Road Use Fee

I am proud to announce that your City Council has taken steps to secure the future for Meadows Place. A Road Use Fee. This new initiative will strengthen the way we address our basic infrastructure needs and provide us a platform from which to move forward into a brighter, more secure future.

In the recent Road Fee survey the residents of Meadows Place spoke. An overwhelming 87 % of respondents said - "Fix Our Roads!" - and your Council listened. First, let me thank everyone who went to the website to take our Road Use Survey. It was most helpful and gave us great insight into the thoughts and feelings of the residents of Meadows Place. A 76% response made it clear the residents preferred a monthly flat fee to any other process, so last month Council passed an ordinance that calls for a monthly Road Use Fee of \$5.00 to be enacted. This fee will begin to show up on our utility bills in a month or two. This account will set aside these funds to be used exclusively for road repairs and nothing else. To ensure that, the City will create a fund that, by ordinance, is separate, specific and segregated for a singular purpose - road repairs and maintenance. This is not the end all to dealing with our aging roads and infrastructure, but a new beginning. An opportunity to begin to make both plans – and repairs – and to ensure our property values are maintained. I would also like to thank our Council who had the courage to act, to help us invest in ourselves, and to make sure our children, and our children's children will still be able to proudly proclaim Meadows Place IS... Your Place for Life.

Tree Maintenance

Why do we need to prune trees? Branches that hang low over sidewalks and streets are considered a safety hazard, either to pedestrians or to persons travelling in vehicles. Low overhead vegetation, and limbs not properly maintained can not only fall during storms, or reduce visibility, but can also damage larger

vehicles such as: school buses, delivery trucks and more importantly, emergency vehicles. As you can imagine, repairs to a fire truck can be quite costly for our city to absorb.


How much do I need to prune? The minimum height of overheard vegetation is 10 feet over sidewalks, and the minimum height of limbs over streets is 16 feet.

How do I prune a tree? For the purpose of the ordinance requirements I am asking that you raise the crown of the tree, which means to remove the lower branches of the tree to allow clearance. Large jobs that require the use of a ladder and power tools would probably be best if left to professionals. When hiring a tree contractor, make sure that they have experience, references, the proper equipment, and are insured.

My trees aren't as bad as my neighbor's, why am I being asked to trim? When I am leaving notices for tree trimming, I will be asking all of your neighbors along your street to do the same. Some families will only need to address a few branches, but others have a larger job at hand. We are trying to maintain uniformity in the limb heights, so even though all trees don't grow at the same rate, at least the over growth will be manageable.

Safety First! Please remember SAFETY FIRST when you are trimming your trees. Never work near any power lines. If you are working in the street be aware of your surroundings, and get someone to assist you with traffic. Use personal protective equipment such as gloves, safety glass, hard hats, hearing protection and be sure to read the manufacturer's operating manual for any power equipment that you may be using.

Meadows Place Police Department's Vacation Crime Prevention Tips

ummer is a time of year that many families go on vacation. Being on vacation can lead to crime victimization if appropriate crime prevention measures are not followed. Most families do not think about being victimized while on vacation because of all the excitement of going on vacation. The following crime prevention tips are designed to allow the vacationer to enjoy a safe and secure trip and to return to a secure residence.

Before Leaving...Secure Your Residence

- Make sure all the locks on the doors and windows function properly and use them.
- Make sure your residence looks lived in and not empty.
- Leave the shades and blinds on doors and windows in a position that you would normally have them.
- Ask several neighbors to keep an eye on your residence while you are away. Leave your vacation address and telephone number with the neighbors so you can be reached in an emergency.
- Make sure your smoke and burglar alarms are functioning properly and armed.
- Arrange for a neighbor to pick up your deliveries: mail, newspaper, and any other packages.
- Arrange for someone to maintain your yard so your home appears occupied.
- Have someone place your garbage cans at the curb for normal pickup and put them away after the pickup has been made.
- Make sure you have timers for lights, television, or radios so they turn on and off at the appropriate times.
- Turn the ringer on the telephone down low or off. A possible intruder will not be alerted to your absence by a ringing telephone. If you can, forward your calls to your cellular phone or a trusted individual.
- Leave a normal message on your answering machine; do not announce your absence on the answering machine.
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway while you are gone so it will appear that someone is home. If you leave your car at home, park as you normally would.
- Consider taking valuables that you cannot live without to a safety deposit box.
- Call Meadows Place Police Department for a vacation watch.

On The Road

- Try not to carry large amounts of cash; use traveler's checks. If you must carry large sums of money do not openly display it.
- Do not carry more credit cards than you will need. Keep a list of all traveler's check numbers and credit card numbers in a safe place. Have telephone numbers to call if either are lost or stolen.
- Never advertise your plans to strangers; this includes travel routes and the amount of cash you are carrying.
- · Do not stop for hitchhikers or stranded motorists. If you want to help, call for assistance for them.
- If you suspect that someone is following you, drive to the nearest well-populated place and call 911 or use your cellular phone for emergency assistance.
- Do not leave any tickets (airline, train, bus) in open view. They are as valuable as cash.
- Males are advised to carry wallets in an inside pocket or the front pocket of their pants. Females should carry their purses under their arm with a firm grasp.

Car Security

- Always lock your vehicle after entering or leaving it.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Check the backseat before entering your vehicle.
- Always place valuables out of sight, preferably in the trunk. Do not leave wallets, checkbooks, or purses in your vehicle.
- Try not to advertise that you are a tourist.


And a big thank you to the residents for their patience and understanding during the renovations, outages and everyday trials and tribulations at the pool.
