On-Demand Inspections

I am pleased to announce that Meadows Place is once again using innovation and technology to better serve our community. We have partnered with BBG Consulting to offer a new On-demand virtual inspection process. In other words, a virtual inspection using a mobile device. This is designed to provide a more convenient yet safe and reliable inspection service. On-demand inspections are exactly as they sound, on-demand. When a contractor has completed a project they simply call the On-demand inspection number - all while still on-site. The dispatcher will verify the permit and notify a credentialed and licensed inspector who will then perform the inspection via video call utilizing apps installed on the phone. This streamlines the communication between installer and the building inspector and allows the contractor to move through the process much more quickly without having to wait or return. Any corrections that need to be made can be made on-site and re-inspected the in same day. This ensures a safer installation and in less time than traditional methods.

Grand Kid Scam

Scam artists will use any leverage they can get to separate you from your money. Sadly, that includes exploiting grandparents' love and concern for their grandchildren, giving rise to a breed of impostor fraud specifically targeting older Americans.

Grandparent scams typically work something like this: The victim gets a call from someone posing as his or her grandchild. This person explains, in a frantic-sounding voice, that he or she is in trouble: There's been an accident, or an arrest, or a robbery. To up the drama and urgency, the caller might claim to be hospitalized or stuck in a foreign country; to make the impersonation more convincing, he or she will throw in a few family particulars gleaned from the actual grandchild's social media activity.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they're not. They can be convincing: sometimes using information from social networking sites, or hacking into your loved one's email account, to make it seem more real. And they'll pressure you to send money before you have time to think. They may even tell you to keep it secret.

Here's what you can do:

DO's

- Stop. Check it out. Look up your grandkid's phone number yourself or call another family member.
- Pass this information on to a friend. You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are you know someone who will get one — if they haven't already.
- Do set the privacy settings on your social media accounts so that only people you know can access your posts and photos.

- Scammers search Facebook, Instagram, and other social networks for family information they can use to fool you.
- Do hang up immediately and call the grandchild or other family member in question, on a known number, to make sure they're safe. With luck, they'll answer, and you'll know the supposed emergency call is a scam.
- Do contact other family members or friends if you have any concerns that the emergency could be real. Scammers plead with you to keep the situation a secret precisely, so you won't try to confirm it.
- If you speak to someone who claims to be a police officer, do call the relevant law enforcement agency to verify the person's identity and any information given to you.
- Do trust your instincts. As the American Bar Association advises, if something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.
- Do call the Meadows Place Police Department (281) 983-2900

DON'T's:

- Don't drop your guard because the number on your caller ID looks familiar. Scammers can use technological tricks to make it appear that they're calling from a trusted number
- Don't volunteer information scammers fish for facts they can use to make the impersonation believable.
- Don't let a caller rush you into making a decision.
- Don't send cash, wire money, or provide numbers from gift or cash-reload cards to a person claiming to be a grandchild
- Don't panic; the Meadows Place Police Department is here to help. (281) 983-2900

Preparing for the Potential of Cold Weather Winter 2021

In the greater Houston area, the weather changes constantly and we can easily find ourselves unprepared to deal with a sudden swing in the weather. Right now, it is relatively

warm but being prepared for colder weather is a must.

Here are a few situations we should be ready to deal with and anticipate.

- 1. Be prepared to bring in pets pets should never be left out in the cold for extended periods of time. Pets can get frostbite on their ear tips, noses, tails and paws. Make sure your pets have a warm place to sleep. As a pet owner I understand the need for prior planning when it comes to our pets.
- 2. Before the hardware stores run out of freeze wrap for your outside pipes and faucets pipes, pre-purchase the material. All external fixtures should be wrapped to protect against possible freezing and cracking. Water pipe failures can lead to high water bills, and expensive plumbing repairs. Be sure to take precautions and wrap your pipes!
- 3. Protect your plants be sure to place a cloth or plastic over your

- plants to protect them from wind chills and icy weather. Most plants that are not tropical, will survive if precautions are taken.
- 4. People if you have to go out in cold and freezing weather be sure to avoid hazardous conditions. Stay off of icy roads and bridges if you have to be on the road. Watch for ice on sidewalks (walk carefully), driveways, and streets. Dress appropriately! The good news is that in the Greater Houston area the cold weather does not last very long.
- 5. Service your heater/furnace before the cooler weather hits. Reverse the rotation of the ceiling fans when the heat is running.

Remember to check on the elderly and those who may have functional needs, or access needs, to make sure that they have sufficient warmth to get them through the cold weather. Also, if you, or someone you know, uses space heaters or a fireplace, make sure there is at least 3 feet of empty space around them while they are being operated. Chimneys should be cleaned at least once a year if the fireplace is utilized frequently.

If you do experience a broken water pipe or need assistance in turning your water off, please call USW at 832-756-2143. This is a 24-hour service call number.

Being prepared will help you survive the Meadows Place winter weather.

I would like to thank a couple of our corporate neighbors, Sugar Grove Church of Christ & Helfman Ford for so quickly ensuring the proper 16'-0" tree clearance over the street. Thank you for all you do to help keep The Meadows Place, Your Place for Life.

I AM THANKFUL for all the residents and people who work in The Meadows Place. You share with me on a consistent basis understanding, kindness, a laugh, a wave, or smile. You all make working here a great place to be. Thank you.

I am requesting consistent help from you all with unkempt pools, tree clearances, and picking up after your pets when they defecate on another's property.

I have had quite a few phone-in complaints these past few weeks about pet owners walking their dogs and allowing them to defecate on another's property and not picking up their mess. Note: without photo evidence of the person with pet and act, or myself seeing the violation, it cannot be addressed.

Besides being disrespectful, leaving poop is a health concern. Dog feces is a serious hazard because they may contain microorganisms that are both pathogenic to humans and resistant to several classes of antibiotics.

Human diseases transmitted by Dog Poop *From Bacteria*:

Campylobacteriosis, E. Coli, Salmonellosis, Yersiniosis *From Parasites:*

Cyclospora, Roundworm, Tapeworms, and from cat poop - Toxoplasmosis.

Animal Defecation Ordinance:

90.03 (A) - It shall be unlawful for the owner or person in control of an animal to allow such animal to defecate on any public property, including any right-of-way, or private property, other than that of the owner of the animal. If the animal was at large at the time it defecated on any property, then that shall constitute prima facie evidence that the owner or person in control of the animal allowed the animal to so act. (B) It shall be a defense to prosecution

under this section that the owner or person in control of the animal immediately removed and cleaned up such animal's feces from the public or private property. (Ord. 2016-28, passed 10-25-2016)

Resolution:

IMMEDIATLEY PICK UP after your pets when they defecate on any property that is not your own. Failure to do so will result in a CITATION being issued to the owner/person walking the pet.

Be a good neighbor and pick up after your pets. Doing so will let the community know you care about our health and to keep The Meadows Place, *Your Place for Life*.

During this period there were a total of 76 violations, 100 Notices issued, and 166 Inspections completed. If you have any questions about a Notice of Violation, please let me know before the due date listed. I am always here to help you.







Update Regarding Mail Issues

From Alderman Mertins

I just wanted you to know that I'm still working on the Meadows Place mail issues. It is a work in progress, and you can still help by raising awareness of this issue.

First, let me say thanks to those who have responded and shared the issues you have had with late, lost, or misdelivered mail. In additional to delivery issues, we're a city without our own Post Office, so we're asking to have a Blue Box (drop-box) reinstalled. It will most likely be located at City Hall. This location provides security with proper lighting along with the ability to be monitored and is adjacent to the Meadows Police Department entrance so it will be easily visible as the officers pass by to insure for extra security.

I have been in communication with Mo Nehad, the Community Outreach Coordinator for Congressman Troy Nehls. The attached link to the Congressman's Digital Privacy Release Form is the next step for residents to use to make the Congressman aware of your issues. I've been told that each resident's form submission helps strengthen our request, so I'm asking for your help in filling out and submitting this form.

I have personally filled out this form and although it asks for sensitive information, it is hidden from display, and only used by the congressman's office for verifying continuants in his district. If you're concerned, I can send you a PDF version of my submitted form so you can see that the sensitive information is hidden.

The information in the form is not used by the city or other government entities, it is just for the Congressman's office.

- 1. On the form, please enter your address and then for *Agency involved* please use the drop box and select "United States Postal Service".
- 2. Next enter your personal information (you will see some of it is hidden as you type)
- 3. The next box asks, "Have you contacted any other elected official regarding this case?"
 - a. Select Yes and add my name if you choose to fill this part out as it's not required.
- 4. Next step is a box asking you to: "Please explain the problem and the resolution/outcome you are seeking" In the comment box, please add: "Issues with late, lost, or misdelivered mail" and "Outcome desired- seeking improved service."

In addition, please add in the comment section: "Blue Box (drop-box) was removed." and "Outcome desired-reinstall Blue Box."

Implementation of First-Class Mail and Periodicals service standard changes – October 1, 2021 On October 1, the Postal Service will implement new service standards for First-Class Mail and Periodicals which will increase delivery reliability, consistency, and efficiency for our customers and across our network.

Most First-Class Mail and Periodicals will be unaffected by the new service standard changes. Standards for single-piece First-Class Mail traveling within a local area will continue to be two days. Mail traveling the greatest distances will be most affected, with a day or two of transit time added for some First-Class Mail and Periodicals. We'll make better use of our trucks and existing surface network to move the mail, relying less on costly air transportation.

By improving service reliability and increasing efficiency, we can keep costs at reasonable levels and help keep postage rates affordable for our customers.


