Yes, you need a Permit from the City

I just put in a new irrigation system and I had my contractor pull a permit from the city BEFORE the job was started. Yes, you need a permit from the City for things like Roofs, Driveways, New Construction, Additions, Remodels, Foundation Work, Swimming Pools, Roofs and more. The process of issuing a building permit may seem complex if you are not familiar with it but your contractor is-or should be! If you do not get a permit your job will be shut down and there may be penalties involved. A big part of the permitting process involves inspections. My project had to be inspected before the project was approved. The job progressed smoothly, unlike the jobs which get shut down because they don't pull a permit. Call our Permits Department BEFORE you start a project to see whether or not you need to have a permit pulled. It will save you time, money and lots of aggravation. Thank You.

Did You Know...Kirkwood Meadows Place received 8 bids on the Kirkwood project- which is a very good number. Bids ranged from \$3.4 to \$4.3 million with several bids very close - less than one percent difference. HDR Engineering went through the bid to make sure all the bid items were covered, with no mathematical errors, etc. Mar-Con construction was the successful bidder and Council unanimously approved the Mayor and City Secretary to sign the contract. We expect to start around the first of the year as bonds, insurance and a time line are put together. A public information meeting will soon be called to answer all your questions. Please attend.


Texas Municipal League

Meadows Place Parks and Recreation has many ways for you to get out, get active, and get involved. Stay current with the latest program and event information by checking the city website, Facebook and monthly newsletter.



Meadows Place will provide a respite for Monarch butterflies enroute to Mexico during their annual migration thanks to the efforts of city officials and nonprofit groups.

The city is the first permitted prairie restoration site in power line right of way, according to Barbara Keller-Willy, executive director and founder of Monarch Gateway and president of the Native Prairies Association of Texas.

As a Monarch Host City, Meadows Place is converting 13 acres of ROW to a pollinators' habitat, including milkweed, on which Monarchs lay their eggs and on which caterpillars feed before they form a chrysalis.

Representatives of Wildlife Habitat Federation have treated the land for invasive plants and will begin to seed native plants within the first two weeks of November to create a habitat for pollinators. But it's more than that. "It will bring back what we used to

have - the animals and plants that existed at one time," said Jim Willis, president of Wildlife Habitat Federation.

The praire land will provide many opportunities for education. Meadows Elementary will use it as a subject source for creative writing, science studies of habitat and life cycle, and in math they will use days of growth and development to create charts and math problems.

Texas ATM students and professors are currently involved in research and development of a low combustible seed mix as well as future data collection from the site. This site will also provide teaching clinics about monarchs, prairies, plant life and pollination.

A grand opening will be scheduled at the new trailhead located directly behind the fieldhouse in McGrath Park. Date and time to be determined.
