Water Meter Transition

Meadows Place is nearing the completion of its conversion to the new "Smart" water meters. There were two things that drove this changeover. One, we could no longer get technical support or upgrades for our old DOS driven utility billing system, so it was time to upgrade our software and replace the

old dot matrix printer. It was also time to replace our aging water meters. After much discussion and feedback, the decision was made to move to smart meters. This has been an interesting transition. It began with cleaning out and replacing all the water meter boxes in our yards. Then, as the new meters were being installed, three radio receiver/ transmitters were being installed at strategic locations in the city. Meanwhile, our new billing software, and printer, have been upgraded and brought online. There were a few adjustments and corrections to bills but, thanks to a lot of hard work by our staff, in surprisingly low numbers. As of the end of this month, the system should go into full automation. One thing we will need to adjust is to change the dates of when our water bills are read. Our current cycle overlaps two months which makes it a bit cumbersome. This change means everyone is going to have one bill with less days on it and one with more to even out the billing cycle. Don't worry, we won't be charged for more water than we used. Once complete, the new billing cycle will be easier for both the homeowner and the city. It will allow the city to more easily generate the reports needed for state reporting and let us track our usage monthly. Once we are satisfied the system is secure, we will begin to migrate to where you, the water user will be able to go online to monitor your water usage, and, eventually, to online billing. We are almost there, so bear with us as we complete this transition. Having seen this from the inside, I see countless benefits for the city, and for me, I am really looking forward to it being completed. \$5 Road Fee begins this month

Back in January, the Council began to consider attaching a Road Use Fee to our utility bill. The criteria for the fee was simple, put all funds collected into a separate account to be used for one thing and one thing only - road repair within the city and nothing else. Not being co-mingled in the General Fund makes all expenditures very easy to track and account for, which was one thing the residents did ask for when we set this up. After feedback in Council meetings and after the online survey results in which 76% chose a flat fee format, a flat fee of \$5.00 a month was chosen. This fee will be added to our utility bills this month. This fee will generate approximately \$90,000 annually. Not enough to allow us to do major reconstruction on our interior roads but it will provide funding for additional repairs. In time, we will see a difference. After W. Airport and Kirkwood are done, Meadows Place will be able to consider some sort of bond initiative for major reconstruction of our interior streets and water system. This Road Fee can be used to show the bonding companies we already have a funding mechanism in place. A small amount per month but a big step in the right direction for Meadows Place.

Vote...

Once again, Meadows Place voters turned out. In the November election, even though there were no city issues on the ballot, Meadows Place turned out at a rate that was about 50% higher than the rest of Ft. Bend County!! Impressive, and rest assured, I will "remind" our county, state, and national representatives of this. Thanks to all who voted. Being involved at all levels is one thing that makes Meadows Place, *Your Place for Life*.

Winterizing the Outside of Your Home

Even with our mild winters, there are several things that we can, and need to do to help maintain our homes in top winter condition. This will help us save on our energy usage, and in some instances, promote a nicer looking City in the process.

Lawn and Garden: Trim any trees that could come in contact with your house during heavy wind gusts, or that could break off and cause damage. - Fix any cracks or holes in driveways or walkways. These could fill with water and freeze, resulting in more damage. - Put yard and garden furniture inside or cover it with protective tarps.

Prepare the Gutters and Roof: Gutters can become clogged with leaves and debris, resulting in water not draining properly. -Install wire or plastic mesh over your gutters to prevent future clogs from happening. -Check your roof for missing or damaged shingles and replace them if necessary. Check that all metal flashing along the roof is properly sealed and any heating and fireplace vents are free from blockage.

Protect Pipes and Faucets: Water supplies to outside faucets, ponds, waterfalls, etc. should be shut off and drained before the temperature drops to below freezing. Any water pipes that are directly exposed to the cold should be insulated to protect them from freezing with foam rubber sleeves or fiberglass insulation.

The two most common components of your plumbing system that will freeze up will be the components that are exposed to the cold air and wind. Frozen pipes in Meadows Place happen. Some winters have been worse than others

- Pay special attention to metal pipes and plumbing parts that are exposed to the winter elements. They will freeze up real quick!
- Folks who have lawn irrigation systems need to wrap the backflow preventers (PVB). They are made of brass and freeze quickly when the temperature drops below 32. This repair or replacement costs around \$400 so, protecting your plumbing will save you money and headaches.

Clean that fireplace: Now is the perfect time for a professional cleaning - it makes fires cleaner and safer.

FYI: Please be sure that you are not placing items curbside for collection any sooner than the evening prior to pick-up. FOR EXAMPLE: Your grass is mowed Tuesday afternoon; your lawn clippings should not be placed at your curb until Thursday evening.

Heating Systems and Fire Places

You want to be sure that all of your heating and venting systems are in working order and operating as they should. It is recommended that homeowners get an annual chimney inspection. Most homeowners opt to have a Chimney Cleaning done every year as well, especially if they use their fireplace on a regular basis. Never allow more than an 1/8" of soot or creosote to buildup in the chimney.

- TIP make sure to clean chimney if more than 1/8" of creosote and soot has built up.
- TIP try not to use Pine wood to burn in fireplaces. Pine deposits Creosote and reduces draw more than any other wood...

Other venting systems connected to furnaces and stoves should also be cleaned on a regular basis to maintain safer operation. Fireplace, stove, furnace and heating appliance systems are important to your home and families safety.

After three tumultuous years of neglect, including two foreclosures and two stints of lender ownership, the Meadows Place Square shopping center, located at the northwest corner of Kirkwood and W Airport, has once again changed hands. TriCoastal Meadows LLC, subsidiary of a fund operated by BHW Capital of Houston, recently acquired the retail property.

BHW expects to improve the center through proactive, professional leasing and management, making it a more vibrant home for its tenants and a more positive contributor to the City of Meadows Place. The Houston-based real estate investment firm is now marketing the property for lease and is also working on plans to develop the center's two vacant pad sites.

Current tenants in the retail center include Thina's Beauty Salon, Teeter Toddler Day Care, DN Nail Salon, The Medicology Clinic (operated by Dr. Cuong Trinh), The Great W'Kana Indian Café (ranked number 26 in The Houston Chronicle food critic Allison Cook's Top 100 Restaurants 2013 list), and Pesto Italian Bistro. Pesto, operated by renowned chef Sunil Srivastava, will soon re-open as a full-service restaurant.

BHW's Nick Howard, the firm's property manager, commented, "We have already begun making improvements to the property and communicating our plans to the tenants, all of which makes them happy. We have met with city officials and are working closely with Bob Graf, Committee Chairman, Commercial Marketing for Meadows Place Economic Development Corporation."

"Meadows Place is excited about the potential of the property and we are glad to have the opportunity to fill the retail center with businesses that will enhance our community," explains Graf.

BHW and the city look forward to a successful repositioning of Meadows Place Square.


A New You for the New Year!
