1. CALL TO ORDER AND ANNOUNCE A QUORUM IS PRESENT

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jessup at 7:00 p.m. with the following present:

2. PUBLIC HEARING

a. Conduct a public hearing giving all persons interested the right to appear and to be heard on the allowance of laying hens in a residential area.

Mayor Jessup opened the public hearing at 7:01 p.m. and introduced the members of Chicken Advisory Committee. After opening the Public Hearing Mayor Jessup then gave a brief presentation explaining the background on the issue of laying hens in a residential area which is attached as Exhibit A. He then explained that the purpose of today's hearing is to give all interested parties the right to appear and to be heard.

Mayor Jessup then called upon those signing up to speak on the allowance of laying hens in a residential area.

Jim Milner, 11943 River Meadow Lane: Mr. Milner spoke to Council regarding current ordinances and Code Enforcement. He stated that if there is not an ordinance prohibiting certain animals then they are allowed.

Mayor Jessup stated that although the City does not have an ordinance for this there are deed restrictions that state no fowl. Since there is no longer and Home Owners Association there is no way to enforce the deed restrictions. He also stated that the deed restrictions are self-renewing, therefore still enforceable in Court. The City Attorney, Drew Smith, stated that the City does not and cannot enforce private deed restrictions.

<u>Randy English, 11606 Dorrance Lane</u>: Mr. English stated he thought education on raising chickens is very important and he is in favor of chickens in the City.

Roy Huddle, 11803 Meadowdale Drive: Mr. Huddle thanked Council and the Chicken Advisory Committee for all of their hard work on this issue. He stated that he is in support of chickens. He stated that this would allow families the opportunity to teach responsibility to their children.

Patricia Pless, 12131 Brighton Lane: Ms. Pless stated that she is against laying hens. She believes that there is not enough space on the residential lots for chickens.

<u>Cheryl Teague, 11611 Dorrance Lane:</u> Ms. Teague stated that hens are very quiet and do not smell offensive to her. She also stated that commercial chickens are fed hazardous materials to promote growth. She is in favor of chickens.

Joseph Terraso, 12222 Level Run Street: Mr. Terraso, a resident since 1973, stated that the only experience he has with chickens is what he learned from a friend. He believes they will attract rodents and smell offensive. He is against chickens in the City.

Tom Stansbury, 11803 Brighton Lane: Mr. Stansbury, a resident since 1971, stated that he is not favor of chickens. He worried about the added work and cost this will put on Code Enforcement. He is also worried that allowing laying hens in the residential area will reduce property values.

Mayor Jessup stated that in all of his research he has done he has not found evidence that allowing the laying hens had decreased property values. He asked that if anybody has found research showing a decline in property values to please bring it to him.

Lauren Galvin, 11939 River Meadow Lane: Ms. Galvin stated that she is against chickens and would consider moving if Council passes an ordinance to allow laying hens in a residential area. She is also concerned about the patio homes that have very small lots.

Bob Favorite, 12110 Dorrance Lane: Mr. Favorite stated that he does respect the difference of opinions, but he is also concerned about the zero lot line homes. He agrees that this is a tough decision, but he is against chickens.

<u>Robert Chadwick, 12007 Brighton Lane:</u> Mr. Chadwick stated that he is against chickens. He grew up on a farm and chickens stink, are loud, carry parasites, and attract rodents. He believes chicken are livestock and do not belong in a residential area.

Ed Cegelski, 12130 Monticeto Lane: Mr. Cegelski, a resident since 1978, stated that he grew up on a farm and the chickens attracted snakes. He is against chickens in the residential area.

Anne Green, 12303 Hoggard Drive: Ms. Green stated that she believes this this is current urban hippiness and she against chickens in the residential area.

Bonita Garcia, **11919 Bloomington Lane:** Ms. Garcia stated that she is in support of chickens in the residential and thinks the community would benefit from them.

With no one else signing up to speak, Mayor Jessup closed the public hearing at 7:56 p.m.

3. Adjourn

There being no further business to discuss, Alderman Staigle moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderman Henley and with unanimous approval the meeting was adjourned at 7:57 p.m.

B. Presentations and Proclamations

1. Recognition of Bob Graf

Mayor Jessup recognized Bob Graf for his hard work promoting growth and development in the City of Meadows Place for many years. He stated that Mr. Graf was key to getting Aldi's Grocery store into the City, which will be opening on February 2, 2017. Mayor Jessup read a proclamation proclaiming Thursday, February 2, 2017 as Bob Graf Day in the City of Meadows Place.

C. Reports

1. Police Department

Chief Stewart gave an overview of the monthly statistics and activities report, which was distributed to the Council and filed with the City Secretary.

Chief Stewart that the next Neighborhood Watch Meeting will be February 23 and the topic will be "Distracted Drivers."

Chief Stewart introduced the new Chaplain for the City of Meadows Place Police Department. James Russell comes to the City highly recommended and many years of experience.

Mayor Jessup thanked the Police Department for all of their hard work and the great relationships they have with the local businesses. He also welcomed Chaplain Russell and his wife.

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Alderman Staigle stated that he noticed on the arrests there was usually multiple officers on the scene and asked was this for safety. Chief Stewart confirmed that the Department does try to have multiple officers involved for safety, especially with some many guns on the streets. Alderman Staigle applauded the department for all that the day in the City.

2. Parks and Recreation

Parks and Recreations Director Colene Cabezas gave the quarterly report for the Parks and Recreations Department. Ms. Cabezas, stated a few key points and highlights from the previous quarter, a copy of which has been filed with the City Secretary.

A few key points for the quarter are listed as follows:

- Outdoor fitness equipment is complete.
- Spray pad is complete with working water and lights.
- Landscaping at the new Training Center in complete.
- New floors installed at the Community Center and the outdoor patio is in the process of being refurbished.
- Eight new awnings installed at the baseball fields.
- Texas Parks & Wildlife came out in December and released of approximately 700 rainbow trout into the lake. Meadows Place 4th and 5th graders were present for the release. We are the only City that has this program with the Texas Parks & Wildlife and the school.
- 640 volunteer hours completed in the in the months of November, December, and January.

Mayor Jessup thanked Ms. Cabezas for all of her hard work. He also stated that the Youth Action Council (YAC) came up with the idea to put Little Libraries in the City. Recently channel 39 news came out and did a small story on the City of Meadows Place Little Libraries. The story can be found on the City of Meadows Place Facebook page.

Alderman Isbell stated that 640 volunteer hours in phenomenal.

Alderman Bezner asked if the City will be installing a slide at the pool? Ms. Cabezas stated that it is in the budget and will be installed closer to summer.

3. Fire Department Monthly Report for December 2016

Mayor Jessup provided an overview of the Stafford Fire Department report for December which was filed with the City Secretary.

D. Mayor's Comments

1. Council Retreat and Workshop

Mayor Jessup stated that Council attended a retreat on January 21st at the new Training Center. Council toured the new facility, reviewed ongoing projects, and discussed the future of the City.

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2. Hazardous Mitigation

Mayor Jessup stated that the City is a part of the Fort Bend County Hazardous Mitigation Plan which will expire in October 2017. Staff is currently reviewing the plan and submitting updates to the County in order to remain a part of the Hazardous Mitigation Plan. Staff plans to have the City's portion completed by February 28th.

He also stated that he believes that the City has never had staff this strong and he is very impressed with their strength and professionalism.

3. American Oarsmen

Mayor Jessup stated that City has paid a minimum sponsorship towards American Oarsmen in Race the Atlantic. Race the Atlantic is made up of teams of 3 men rowing a 22 foot boat for 45 days across the Atlantic. Mike Matson, Brian Krauskopf and David Alviar make up the American Oarsmen team. Meadows Place connection to the team is Mike Matson who was a volunteer fire fighter who worked with Fire Fighter Anne Sullivan, who died in 2014 in the Southwest Inn fire in Houston. Mike's donations will go to the Anne McCormick Sullivan Foundation.

4. Legislative Update

Mayor Jessup reported that he has attended a few sessions and a couple items of interest for the City are the Hike and Bike Trail and Sex Offender Legislation.

5. Potential Future Development Update

Mayor Jessup reported that the new Aldi's Grocery Store is scheduled to open on Thursday, February 2nd. He also stated that he Bob Graf, EDC President, have met with a potential developer for the 9 acres on W Airport. He stated that the City will work with the developer on planned development which will help protect the City.

E. Council Comments:

1. Kirkwood Update – Alderman Rick Staigle

Alderman Staigle stated that the engineer, HDR, has completed 30% of the design phase and is moving forward. He also reported that the City is negotiating the scope of landscape and will be signing a contract soon.

He stated that the Committee did a minimum of 30 face to face interviews regarding chickens. Mr. Kulhanek gave a brief presentation reviewing the research the Committee has completed. The Committee tried to come up with a good recommendation to the City. They Committee recommends setting guidelines if the City does allow for chickens.

Mr. Kulhanek wanted to report that the Committee was not unanimous in their vote to allow chickens in the City. Committee Member David Cosby spoke against chickens in the City. He believes an ordinance would be near impossible to enforce and result in more work for Code Enforcement.

The Mayor, Alderman Staigle, and Alderman Bezner thanked the Committee for all of their time, research, and hard work.

He also stated that the EDC thought it was important to hire a developer who knows planning, zoning, and development to represent the City while working on a Planned Development with Sun Investment Group. City Council did approve a contract with Kendig Keast at the February 7, 2017 Special City Council meeting.

3. Discussion regarding the moving of money to a Prime account.

Anna-Maria Weston, Finance Director, gave a brief presentation to Council regarding the TexPool Prime Account. She stated that the City already has a TexPool account, but the Prime account gives more options for investment. She recommended that Council approve the Prime account and allow staff to move some funds into the Prime account which will earn higher interest. She also stated that TexPool Prime has been around since the early 90s and will require no change to our account. There are also no fees or limits to move money around.

There will be an item on the Regular City Council agenda authorizing participation in the TexPool Investment Pools and designating Mayor, Charles D. Jessup, IV, Mayor Pro Tem, Terry J. Henley, and City Secretary, Courtney Rutherford, as the Authorized Representatives and Finance Director, Anna-Maria Weston as an Inquiry Representative.

4. Discussion regarding chickens in the City of Meadows Place.

Mayor Jessup stated that he wanted to put this item on the agenda to allow Council to take action if they so choose. There was brief discussion among Council as to what the different options regarding chicken. Possible actions to take are as follows:

- 1. No action and let the deed restrictions which state no chicken be handled neighbor to neighbor
- 2. Direct staff to work with legal counsel to develop an ordinance stating no chickens.

3. Direct staff to work with legal counsel to develop an ordinance to allow chickens with regulations.

Council did suggest talking to legal counsel about the deed restrictions and if there is anything that the City can do to enforce them or what to do if City ordinances conflict with the deed restrictions. No decision was made during this meeting.

5. Discussion regarding response to the City Secretary for Council meetings, luncheons, and dinners.

Mayor Jessup stated that he asked for this item to be put on the agenda. It is very important for Council to check their City emails and respond to the City Secretary regarding invites to meetings, dinners, etc. Alderman Isbell asked that the City Secretary mark these emails as important when sending them out. The City Secretary suggested sending outlook invites for the different events and Council could either accept or decline. Council agreed that they did not want calendar invites and they would do better to check emails and respond.

6. Review items on the February 28, 2017 Agenda

Council briefly reviewed the upcoming agenda items scheduled to be discussed at tonight's meeting.

7. Adjourn

There being no further business to discuss, Alderman Bezner moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderman Mills and with unanimous approval the meeting was adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

2. Workshop with Economic Development Commission regarding Kirkwood landscaping.

EDC President, Bob Graf, and Commissioners Matthew Walker and Margaret Sandlin, were present for the Workshop. Mayor Jessup stated that the City had hired a landscape architect, Asakura Robinson, to help with the landscaping of the Kirkwood road project. He stated that the original design came in way over budget, but the review Committee, which consists of Mayor Jessup, Alderman Staigle and the Parks and Recreation Director, Colene Cabezas, have been working with Asakura Robinson to reduce the cost.

There was discussion regarding focal points, such as statues, which have been removed from the initial plan to help reduce cost. There was also discussion regarding the sidewalk. The original plan budgeted \$82,000 for sidewalks on either side of the street. They architect and the review committee agreed to have sidewalk on only one side. There was lengthy discussion among Council and the Commission regarding the elimination of the sidewalk one side. Some Council thought that residents would be offended if they did not have the sidewalk. Alderman Staigle explained that HDR requested only one sidewalk for drainage, but that side of the street will still be beautifully landscaped.

There was brief discussion regarding other ways to cut cost. Asakura Robinson is reworking the landscape and will report back.

3. Update on sex offender lawsuit.

Mayor Jessup gave Council a brief update regarding the current lawsuit. He stated that the case is currently in Court. He and the Police Chief went to Court on April 10, 2017. The opposing attorney was the same attorney that Mayor Jessup testified against in Austin on March 28, 2017. The defendant is in violation of both state law and the City's ordinance. The City's Attorney argued that this case needs to be heard in the Court where the defendant was originally convicted. The judge is now reviewing the case and the City will attend another court date in the future.

4. Update on sex offender legislation.

Mayor Jessup reported that he went to Austin on March 28, 2017 to give testimony regarding HB 387. There were 44 witnesses there prepared to testify on behalf of the sex offenders. The Mayor put up good arguments, but it has not come out of the Committee yet. Mayor Jessup has sent letters to the Committee and Alderman Henley has also sent emails. Mayor Jessup is reaching out to several cities across the state in hopes of getting their support.

5. Discussion regarding chickens.

Mayor Jessup asked Council if he needs to release a public statement regarding chickens or leave it as is. Council agreed to leave it alone for now and let residents handle it through their deed restrictions if an issue comes up.

6. Review items on the April 25, 2017 Agenda

B. Reports

1. Police Department

Chief Stewart gave an overview of the monthly statistics and activities report, which was distributed to City Council and filed with the City Secretary.

Chief Stewart reminded everybody that the next Neighborhood Watch Meeting will be May 25, 2017 at City Hall.

Mayor Jessup stated that he was surprised by the number of weapons confiscated by Meadows Place Police Department; that is a lot of guns off the streets. Alderman Bezner asked if the Police Department has made any recent changes. Chief Stewart stated that the department has zero tolerance and the recent Contact report shows that our officers are good at searches.

There was discussion regarding how many part time dispatchers are needed for the upcoming budget. Chief Stewart stated that part time dispatchers are currently covering about 25 hours a week and we will need quite a bit more to have 24/7 coverage. Alderman Isbell asked about how much time the extra dispatchers are saving the officers. Chief Stewart stated that having the extra dispatchers allows each officers about one extra hour of time on the streets per shift. The officers are able to report calls for service to dispatch versus coming into the office to enter it into the computer.

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Alderman Henley asked about the number of reserve officers. Chief Stewart stated that we currently have seven reserve officers and they are a tremendous asset to the City. They help to reduce overtime, by working the City events.

Mayor Jessup reported that Meadows Place Police Department is working much closer with neighboring departments. He also did a six month budget review and the overtime hours are much lower than last year.

Finally, Chief Stewart reported that Meadows Place Police won the Crowd Favorite award at the recent Chili Cook Off. It was a huge event and he thanked Council and the residents that came out and supported the department.

2. Parks and Recreation

Parks and Recreations Director Colene Cabezas gave the quarterly report for the Parks and Recreations Department. Ms. Cabezas, stated a few key points and highlights from the previous quarter, a copy of which has been filed with the City Secretary.

A few key points for the quarter are listed as follows:

- Completed the landscaping at four entry signs in the City. Parks also completed landscaping at the new Training Center and McGrath Park.
- Solar lights and a picnic table were installed at the Community Garden.
- The annual Family Camp Out was a success with 142 people in attendance. Ms. Cabezas thanked the Police for helping, City Council for cooking and the YAC group for assisting.
- We had a great turn out at the Opus 4 String Quartet concert performed at City Hall. Ms. Cabezas thanked Aldi and Tradicao for donating food and drinks for the event.
- The City is also having the Concerts in the Park. So far the first event was a huge success and two more are scheduled for upcoming weekends.
- Monarch Gateway is underway. It will consist of 13.1 acres of land that run under the powerlines in the City. The gateway will be approximately 7 miles and will begin here in the City of Meadows Place!
- This last quarter the Parks Department volunteers contributed 757 hours of volunteer work. The two Experience Works employees worked 372 hours and the YAC group worked 385 hours. That \$8085 worth of time.

Ms. Cabezas then introduced the Recreation and Aquatics Coordinator, Leigh Ylanan. Ms. Ylanan introduced the guards for the 2017 summer. She stated that this is the best group of guards she managed in her 13 year career.

Ms. Cabezas then introduced the YAC members present at the meeting. The YAC group currently consist of 41 members. Alderman Isbell stated that he was proud of the Meadows Place YAC group and this is a great start to a career in leadership. Mayor Jessup stated that the Parks Department could not do their different events without the help of the YAC group.

Alderman Henley suggested that Ms. Cabezas reach out TML for help with funding of the YAC group.

3. Fire Department Monthly Report for March 2017

Mayor Jessup provided an overview of the Stafford Fire Department report for March 2017 which was filed with the City Secretary.

Mayor Jessup also thanked the Fire Department and EMS for participating in the Meadows Place video.

2. Reports

a. Police Department

Chief Gary Stewart gave an overview of the monthly statistics and activities report, which was distributed to City Council and filed with the City Secretary.

Chief Stewart stated that the Police Department currently has one open position for a full time officer and are reviewing applications. He also reported that the new Training Center/EOC is about 95% complete.

Chief Stewart stated that Neighborhood Watch meeting for this month has been cancelled due to low turnout, but they hope to host the August meeting in the new Training Center.

Mayor Jessup asked Chief Stewart how many of his officers will be attending the July 4th Parade. Chief Stewart responded that all officers, including all Reserve Officers, will be at the parade.

Alderman Bezner stated that there is a state law to ban texting while driving and he knows that Sugar Land recently passed a similar a law. He wanted to know if the Chief thought a law like that would be good for the City of Meadows Place. Chie Stewart stated that he thinks a hands free law is good and studies show that these laws cut down on the number of accidents. Alderman Henley said that the TML board believes this law is going to be revisited in the Special Session and the City should wait and see what happens.

Alderman Isbell reported that he has almost been hit twice at the first intersection on Kirkwood due to people running the stop sign. Chief Stewart stated that he will have officers monitor the intersection.

Alderman Bezner stated that he recently heard of potential murder at the Waffle House in Stafford jurisdiction and saw the MPPD also responded. Chief Stewart stated that our department was just there as back up.

b. Public Works

Public Works Director, Danny Segundo, gave the quarterly report for Public Works, a copy of which has been filed with the City Secretary. Mr. Segundo also introduced Corey and Byron from USW who were in attendance in case Council had any utility questions. Below are a few key points he mentioned.

Mr. Segundo reported that his department is currently gathering information on the streets to determine repairs for the next budget year.

Mr. Segundo also reported that several inlets and curbs have been damaged due to residents installing drains. He suggested that Council look at a permit for curb cuts.

Staff is addressing sidewalks that are a trip hazard. Mr. Segundo stated that the City does have a line item for side walk repairs and he and his staff try to address to worse ones first.

There was brief discussion among Council and Mr. Segundo regarding street repairs, tree trimming and banning trees near sidewalks.

Mr. Segundo then reported on Water/Sewer Plant maintenance. He reported that they had to repair a motor that went out and the repair was about \$14,800.

He then reported on completed and ongoing projects for the Public Works Department.

Alderman Isbell asked if the sidewalks could just be leveled. Mr. Segundo stated that he would have to look into that, but he has no experience with that.

Alderman Henley asked were there any chemicals other than chlorine added to the water going the residential homes. Mr. Segundo stated that chlorine is the only chemical added.

c. Fire Department Monthly Report for May 2017

Mayor Jessup provided an overview of the Stafford Fire Department report for May 2017 which was filed with the City Secretary.

3. Mayor's Comments

a. 4th of July Parade

Mayor Jessup reminded everybody that they City will be hosting the July 4th parade. There will be more to do at the end of the parade this year like food trucks, dinosaurs, and music. He said thank you to the Parks Department, YAC, Police Department and Public Works for all of their work I making the parade a success.

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b. Council Retreat Overview

Mayor Jessup reported that Council met in a Retreat on June 24th from 8 a.m. until about 12:30 p.m. He stated that it was a good retreat and they discussed way to improve the City. Mayor Jessup stated that the City has a great Council and he appreciates each of them.

Mayor Jessup has talked to the City Attorney regarding a resale certificate and they advised that the City does not have the authority to provide notice of violations to prospective buyers. As a general law City, they City is unable to require a seller or buyer to obtain a resale certificate. As an alternative the City may create a Building and Standards Commission which could determine driveway violations and order repairs to be made within a fixed period. There was brief discussion among the Council regarding driveway repairs and who should be responsible for making them. Mayor Jessup suggested that Council should schedule a workshop in the future with the City Attorney and discuss their options.

D. Discussion regarding payment to Fort Bend County Appraisal District

Mayor Jessup reported that a commercial property within the City of Meadows Place contested their appraisal with Fort Bend County Appraisal District and won. Since they had already paid their taxes Fort Bend County Appraisal District had to refund the property owner, therefor the City had to send a check for \$14,249.20 to the appraisal district.

1. Police Department

Police Chief, Gary Stewart, gave an overview of the monthly statistics and activities report, which was distributed to City Council and filed with the City Secretary.

Chief Stewart gave a brief update on Police Department staffing. He reported that Lieutenant Simmons was back in the hospital, but he is home now. Some employees have donated sick leave to help while he is home recovering. The department is still down multiple officers. EOC staff were served 3 meals a day Friday – Wednesday

During this time staff maintained daily sign in sheets, meal sign in sheets, daily receipts, vehicle logs, daily shift logs for PD

Staff worked in 12 hour shifts with 12 hours a rest; during this rest time staff was still required to be at the EOC

PD continued to patrol the City on a regular basis during the entire event and performed high water patrols and rescues.

Public Works and Parks monitored the City facilities and removed hazardous debris.

Staff worked with Sugar Grove Church in preparation for a shelter, but did not open due to lack of supplies. Supplies were requested from Red Cross, but did not arrive.

PD maintained dispatch in the City 24/7 during the EOC activation.

Chief Stewart acted as the Emergency Management Coordinator and guided staff with great leadership.

The City postponed the Banking Request for Applications to Tuesday, September 5th due to the storm and received applications from Wells Fargo, Independent Bank, and JP Morgan Chase Bank.

Bruce Mills, resident at 12123 Scottsdale Dr, stated that he would like to see the City make improvements for the elderly and handicapped. He also thanked the Mayor and Council for their diligent work.

B. Reports

1. Police Department

Police Captain, Jack Ashton, gave an overview of the monthly statistics and activities report, which was distributed to City Council and filed with the City Secretary.

Captain Ashton stated that that citations are down this month due to Hurricane Harvey, officers have been performing extra patrols over the last month. Some officers were on close patrol, which requires officers to drive by different properties and shine lights on the property. He also reported that Chief Stewart has been working on policies for disasters and EOC activation.

Captain Ashton reported that there will most likely be some structure changes in the Police Department due to Lt Simmons leaving. Staff is continuing to work on background checks for the four open positions.

Captain Ashton gave a brief update on Hurricane Harvey. He stated that the City was well prepared for the event and there was great teamwork. He then thanked Council for the EOC building which worked great during the event housing staff.

Finally he reported that Never Fail System should be installed soon.

Alderman Bezner thanked Captain Ashton and staff again. He stated that he was amazed by how the City pulled City together and had a real action plan during Hurricane Harvey.

He stated that he sat in on several of the Conference Calls with the County and other entities seemed to be less prepared. Captain Ashton stated that Hurricane Harvey was a unique event that took four days to pass.

Alderman Staigle reported that one big issue was shelters and those are set up through the Red Cross.

Mayor Jessup stated that the City has been working with the County for debris pick up. Texas Pride also came through the City and did an additional debris removal.

2. Public Works – Director Danny Segundo

Public Works Director, Danny Segundo, gave the quarterly report for Public Works, a copy of which has been filed with the City Secretary.

Mayor Jessup reported that Danny stayed at the EOC during Harvey while his house was flooding and he wanted to say thank you and that he was very appreciative of him staying. He appreciates his dedication and commitment to the City of Meadows Place. Danny stated that he got a couple inches and feels fortunate after seeing what others lost.

Mr. Segundo gave a brief update on the streets department and stated that he has identified 30 possible locations for mud jacking. He also stated that City will be targeting 11 locations for sidewalk repairs.

Alderman Henley stated that he felt like the new ramps seem like over kill and wanted to know if that was standard. Alderman Staigle reported that ramps are being installed according to ADA compliance.

Mr. Segundo reported that he and his staff have been working on the City's TCEQ permit renewal. The process takes 6-8 months and he is proud to say that the City's permit was renewed and is good until 2022.

Mr. Segundo reported that all of his department's 2016-2017 projects have been completed.

3. Fire Department Monthly Report for August 2017

Mayor Jessup provided an overview of the Stafford Fire Department report for August 2017 which was filed with the City Secretary. Mayor Jessup stated that this month the City paid the City of Stafford \$224,000 for fire services.

C. Mayor's Comments

1. Thank you to Dick Hendee and discuss bank selection

Mayor Jessup wanted to publicly thank Mr. Hendee for his help with reviewing the City's banking and depository service applications. Mr. Hendee is with Horizon Associates and he was great help in reviewing the applications. Mayor Jessup also thanked Finance Director, Anna-Maria Weston, for all of her help and preparing the bid tabulation for the banking applications.

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2. Oktoberfest, Monarch Madness and Fall Festival

Mayor Jessup stated that the City has several events coming up and staff has been working hard to get ready and is almost out of space for the festival and craft show. Mayor Jessup also reminded everybody that Tuesday, October 3rd is National Night Out and encouraged everybody to get involved.

3. Fort Bend County Fair & Rodeo

Mayor Jessup reported that is a long tradition for the Fort Bend County Mayors to participate in the parade annually and support the kids in FFA. Mayor Jessup will be participating in the parade and invited all of Council and the residents of Meadows Place to participate.

Mayor Pro-Tem Henley stated that HGAC recently accepted \$10,000,000 workforce disaster assistance funds. This is to provide temporary jobs for cleanup and repair after Hurricane Harvey. If anybody is looking for a temporary job there will be 400-500 job openings.

He is also reported that HGAC keeps digital images of the different counties and they went out immediately after Harvey and took new aerial photos of eight different counties. Once they complete the photos people will be able to see before and after pictures of the areas that flooded.

2. Recent flooding and EOC during Hurricane Harvey – Alderman John Isbell

Alderman Isbell stated that he wanted to personally thank staff and Council for allowing the City to have a wonderful EOC. He stopped by the EOC several times during the storm and at one point he saw almost all City staff on duty and he doesn't think any other City can say they had that coverage and participation. He said as the days progressed you could see it beginning to wear on people. He acknowledged that this was a great sacrifice and those involved need to be highlighted. Chief Stewart reported that he is still working to fill the department's open positions. They are currently performing background checks on some promising candidates.

Chief Stewart reported that National Night Out participation was down this year. Eight officer's attended five block parties.

Chief Stewart also reported that the next Neighborhood Watch meeting will be November 11th at the Meadows Place Training Center at 7:00 p.m. There will be a Laser Shot demonstration and training.

Finally, Chief Stewart reported that his department is helping with Code Enforcement on City Ordinance Violations and health and safety issues until a new Code Enforcement Officer is hired.

Mayor Jessup stated that he is very appreciative of all the help the Chief and his department have provided.

2. Parks & Recreation – Director Colene Cabezas

Parks & Recreation Director, Colene Cabezas, gave the quarterly report for Parks and Recreation and a brief recap over the Parks and Recreation events from the last 3 months.

Ms. Cabezas reported a few projects completed over the last three months include installing equipment at three new pocket parks, granite along the Hike and Bike Trail, Color Fun Run event, Oktoberfest, and the Monarch Madness and Craft Show. To date the Youth Action Council (YAC) has collected \$29,000 for the all-inclusive park. She also reported that there were approximately 500 people attended the Oktoberfest and around 900 at Monarch Madness.

Plumbers came in and changed out the piping. Ms. Cabezas also reported that there were some issues with the electrical at the building. Regas Construction and the electricians are working with the City Electrical Inspector to bring the house up to code. They removed all of the electrical wiring and replaced it with 12 gage wiring. The City Electrical Inspector will be back to inspect the work and make sure that it is all safe and up to code.

Alderman Isbell asked if the breaker box had been updated to a 20 amp box. Ms. Cabezas stated that they did work on the breaker box and she believes it has been upgraded to a commercial grade box.

Alderman Henley stated that he appreciated her working to get the electrical wiring fixed.

Alderman Staigle stated that staff needs to consider alternate parking for the next Monarch Madness. He suggested possible parking at the church with a shuttle. He also suggested signage for parking.

Alderman Bezner stated that he loves the weekend events and wants to know if there are any that Parks & Recreation may not continue. Ms. Cabezas stated that the Color Fun Run was a onetime fundraiser, but they may consider a different run in the future. She also stated that they probably won't do the street dance this year either. She also stated that there has been some interest in a BBQ Cook Off so they may look into that.

Finally, Mayor Jessup stated that he is so excited about the Nature Center and the small zoo that Parks & Recreation has started. He appreciates all of the efforts to get the building ready and up to code.
