There are companies that sell “independent emergency repairs” and “emergency home repairs” to the public that use somewhat misleading advertising. What they do is send a city official some brochures or information on the company and then when claim they have “been in contact” with the City or “in contact with the Mayor”. In one case, to get their foot in the door, they offer emergency protection on a specific problem, like broken water lines, and then try to sell you what amounts to an insurance policy based on their ability to provide basic repair services better than you can on your own. I am sure there companies that offer a legitimate service, but please be aware some of these companies are less than legitimate. I cannot speak to a specific company, but if you hear from a company that says something like “we have been in contact with the Mayor” or hint they are being “recommended” by the City, I want to make this perfectly clear - the City of Meadows Place does NOT, I repeat- does NOT endorse any of these types of companies. Feel free to call City Hall, or me personally, if you have any questions.

Leaving Kids Home Alone

Advice for parents on making sure kids are safe while home alone

Many parents must choose between leaving their children home alone during the day while they are at work or busy with other commitments, or finding alternative care. Parents often worry when their children are home alone, but there are precautions they can take to ease their worries and help protect their children when they're not around.

What parents can do

- Stay in touch. Call children throughout the day to ask how they are and what they are doing. Ask children to check in before they leave the house and to call again when they return.
- Keep kids connected. Post important numbers by the telephone, including parent's work and cell phone, the doctor's office, and a neighbor or a nearby relative who can help children quickly if they need it.
- Practice what to do in an emergency. Teach children how to dial 911 or "0" and when to do it. Ask questions like "If someone is trying to get in the house, what should you do?" "If you get hurt, what should you do?" and "If you want to play at a friend's house, what should you do?"
- Set firm rules. Make clear what children are allowed to do and what they aren't allowed to do. Can they use the Internet when home alone? Can they invite a friend over? Can they invite several friends over?

Make Sure Your Children Are Ready

All children mature differently, so there is no precise age when they are ready to stay home alone. This makes the decision to leave children alone even harder for parents. Many states have laws concerning the legal age when children can be left unsupervised, but there is no guarantee that when children reach this age they will be ready. However, there are questions parents can ask themselves to help determine if their children are ready.

Can your children

- Be trusted to go straight home after school or after playing at a neighbor's house?
- Easily use the telephone, locks, and kitchen appliances
- Follow rules and instructions well?
- Handle unexpected situations without panicking?
- Stay home alone without being afraid?
- Say their full name, address, and telephone number?

If you feel comfortable leaving your children home alone and feel that they are ready, discuss it with them and start practicing what they should and shouldn't do. Role play different scenarios to prepare them for anything that might happen when they are home alone.

Pick Up After Your Pet

Picking up dog waste is the neighborly thing to do. It's easy and it's cheap!

Pet owners have a responsibility to pick up after their animals. You may think it's not a big deal to let your dog relieve himself in a public place or in your neighbor's yard. It is not only considered a nuisance, but it pollutes out waterways as well.

How does this affect me???

Pet Waste can lead to the following negative effects:

1. Disruption of our lake's water systems by the release of nutrients from the waste which promotes weed and algae growth.
2. Enough bacteria make water unsafe for drinking and swimming.
3. When the waste washes into our lakes and rivers, the waste decays and uses up oxygen and releases ammonia. Low oxygen levels and ammonia combined with warm temperatures can kill fish and other aquatic life.
4. There are several diseases that can be spread from dog waste.

What can you do?


- A. Take a bag with you to properly collect the pet waste. It's part of being a responsible pet owner.
- B. Dispose of waste in trash, flushing it down the toilet or composting the waste by burning it.

Fire Hydrant Flushing



Fire hydrant flushing will start on August 15 through August 18. All fire hydrants in the Meadows Place are flushed and tested every six months to make sure they are in good working order in case of emergencies and to help flush sediment out of the distribution system keeping the water clean and clear.

Be careful when doing laundry during the time of flushing or try not to do laundry on the three days of hydrant flushing. Flushing stirs up sediments in the distribution pipes and you don't want that in your washer. Also, if there is any discoloration in your faucet water, let it run for a few minutes, preferably from the tub spout and use cold water, and it will clear up. The water is safe to drink.
