NEW POLICE CARS

Soon you will see some new police cars around town. They are going to look a little different, and that's because they are. Meadows Place typically rotates its stock with two new cars every year and this year, after a great deal of research, we chose to incorporate Dodge Chargers into our stock. Chief Baker is pleased with the decision and happy with cost savings the Chargers offer. Capt. Jack Ashton says that besides having a lower initial cost, there are other benefits. Tests indicate that as a Department we should realize lower overall operating costs, better gas mileage and our Patrol Officers should be a little more agile as they patrol our fair city. Now that summer is over, the City of Meadows Place will be firmly enforcing City Ordinances regarding personal pools. It is the homeowners responsibility to make sure they are clean, safe and not a breeding ground for mosquitoes that could carry the West Nile virus. Pools are costly. AFTER ACTION REVIEW

For the most part. Meadows Place has received positive marks concerning it's response to Hurricane Ike and the subsequent recovery efforts. Thank You for all your kind words. They were very encouraging. We did a lot of things right but the fact is, we found a few areas that we need to address before another "event" occurs. In an attempt to address these issues, Meadows Place held a formal AAR, or After Action Review. Mayor and Council were present, as were representatives from our Public Works, Code Enforcement, Police and Fire Departments. We spent two hours reviewing pre-event preparation, response, equipment and communication needs. A list of action items was selected and a committee of four was formed. This committee is charged with finding solution options for the selected action items and will bring these to the table in a follow up session of the AAR. The discussion was open, honest and candid with the goal of making Meadows Place an even safer place in the future and Your Place for Life.

Then, when the Stafford PD was getting worn out from storm duty and extra shifts, we sent Police relief to Stafford to help man their Point Of Distribution (POD) center. Maybe that type of cooperation is why Ft. Bend County is being looked at as an example for others to follow. It is a great place to live.

Did You Know.... that many of our street signs were either lost or damaged during Ike? Since we have to replace so many, Alderman Rick Staigle is working with Public Works Director Dan McGraw to implement a change in the type and look of our street signs to meet the current State regulations. It has to do with reflectivity and upper and lower case lettering. They will look similar and we will keep the same overall look but they will be a little different. You should see some start popping up in a month or so.

Those two are also moving forward on their investigation into a grey water facility for Meadows Place. This is a much needed water/sewer recycling project and is a LONG term venture, several years, but at least the wheels are in motion. We will keep you posted as we make progress.

City Ordinances / Code Enforcement



IMPORTANT NOTICE

The City of Meadows Place has amended the tree I ordinance with regards to height requirements. The ordinance requires that tree limbs provide a sixteen (16) ft clearance over streets and a ten (10) ft clearance over sidewalks.

The City's plan for enforcement is as follows:

- Issue a warning giving 14 days to bring into compliance
- Failure to comply will result in a citation in the amount of \$250.00 and a second 14 day warning issued
- Failure to comply with the 2nd warning will result in a citation in the amount of \$500.00 and the City will then trim trees to meet the requirements.

Homeowners will then be responsible for the citation amount and all costs incurred for services rendered. The reason for the change to the ordinance is two fold:

- 1. Our fire trucks are 14 ft in height and the damage caused by low hanging limbs is extensive and expensive.
- 2. Secondly, and equally as important is safety. When the trees become overgrown our street lamps cannot provide sufficient light. Furthermore, as some experienced with Ike, overgrown tree limbs once broken are expensive to have removed and can cause more damage to property.

The weather is getting cooler. It is a perfect time to start working on the Fall Honey Do List:

- 1. Clean out gutters
- 2. Touch up or repaint exterior surfaces
- 3. Have your furnace serviced for winter
- 4. Trim your trees

Although it has been a hectic couple of months I wanted to mention what a great job the Carter family is doing as they repair wood, replace windows and repaint! It truly has been a family affair. Great job and what a wonderful way to go into the holidays with a fresh new look!

Traffic Alerts - Dec 12 & Nov 15

The City of Meadows Place has traditionally put on a number of great annual events that the whole family looks forward to from Splash Night to the Fourth of July Parade, from the Halloween Carnival to Meadows Christmas Memories. This year residents have one more event to add to their calendar; a once in a lifetime event that's not to be missed - the 25th Anniversary Celebration of The City of Meadows Place

Set for Saturday, November 15, from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., at the community park behind the school, this is an event designed to appeal to all ages. City officials are promising an extraordinary celebration complete with games and activities, a live band, and, for the first time ever in the city's history, a fireworks display.

"There are a number of people who have been planning this event for many months. We've got just one shot to get it right and we want to make sure it's a night to remember for all of our residents," says Heidi Case, City Alderman and Chair of the 25th Anniversary Celebration. A fly by and touch down of an Army Apache helicopter will kick-off the celebration at 3 p.m. Residents will have an opportunity to check out the cockpit of the Apache and speak to pilot Bob Stolting and co-pilot Scott Nichols for approximately one hour. In addition, The Emotions, a favorite Houston-area band, will entertain the crowds throughout the afternoon and early evening. Activities slated for the event include a petting zoo, camel rides, moonwalks, a football toss, and a mechanical bull. Food vendors, whose proceeds will support the Meadows Swim Team and Meadows All Play Baseball, will be on hand for those who work up an appetite.

"We're also planning an historical display that will feature photos and documents from the city's beginnings through present day. While we have a modest number of pictures so far, we are hopeful that more of our long-time citizens will take the time to go through their old photos and pick out a few they could loan us for the event," says Case.

Midway through the celebration, past mayors including Sue Troyan, the city's first mayor, Jim McDonald, and Mark McGrath, will join current Mayor Charles Jessup for a brief presentation including the dedication of the new butterfly garden and jogging trail extension. Culminating the event will be the City's first fireworks show.

"I think the committee has put together quite an event," says Mayor Charles Jessup. "So many of our residents were here from the beginning of our incorporation. They've watched this city grow from its infancy to what we are today. I can think of no better way for all of us to come together as a community and celebrate our accomplishments and successes over the past 25 years."

STORM WATER POLLUTION IN MEADOWS PLACE

nlike the water that goes down your sink or bathtub drain to the sewer, water that flows into storm drains is not treated and filtered for pollutants. This contaminated water flows directly into the drainage ditches, Keegans Bayou, Brays Bayou, the Houston Ship Channel and ultimately to

the Gulf of Mexico. So, letting pollutants reach your storm drain is like contaminating your own food source. Anything other than pure rainwater is a potential contaminant that degrades water quality and aquatic life. It's very important that you help prevent contaminants from flowing into storm drains. Never pour anything down your storm drain. Intentionally pouring pollutants into street gutters and storm drains is dangerous to the environment and it is also illegal and carries a fine plus the cost of cleaning or removing the contaminate.

Solid debris takes up space in the storm piping thereby making it less effective in transporting storm water to the ditch. In other words, dumping solid debris and pollutants into the storm sewer allows streets to become flooded after heavy rains.

Three types of storm water Pollution:

Storm water pollution can be split into three general classifications.

- · Litter cigarette butts, cans, food wrappers, plastic bags or paper
- · Natural Pollution leaves, yard clippings or animal feces
- · Chemical Pollution fertilizers, paint, oil, or detergent

The water that runs into and through the storm ditainage system is not neared— it goes stratght into our waterways, and ultimately into Galveston Bay. Storm drains are part of our system to help prevent flooding, so please keep them clear

- Don't blow your leaves or grass dippings down the drain.
- Bag or compose the trimmings from your yard.
 Phase, don't put anything—gartage, motor of, paint, dogge doe or anything except rainwater- down the starm drain.

The National Standard in Self Defense Education (tm)

"Rape Aggression Defense" is a program taught nationally by certified instructors representing law enforcement, women's assistance centers and college and universities throughout the United States and Canada. Instructors, *Jim and Sandra Baylor*, have instructed over 4000 women ages 12 – 86 in the RAD Systems Basic Physical Defense Course. <u>This is truly a program for all females regardless of age, fitness level or any</u> <u>physical restriction</u>. At the conclusion of the training, the students will be able to apply their skills in simulated confrontations with aggressors.

Attendees will be introduced to lectures on the theories of <u>Risk Avoidance, Risk</u> <u>Recognition, Risk Awareness, and Risk Reduction</u> to help them stay safe in their every day environments. In addition, basic self defense techniques and strategies to avoid abductive or aggressive acting out person(s) will be taught to help a person who is confronted to escape and survive. A series of active simulations will be conducted on the last day of training so the participant can apply skills learned.

Every day women have to think about their personal safety. By attending this program you will receive the education, physical skills and options to deal with violent situations and the chance to be part of the decision making process to resist or even consider compliance if confronted with any type of violent behavior.
