Bond Elections

Last month voters approved Fort Bend County Mobility Bond. The mobility bond got approval from 65% of voters and according to county officials, the passage of the bond will not result in a tax rate increase. The bond package contains \$712.6 million of projects to address infrastructure needs. Part

of that package includes \$3 million dollars for road reconstruction projects in Meadows Place. Specifically, another section of Dorrance from S. Kirkwood to Amblewood. This includes upgrades to roadway, sidewalk, water line and storm sewer. It also includes adjacent driveway improvements. Dorrance is our busiest and costliest internal street to repair and as it continues to age, requires more and more maintenance and repair. Your Council and Public Works Department have a long term plan to revitalize Dorrance which will mean improved transportation for us when finished and free up funding for our other streets. Note- this is a long term project but we are working to beginning things like design and engineering as early as next year.

Meadows Place was not part of the 2023 Parks Bond but hopefully you will see some new trails, a new bridge over Meadows Place Bayou and a parking lot over by the Emergency Operations and Training Center, much of which was funded by a previous Fort Bend County Bond. Most of this timetable is determined by CenterPoint Energy as we will be using or abutting their right of way. I am hoping to see something concrete next year.

Did You Know... Last month I had a chance to visit with Kermit and Jeanne. They are the last original owners on the street where they have lived since July 1972. 1972! Kermit remodeled a number of years ago, knocked out a wall, put up some beautiful decorative pillars, opened up the whole front of the house and made it a showpiece inside. It is beautiful and a precursor to all the remodeling going on today. Meadows Place has had 34 people apply for permits for Additions / Renovations and had 35 last year. This shows people are consistently investing in their homes, like Kermit and Jeanne did, and have been for years. Investing in the city proper and personally is good.

Trash Pickup/Recycling

Meadows Place contracts with Texas Pride Disposal to pickup our Household Trash and Recycling. With the holidays coming up, and with all the dead trees and shrubs being removed, I want to remind everyone that Texas Pride will collect residential refuse, tree and yard waste placed at the curbside in containers, bags or bundles not weighing over 50 pounds.

Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be bundled in lengths no greater than 4 feet, not to exceed 50 pounds. The bundling is required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the crushing process. Winter in the South, Meadows Place Style.

Winter in this area is not your traditional Snow and Ice but more of a raining and cooler temperatures season. During the summer we irrigate

on a regular basis and usually follow schedule of three to four times a week. This ensures that we have adequate watering during the hottest part of the year. As the temperature drops the need for a high level of watering is eliminated. Therefore, the sprinkler system controller and settings should be reviewed and modified to accommodate the change in temperature. Reset the frequency to once a week or turn the system off until the weather warms up. And or the grass starts to green up and grow again. The benefits are not overwatering and drowning your plants but also will save on the water bill. This is a great water conservation plan.

For those that have a real Christmas tree, Public Works will again be recycling the trees and hauling them to Surfside to be part of the sand dune stabilization program. See the Flyer on the first page of the newsletter for the details.

Last month the discussion revolved around being prepared. Dealing with pets, potential frozen pipes, plant protection and Furnace service. Hopefully these items have been addressed but there is still time since the colder weather has not hit the area yet. But colder weather will be in the weather forecast.

Better to be prepared and prevent any inconvenience the cooler weather will cause.

Remember to check on the elderly and those who may have functional needs, or access needs, to make sure that they have sufficient warmth to get them through the cold weather. Also, if you, or someone you know, uses space heaters or a fireplace, make sure there is at least 3 feet of empty space around them while they are being operated. Chimneys should be cleaned at least once a year if the fireplace is utilized frequently.

This Holiday Season: Be Aware and Be Safe

The Meadows Place Police Department reminds everyone: "Bad Guys" are shopping for the holidays too; they are looking for opportunities to strike and take advantage of the Holiday Season. Now, more than ever is

the time to be conscious of your surroundings and protective of your belongings. Whether traveling out of town, just out for the evening, or shopping by yourself or with children, below are a few precautions to help make your holidays safer.

If you are traveling:

- Put an automatic timer on your lights; Ask a neighbor to check up on your home; park in your driveway
- Don't forget to have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped
- Have emergency supplies in your car
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department and request a House Watch

If you are out of the house:

- Turn on lights and music or the TV so it looks as if someone is home
- Be sure that your doors and windows are locked
- Don't display your gifts where they can be seen from the outside
- If you plan to have packages delivered to your home, make sure you are home to accept them. If not, ask a neighbor or have the package be held at the nearest holding facility

If you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be **Situationally Aware**. *Remember*: someone is always watching
- Park in a well-lit area. Be sure to lock your car, close windows, and put shopping bags and gifts in the trunk
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a credit card whenever possible
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Carry a purse close to your body in the front. If you are carrying a wallet, place it in a front pocket

- When shopping with kids, have a plan in case you get separated. For the older children, have a central meeting spot designated. Teach the younger children to go to a store clerk or security guard if they get separated. Be sure they know your name (not just mommy and daddy), cell phone number, and address. *Remember:* Stranger Danger, do not talk to or go with strangers
- Check receipts to see whether your entire credit card number appears. If a receipt has your full number on it, take a pen and thoroughly cross it out
- Double-check that you have your credit cards after you pay for your items

Following these tips may reduce your stress during the Holiday Season.

Obtain & Post Permit Before Work Begins.



Ordinances: 150.01-R104.2 & R150.7-R150.8

Work that begins without a required permit, will be issued a STOP WORK ORDER and a double fee will be assessed to the required permit.

As the homeowner or occupant hiring for work to be done that requires a permit, please make sure that the contractor posts the permit on the front window or door PRIOR TO WORK beginning.

Permit Required 150.01-R104.2

-The City shall receive applications, review construction documents and issue permits for the erection and alteration of buildings and structures, inspect the premises for which such permits have been issued and enforce compliance with the provisions of this code.

Placement of Permit & Responsibility R150.7-R150.8

- -The building permit or a copy shall be kept on the site of the work until the completion for the project. R105.8
- RESPONSIBILITY. It shall be the duty of every person who performs work for the installation of repair of building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing systems for which this code is applicable, to comply with this code.
