Encourages everyone to have a safe Halloween with these Safety Tips

- Instruct your older children to TAKE FRIENDS when "Trick or Treating."
- Make sure a TRUSTED ADULT, accompanies your younger children when "Trick or Treating." Older children should travel in groups.
- Children should not enter homes without your prior permission.
- Only approach homes that are well-lit both inside and outside.
- Teach your children to NEVER approach a vehicle unless they are accompanied by you
- Make sure your children wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight or glow stick
- Make sure your children are able to see and breathe easily when using facial masks.

- All costumes and masks should be clearly marked as flame resistant.
- Teach your children to always stay in well-lit areas, and never go into isolated areas.
- Teach your children to stay alert for any suspicious incidents and report anything unusual to you and law enforcement.
- Teach your children if anyone tries to grab them to draw attention to themselves and yelling loud as they can: "This person is trying to take me," or "This person is not my father/mother." Teach your children to make every effort to escape by walking, running, or pulling away; yelling; kicking; attracting attention; and otherwise resisting.
- Consider organizing or attending parties at home, in schools, or in community centers as a good alternative to "Trick or Treating."

"Water is Life"

Texas Water Utilities Association has used the above slogan for a number of years. Water is also a commodity and a very valuable resource that we rely on and pay for each month.

"Eye on Water" is an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's free to the residents of Meadows Place. If you utilize this program, you will be able to monitor the daily consumption of water use within the household. This is the first place that we review when there is a complaint about higher water usage. The review will indicate if there is a leak and or unusual consumption.

If you are not already signed up to use this free service, please call city hall and sign up.

How much water does the average person use daily/ monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location.

The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half. (Drought stricken areas)

More than half of the residents within the city of Meadows Place have a monthly bill that is very close to the minimum monthly usage of 4000 gallons. Residents are in general doing a good job with conservation.

Water usage and water conservation facts.

- 1) According to the EPA, the average household leaks waste 10,000 gallons of water each year.
- 2) Turning off the water when brushing your teeth saves 80% of the amount of water you would normally use.
- 3) Replacing old toilets can save 16,000 gallons of water per year (for a family of 4).
- 4) Washers built before 2011 use approximately 40 gallons per load. New machines could use as little as 15 gallons per load.
- 5) Prefer to utilize the dishwasher rather than hand wash the dishes which uses more water while the tap is left running.

Water is precious, use it but don't waste it. A small leak 1/32" in diameter wastes up to 175 Gallons in 24 hours. A leak four times that size at 1/8" diameter can waste up to 3600 gallons in 24 hours.

If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the "Eye on Water".

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1) Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2) Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3) Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4) If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5) If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6) If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7) If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

Why does this matter to you?

In October of this year the base water rates will be raised 10% again, the same as last year and therefore water will cost, the resident, more monthly. Each year for the next five years the rates will be adjust up to meet the ever-increasing cost of providing the community with clean safe water for your daily use. The revenue from the water and sewer rates, supports the repairs and maintenance of both the water and sewer systems. The water pumping stations, which includes the water wells, Water distribution system, Sanitary sewer collection system, and the Wastewater treatment Plant, are for the most part original equipment. Most of which has come close to the end of the useful life expectance. Maintenance of all the components of the city will be vital to ensure no interruption of service to the residents.

Remember - Keep an "Eye on Water" consumption, in your home. To save water and money.



Drought and your plant life.



The most complaints I received this past month were on Dead landscaping/trees.

If you have dying plant life and want to know if there is anything to be done to save it. You may contact Fort Bend-Texas A&M AgriLife by going to their website: https://fortbend.agrilife.org/Scroll to the Ask Extension section and fill out the form and include photos.

If you can take a full plant photo and then a close up of the leaves this will help them identify your plant life and to better help them answer your questions. You may also call them at 281-342-3034. Remember this is a free service for Fort Bend County Residents.

When addressing dead Plants/Trees the standard period to come into compliance is 30 days. If you do contact Fort Bend – Texas A&M AgriLife and they suggest something that can be done to help save your specific plant life, email me the response and I will help you to extend the inspection date if need be.

If the AgriLife Horticulturalists suggest that it does need to be removed, then please do so by the comply-by date. As always, I am here to help. I am an email or phone call away.

During August 16, 2023, through September 14, 2023, there were a total of **136** Violations, **218** Notices issued, and **283** inspections completed. The following are the top **6** items that needed the most attention during this period.

Still no break from the unrelenting heat! Our trees, shrubs, and plant beds are looking wilted and brown.DO NOT prune as they are all too stressed to survive any wounds or cuts. DO NOT fertilize during this heat wave either, wait until late fall.



If you happen to have any of the non-native Tropical Milkweed, these have the orange or yellow flowers, you will need to cut these back in October. This will ensure that the migrating Monarchs will keep moving south to their winter home.

Native Milkweed will naturally die back in the fall, but don't uproot, as they will return in the spring for the Monarchs journey north.

Don't forget to water your foundation. The ground is so dry it could lead to some serious foundation issues.






Girls Flag Football (NEW)






