Operation Sapphire

On October 24th, the Fort Bend County District Attorney's Office held a press conference announcing the results of Operation Sapphire, a multi-jurisdictional, multi-agency, human trafficking and victim recovery operation conducted back in September. The City of Meadows Place EOC was the hub of the operation and several of our officers participated in

this very intense regional operation.

Chief Stewart was invited to participate in the Press Release as District Attorney, Brian Middleton, announced the conclusion of the operation in which nine traffickers were identified, and 17 victims — including 15 adult women, 1 adult man and 1 juvenile girl were rescued. Thirty-one charges were filed, including Compelling, Promoting, and Soliciting Prostitution charges, Trafficking of a Person, and gun or drug-related charges. Thank You, Chief.

I was quite proud to have the DA single out and mention the Meadows Place Mayor and Police Chief from the podium. Meadows Place has long been active in both political and police actions around the County but thanks to our Communications Director we are now being made aware of more and more of the positive actions in which we are participating. If you have not seen the press release, thanks to Cameron Miller, you can now view it from both the city website and the official City of Meadows Place Facebook Page. Interlocal arrangements s with other cities and agencies help expand our capabilities, keep us safer, get more done and help make sure we will always be able to keep Meadows Place... Your Place for Life!

Did You Know... Driveways Under Scrutiny

Your City Council spent quite a bit of time last Council Meeting discussing whether or not to update our Code of Ordinance regarding driveways and driveway upkeep. Everyone was a bit surprised to find out there had been 82 permits issued in the last fiscal year (Sept.1-Sept 31) regarding driveways. This included both panel repair and complete replacements. There were only 25 Code Violations issued which means our homeowners are initiating the vast majority of those driveway repairs and replacements on their own! Eighty-two is quite a few and is indicative of a city that is making sure its future is bright and not a city eaten up with blight. Meadows Place has always set its standards high and worked hard to make sure those goals are met. This is just another example.



It will in all likelihood end up in court and your estate will be distributed according to State Law – not according to your wishes! The City deals with this from time to time and it usually gets costly and can drag on forever. One case, and this is not atypical, took over 6 years to clear when it could have taken months if there had been a Will. The house could not be sold, expenses continued and the City often had to get involved keeping the yard up, trying to find family members, tracking down lawyers, etc. That case got my wife and I to update ours because we didn't want to leave such a mess for our kids. Even if you don't have a big or complicated estate, to simplify the disbursement and keep it out of the courts, it is best to have a Will. Do You?

Situs Addresses

In 2013 a major breakthrough took place for the City of Meadows Place. The Fort Bend Central Appraisals District

(CAD), changed all the situs addresses - to indicate actual street location of the property to now be in Meadows Place, instead of Stafford. It has allowed us to promote our own city and help get businesses and young professional families to move here. However, many mailing addresses still say Stafford. Please check the CAD records to make sure the mailing address is correct. It is a simple process to change the mailing address but it must be requested by the homeowner. I hope each of you will take the few minutes to check it. It is a very simple process to change if you need to. All you have to do is fax your request, along with your address and signature, to the CAD, fax # is 281-782-9666. If you do not have a fax, please feel free to bring your request to City Hall and we will fax it for you. Now open 8:30 to 4:30.

Preparing for the Potential of Cold Weather - Winter 2022

In the greater Houston area, the weather changes constantly and we can easily find ourselves unprepared to deal with a sudden swing in the weather. Right now, it is relatively warm but being prepared for

colder weather is a must.

Here are a few situations we should be ready to deal with and anticipate. Being prepared will save time and money in the future.

- Be prepared to bring in pets pets should never be left out in the cold for extended periods of time. Pets can get frostbite on their ear tips, noses, tails and paws. Make sure your pets have a warm place to sleep. As a pet owner I understand the need for prior planning when it comes to our pets.
- 2. Before the hardware stores run out of freeze wrap for your outside pipes and faucets pipes, pre-purchase the material. All external fixtures should be wrapped to protect against possible freezing and cracking. Water pipe failures can lead to high water bills, and expensive plumbing repairs. Be sure to take precautions and wrap your pipes! Make sure that the main shut off valve for the water supply on the outside of the building is accessible and will operate properly. The city personnel will operate the Curb stop valve by the meter. Turning this valve, the wrong will break the brass top. (Very expensive to replace)

- 3. Protect your plants be sure to place a cloth or plastic over your plants to protect them from wind chills and icy weather. Most plants that are not tropical, will survive if precautions are taken.
- 4. People if you have to go out in cold and freezing weather be sure to avoid hazardous conditions. Stay off of icy roads and bridges if you have to be on the road. Watch for ice on sidewalks (walk carefully), driveways, and streets. Dress appropriately! The good news is that in the Greater Houston area the cold weather does not last very long.
- 5. Service your heater/furnace before the cooler weather hits. Again, do this before the cold weather hits and all the HVAC businesses are busy. Reverse the rotation of the ceiling fans when the heat is running.

Remember to check on the elderly and those who may have functional needs, or access needs, to make sure that they have sufficient warmth to get them through the cold weather. Also, if you, or someone you know, uses space heaters or a fireplace, make sure there is at least 3 feet of empty space around them while they are being operated. Chimneys should be cleaned at least once a year if the fireplace is utilized frequently.

If you do experience a broken water pipe or need assistance in turning your water off, please call USW at 832-756-2143. This is a 24-hour service call number.

This Holiday Season: Be Aware and Be Safe

The Meadows Place Police Department reminds everyone: "Bad Guys" are shopping for the holidays too; they are looking for opportunities to strike and take advantage for the Holiday Season. Now more than ever is the

time to be conscious of your surroundings and protective of your wares. Whether you are traveling out of town, just out for the evening, or shopping by yourself or with children, below are a few precautions to help make your holidays a safer one.

If you are traveling:

- Put an automatic timer on your lights
- · Ask a neighbor to check up on your home
- Don't forget to have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department and request a House Watch

If you are out of the house:

- Turn on lights and music or the TV so it looks as if someone is home
- Be sure that your doors and windows are locked
- Don't display your gifts where they can be seen from the outside
- If you plan to have packages delivered to your home, make sure you are home to accept them. If not, ask a neighbor or have the package be held at the nearest holding facility

If you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you
- · Park in a well-lit space
- Be sure to lock your car, close windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a credit card whenever possible
- Don't overburden yourself with packages

- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Carry a purse close to your body in the front. If you are carrying a wallet, place it in an inside coat or front pants pocket
- If shopping with kids, have a plan in case you get separated. For the older children, have a central meeting spot designated. For the younger children teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated. Be sure they know your name (not just mommy and daddy), cell phone number, and their address. Go over the dangers of strangers with them so they know who not to talk to or follow
- Check receipts to see whether your full credit card number appears. If a receipt has your full number on it, take a pen and thoroughly scratch it out
- Double check that you have your credit cards and check book after you pay for your items

By following these tips, you may reduce your stress during the Holiday Season

On every Storm Drain there is a badge like this one. See one near you!

Ordinances:

51.15 – Rule Prohibiting Discharges into Storm Sewers

The most complaints received: I received the most complaints in this period on Tree Clearances.

Your help is needed: Please make sure that you provide for your trees and landscaping a minimum clearance over the public sidewalk of 10 feet from sidewalk surface to lowest limb, and over the street 16 feet minimum of clearance from the street surface to the lowest limb. Your help makes a difference in keeping Meadows Place *Your Place for Life*.

During September 27, 2022, thru October 14, 2022, there were a total of 113 violations, 166 Notices issued, and 259 inspections completed. The following are the top 5 items that needed the most attention during this period.
