Did You Know... Jennifer Cabello, our Code Enforcement Official, deals with all kinds of issues on her daily rounds. One of the things she deals with is trees. This year she has had written 115 cases regarding trees. Of those cases, 91 cases have been closed, 16 are still open and 8 cases are going to court. A lot of trees were trimmed or cut down. Not only do we ask our residents to maintain their trees to meet city codes, but the City of Meadows Place maintains ours as well. Last month we had 264 city trees trimmed, lifted, pruned and put into pristine shape. This really improves the looks and values of our homes and our city but it also reduces the likelihood of damage to, or by, the trees.

Did You Know... Last month, EDC President Bob Graf notified City Council that long term resident, Brian Frame, had shown a real interest in being appointed to the EDC Board of Directors. Brian had attended several EDC meetings and had been participating in the discussions. Brian has 4 children and recently moved to his 2nd, bigger, house in Meadows Place. I was shocked to see someone ask if the Police Department was open on Saturday. Someone else had asked if they could contact the city about an after hours water leak. I sometimes forget not everyone understands Meadows Place is basically a 24/7 Full Service city. We provide garbage and recycle pickup, water and sewer services, streets, code enforcement, food inspection, fire, ems and police services. Services may be run directly by the city or sub-contracted to a third party. For contact information please look on the back of this newsletter or the website. In either case, Fire, EMS and Police matters are addressed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Dial 911 or call the PD at 281-983-2900. Anytime – day or night. Thank You.

Project Overview

Thanks to our crackerjack staff, when they announced there were ARPA funds available to cities for specific infrastructure funds, we sprang into action. ARPA is short for American Rescue Plan Act. There was limited funding for specific infrastructure projects so we jumped on it. Kudos to Rod Hainey, Anna-Maria Weston and Rick Staigle who worked tirelessly with our City Administrator, Nick Haby, to get us in a position to request funding. Meadows Place was the very first city to submit funding requests to the County. This was possible because we had just updated our rolling 15 Year Capital Improvement Plan and have experienced staff who knew just what to do and who to talk to at the County to make sure we got all our i's dotted and t's crossed. It was impressive. Council quickly approved special meetings and the requests. The following is a list ARPA approved projects, most of which have to deal with our water wells and waste water treatment plant. I included a couple more so you can see what we are doing: EOC 80kw generator • Water Well 3 - 350kw

generator • WWTP 500kw generator • New Lift Station
Pump + Controller • Water Well #2 Repair (General Fund/ Utility Funds) • WWTP Rehab (ARPA & Utility Funds)
Mobility Bond Project (County, EDC, General Fund)
Dorrance Rehab Phase 2 (EDC/General Fund). This represents millions of dollars of investments which we would not be able to do anytime soon had we not taken advantage of the available funds. It is going to be a very busy year.

Annual Inspections

The City of Meadows Place will start sending out notices that it is time to renew annual home rental registration permits. Failure to register a rental property may result in Municipal Court charges and or termination of water utilities. It is almost time to renew permits for alarm systems, food and fire prevention. Reminder: You cannot rent a home to a registered sex offender within 1000 feet of an area designated as a child safe area.





Important: Please keep your flowerbeds and cracks in concrete free from Grass/Weeds

Ordinances:

91.035 – Nuisance Declared; Duty to Abate.

The most complaints: I received the most complaints in this period on Grass/Weeds in excess of 9 inches.

Your help is needed: Please make sure that when you are having your yard maintained that your lawn crew remembers to tend to the grass and weeds in your flowerbeds and cracks in sidewalks and driveway. That is one thing that you can do to Help keep Meadows Place *Your* Place for *Life*.

During August 12, 2022, thru September 26, 2022, there were a total of **195** violations and **368** inspections completed. The following are the top **5** items that needed the most attention during this period.

Halloween Safety Tips

The Meadows Place Police Department encourages everyone to have a safe Halloween with these Safety Tips

Police Chief Gary Stewart

• Instruct your older children to TAKE FRIENDS when "Trick or Treating."

- Make sure a TRUSTED ADULT, accompanies your younger children when "Trick or Treating." Older children should travel in groups.
- Children should not enter homes without your prior permission.
- Only approach homes that are well-lit both inside and outside.
- Teach your children to NEVER approach a vehicle unless they are accompanied by you
- Make sure your children wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight or glow stick
- Make sure your children are able to see and breathe easily when using facial masks.

- All costumes and masks should be clearly marked as flame resistant.
- Teach your children to always stay in well-lit areas, and never go into isolated areas.
- Teach your children to stay alert for any suspicious incidents and report anything unusual to you and law enforcement.
- Teach your children if anyone tries to grab them to draw attention to themselves and yelling loud as they can: "This person is trying to take me," or "This person is not my father/mother." Teach your children to make every effort to escape by walking, running, or pulling away; yelling; kicking; attracting attention; and otherwise resisting.
- Consider organizing or attending parties at home, in schools, or in community centers as a good alternative to "Trick or Treating."
- Please notify the Meadows Place Police Department immediately of any suspicious or unusual activity (281) 983-2900. *If you see something Say something!*

Public Works



"Water is Life"

Pexas Water Utilities Association has

is an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's *free* to the residents of Meadows Place. If you utilize this program, you will be able to monitor the daily consumption of water use within the household. This is the first place that we review when there is a complaint about higher water usage. The review will indicate if there is a leak and or unusual consumption.

If you are not already signed up to use this free service, please call city hall and sign up.

How much water does the average person use daily/ monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location. The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half. (Drought stricken areas)

More than half of the residents within the city of Meadows Place have a monthly bill that is very close to the minimum monthly usage of 4000 gallons. Residents are in general doing a good job with conservation.

Water usage and water conservation facts.

- 1. According to the EPA, the average household leaks waste 10,000 gallons of water each year.
- 2. Turning off the water when brushing your teeth saves 80% of the amount of water you would normally use.
- 3. Replacing old toilets can save 16,000 gallons of water per year (for a family of 4).
- 4. Washers built before 2011 use approximately 40 gallons per load. New machines could use as little as 15 gallons per load.
- 5. Prefer to utilize the dishwasher rather than hand wash the dishes which uses more water while the tap is left running.

Water is precious, use it but don't waste it. A small leak 1/32" in diameter wastes up to 175 Gallons in 24 hours. A

leak four times that size at 1/8" diameter can waste up to 3600 gallons in 24 hours.

If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the *"Eye on Water"*.

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1. Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2. Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3. Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4. If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5. If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6. If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not runoff water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7. If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

Why does this matter to you?

In October of this year the base water rates will be raised 10% and therefore water will start to cost you, the resident, more monthly. Each year for the next five years the rates will be adjust up to meet the ever-increasing cost of providing the community with clean safe water for your daily use. The revenue from the water and sewer rates, supports the repairs and maintenance of both the water and sewer systems. The water pumping stations, which includes the water wells, Water distribution system, Sanitary sewer collection system, and the Wastewater treatment Plant, are for the most part original equipment. Most of which has come close to the end of the useful life expectance. Maintenance of all the components of the city will be vital to ensure no interruption of service to the residents.

Remember - Keep an *"Eye on Water"* consumption, in your home. To save water and money.



Street Light Repair When calling or emailing about a street light outage, you will need to get the pole number.
