Call us. Anytime.

Did You Know... the City has put several options for you to ask the Mayor, Council or the City questions. In addition to the 'Ask a Question' button on the website, there is the official City of Meadows Place Facebook Page. Asking questions in other areas or on one of the many gab, gossip and garbage pages may not get you the complete or correct answer. Oh, and you can always call.

Did You Know... we had a leaning power pole over by the Fire Station so we contacted David Flowers and Dominick Robinson at CenterPoint. It was a good call because they had it fixed in a day. Thank you for the quick response CenterPoint.

Did You Know... Permits Clerk Angie Hernandez has been working with new Code Enforcement Official Jennifer Cabello and Rick Staigle to make sure all Driveway Permits are consistent and have good drawings for the contractors and for our inspectors. They are available to you so be sure you have a permit if you are redoing or repairing your driveway. Call Angie if you have any questions.

Did You Know... that at the last Council Meeting, Alderman – and parent – Kurt Kopczynski told Parks Director Colene Cabezas that he has already met families from Stafford, Sugar Land, Missouri City and Houston at our new Helfman All Play Playground. That is great, and Meadows Place is glad to share with our neighbors.

This is just another step in increasing our ability to more thoroughly communicate and disseminate information through multiple sources. You asked for increased communication, and you got it. Meadows Place began with a marquee, then a short message on the water bill, a newsletter, a website with an Ask us a Question button, CodeRed, an official City of Meadows Place Facebook Page, posting of regular information videos and now, Instagram. As technologies change, Meadows Place will continue to embrace them to enhance our ability to reach out to our residents. Latest construction projections have the roadway portion finished in three to four weeks - weather permitting. That puts it near the end of the year. However, there was a delay in getting the street lighting in from CenterPoint. That delay has been extended yet another month to sometime in late February. This affects the irrigation and landscaping which will go in after the street lighting is complete. Yes, we can get some work done simultaneously, and will, but like everyone else, we can't wait for the construction to end.

Interesting thing, the day after Thanksgiving Channel 2 News ran an article asking: What are the driver rules for roundabouts. This was their response:

According to the Texas Department of Transportation, a roundabout is a one-way, circular intersection where traffic flows around an island. Drivers follow yield signs instead of traffic lights to control to intersection. Guidelines from TxDOT as drivers approach roundabouts:

Slow down * Yield to traffic already in the circle * Enter the circle and follow the loop in a counter clockwise direction * Make a right turn to exit the roundabout.

According to TxDOT the benefits include reducing crashes, commute times and air pollution, while creating a safer intersections.

Ours will be open soon and in addition to all those benefits, our new S. Kirkwood thoroughfare will look beautiful and quickly distinguish Meadows Place from Alief/Houston. I can't wait!

Special Meeting – City Administrator

EDC Director Tia Baker and EDC President Bob Graf joined your City Council at a Special Saturday Meeting and Workshop last month. Several long term issues were discussed, analyzed and prioritized. These included paying off our bonds, long term infrastructure options, pay as you go verses bond issuance, General Law vs Home Rule and selection of a full time City Administrator. Special Thanks to Rick Staigle, Bob Graf, Steve Bezner and City Secretary Courtney Rutherford for the extra effort they put in on what may be a fundamental shift in how Meadows Place is governed. I will keep you posted as this develops.





This Holiday Season: Be Aware and Be Safe

The Meadows Place Police Department reminds everyone: "Bad Guys" are shopping for the holidays too; they are looking for opportunities to strike and take advantage for the Holiday Season. Now more than ever is the time to be conscious of your surroundings and protective of your wares. Whether you are traveling out of town, just out for the evening, or shopping by yourself or with children, below are a few precautions to help make your holidays a safer one.

If you are traveling:

- Put an automatic timer on your lights
- Ask a neighbor to check up on your home
- Don't forget to have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department and request a House Watch

If you are out of the house:

- Turn on lights and music or the TV so it looks as if someone is home
- · Be sure that your doors and windows are locked
- Don't display your gifts where they can be seen from the outside

• If you plan to have packages delivered to your home, make sure you are home to accept them. If not, ask a neighbor or have the package be held at the nearest holding facility

If you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you
- Park in a well-lit space
- Be sure to lock your car, close windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a credit card whenever possible
- Don't overburden yourself with packages
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Carry a purse close to your body in the front. If you are carrying a wallet, place it in an inside coat or front pants pocket
- If shopping with kids, have a plan in case you get separated. For the older children, have a central meeting spot designated. For the younger children teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated. Be sure they know your name (not just mommy and daddy), cell phone number, and their address. Go over the dangers of strangers with them so they know who not to talk to or follow
- Check receipts to see whether your full credit card number appears. If a receipt has your full number on it, take a pen and thoroughly scratch it out
- Double check that you have your credit cards and check book after you pay for your items

By following these tips, you may reduce your stress during the Holiday Season

Saving Water Indoors

Here are some easy ways to reduce the amount of water you may use and save money at the same time. Saving water inside your home is easier than you think. In addition to saving money on your utility bill, water conservation reinforces our community's quality of life by ensuring availability of this precious resource.

- Repair or replace dripping faucets and waterlines that leak.
- Wash vegetables and fruits in a bowl or basin using a vegetable brush instead of letting the water run
- Replace low flow and water saving appliances when replacing washing machines, dishwashers, toilets, and faucets.
- Replace showerheads with a more efficient low flow model. A new shower head can save up to 6 gallons of water per minute.
- Don't use running water to thaw meat or other frozen foods. Defrost food overnight in the refrigerator or use the defrost setting on your microwave
- Check all toilets in the house for leaks twice a year and repair if it is leaking.
- Turn off the water while you brush your teeth and save four gallons a minute. That's 200 gallons a week for a family of four.
- When washing dishes by hand, use a sink full of soapy water. Don't let the water run continuously.
- Run the dishwasher only when fully loaded.

A few small changes in your daily routine can have a big impact on the amount of money left in your pocket after the arrival of your water bill.

Where: At the power easement on Monticeto between Amblewood and Meadow Trail across from the Meadows Place Waste Water Treatment Plant.


Why: Public Works Department will recycle the trees to






