#### Administrative Changes at City Hall

Thanks to our hard working staff, Meadows Place is finally about to change banks. In August I wrote that The City of Meadows Place had published a Request For Application (RFA) hoping to hear back from some new financial institutions. Thankfully we did, but I was surprised to learn how difficult it was to change banks. There is a lot red tape and detail to be worked out before a city can seek a new financial institution. Financial Director Anna-Maria Weston worked very hard with our City Secretary, Courtney Rutherford, to present multiple proposals to your City Council. Last month Council approved the Mayor and City Secretary to enter into to an agreement with a new bank. This should be completed this month. Transferring all the funds is one thing, but making sure all the accounts and all payroll functions are transferred properly will be a major undertaking for our little city. I am confident that the staff is more than ready to take on this task. This transition will let us move forward with other plans to streamline operations and save the city quite a bit of money every year. As with all things, it will be worth the effort.

#### **Changes in Utility Bill**

You will notice two primary changes in your utility bill. First, due to rising costs, our base rates for both our Water and Sewer bills have gone up a dollar per month. This still does not cover costs or the increase in Subsidence District Fees so Council will be evaluating rates early next year. We have also moved to a more accurate meter reading system this month. Basically we changed the bill to reflect more closely our actual usage and eliminated the 'rounding' that was used back when the water bills were read and inputted by hand. It will make our utility bills easier to read, track, and figure out.

#### **Changes in Contact Information**

From time to time the city has needed to reach out to a resident to alert them to something, like a broken water pipe inside the house. This used to be easy. We knew your number and could call you. Times have changed and many don't even have a "land line". Still, the city may still want to touch base with you.. Please let us know if your phone number has changed. Just call City Hall. It is voluntary of course, but helpful. Also, please sign up for CodeRed Emergency Notification System. It's easy. Thank You.

#### Solicitors and Peddlers City Ordinance

The Meadows Place Police Department receives many calls in reference to person(s) going door to door for various reasons (soliciting/

peddling). The City of Meadows Place has an ordinance regulating this type of activity. The following is a brief summary of the ordinance. Permits are issued by the City of Meadows Place permits division at City Hall. Permits are issued on a case by case basis not to exceed a three month period. Questions about permits should be directed to the Permits Division at city hall. For concerns about a solicitor/ peddler, contact the police department.

Soliciting/peddling in the city limits of Meadows Place is allowed under certain circumstances. A permit issued by the City of Meadows Place is required in most cases; noncommercial is an exception to the rule. Each solicitor/ peddler is to have in their possession and ready to display when requested a City of Meadows Place issued permit to solicit/peddle. Solicitors/peddlers, who have a valid permit are allowed to operate from one-half hour after sun rise to one half-hour before sunset.

Some examples of Solicitors/Peddlers:

- Someone knocking on the door selling for Comcast, AT&T, or other sales.
- Mobile vendors such as a food or ice cream truck in the neighborhood

In closing, the property owner has the right to specify "No Solicitation", posted on the front of their premise. This makes it a violation for any person to enter upon the premise may be soliciting or peddling. Please contact the Meadows Place Police Department if you see someone who may be a solicitor or other suspicious person in the neighborhood.





#### Infrastructure Update



The City of Meadows Place has completed another fiscal budget year, as many of you know the City's budget begins on October 1st and ends September 30th, of every year.

I wanted to take this opportunity to give the community a report on what the Public Works

Department accomplished in the budget year of 2016 - 17. First, I would like to thank Mayor Jessup IV, and our City Council for their continued support of our department, without their support these projects could not have been completed.

In January 2016 City Council approved and Interlocal Agreement between the City of Meadows place and Fort Bend County that enabled the city to place an asphalt overlay on Dorrance Ln. The cost of the overlay project was \$34, 666.02. Per the agreement the City only paid for the cost of the asphalt. Fort Bend County absorbed the cost of equipment and labor.


Public Works address 30 water ponding sites last fiscal year at a total cost last year of \$31, 941.48. Water ponding issues will continue to be addressed and are a top priority for our department. We are currently in Phase 3 of this program with a Phase 4 soon to follow.

There were 9 handicap ramps installed to allow for better access to sidewalks in our community. The cost for handicap ramp installation was \$26,000. Storm drainage inlet repairs were also on our repair list and we repaired 10 drainage inlets at a cost of \$22,675.00

Our department spent over \$78,000 in repairs its wastewater treatment plant. Major repairs included a sludge pump overhaul, installation of new recycle non-potable water piping, lift pump repairs, and motor rebuilds. All the repairs were to essential equipment that are needed to treat our wastewater.

Water Plant repairs included a booster pump motor repair at water plant #2 on Dorrance Ln., and we painted our water tank and buildings at water plant #3 on W. Airport. Water plant repairs cost were \$67,703.

As you can see we've had a busy year and our department is constantly looking for ways to improve our infrastructure while operating within the framework of our budget. Our department will continue to identify areas of the City that need improvement. Streets, water plants, wastewater treatment, and building maintenance are essential and require yearly monitoring. We will do our best to continue to improve our infrastructure and look forward to seeing more improvements in the future.




