in the City then upgraded or repaired as needed • Completed and prioritized an interior street repair matrix • Installed City logos on Pressure Tanks at Water Wells # 2 and # 3

Initiated (limited) direct deposit to some vendors and contract employees • Paid off 2005 Bond Debt Four years early, saving the City \$32,000 • Upgraded payment to certain vendors to draft from check with significant savings in time to staff.

Meadows Place Police Department Conducted their first formal Pinning in 2019 • All positions were filled and dispatch time was added • Expanded training partnerships with surrounding agencies using the Meadows Place Training Center • Initiated CRASE classes for MP residents and surrounding cities • Upgraded EOC to better prepare for long term emergency occupancy • Passed all State & Federal Audits • Inventoried and revamped evidence room dealing with evidence back to the 80's • Deployed school cameras • Facilitated CERT training and deployed CERT during 4th of July Parade • Supported several community outreach programs in parks, pools, special events, holidays, National Night Out, etc. • Hosted Neighborhood Watch • Received multiple grants with 2019 value over \$100,000 putting Meadows Place PD near 1 million dollars in grants for vests, helmets, car cameras, radios and more.

Mosquitos

Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes outside your home:

- Install or repair and use window and door screens. Do not leave doors propped open.
- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers. Mosquitoes lay eggs near water.
 - Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
 - > For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
 - Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.
- Use an outdoor flying insect spray where mosquitoes rest. Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid areas like under patio furniture, or under the carport or garage. When using insecticides, always follow label instructions.



Here's what you can do to control mosquitoes inside your home:

- Keep windows and doors shut and use air conditioning when possible.
- Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs inside your home. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- Kill mosquitoes inside your home. Use an indoor flying insect fogger* or indoor insect spray* to kill mosquitoes and treat areas where they rest. These products work immediately, but may need to be reapplied. Always follow label directions. Only using insecticide will not keep your home free of mosquitoes.
 - Mosquitoes rest in dark, humid places like under the sink, in closets, under furniture, or in the laundry room.

October 2019 Parks & Recreation



Meadows Place is providing respite for Monarch butterflies enroute to Mexico during their annual migration thanks to the efforts of city officials, CenterPoint, Monarch Gateway and several nonprofit groups.

The city is the first permitted prairie restoration site in power line right of way, according to Barbara Keller-Willy, executive director and founder of Monarch Gateway and president of the Native Prairies Association of Texas.

As a Monarch Host City, Meadows Place is converting 13 acres of ROW to a pollinators' habitat, including milkweed on which Monarchs lay their eggs and caterpillars feed upon before they form a chrysalis.

Representatives of Wildlife Habitat Federation have treated the land for invasive plants and have seeded it with native plants to create a habitat for pollinators. But it's more than that. "It will bring back what we used to have - the animals and plants that existed at one time," said Jim Willis, president of Wildlife Habitat Federation.

The praire land will provide many opportunities for education. Meadows Elementary will use it as a subject source for creative writing, science studies of habitat and life cycle, and in math they will use days of growth and development to create charts and math problems.

Texas ATM students and professors are currently involved in research and development of a low combustible seed mix as well as future data collection from the site. This site will also provide teaching clinics about monarchs, prairies, plant life and pollination.

A grand opening will be scheduled at the new trailhead located directly behind the fieldhouse in McGrath Park on October 5, during the Monarch Madness Festival at 10:00am.
