Happy New Year...

Please allow me to wish everyone a Happy New Year. I am pleased to say 2013 was a very productive year for The City of Meadows Place. I would personally like to thank all the dedicated employees that work so hard to make Meadows Place the wonderful place it is. I would also like to thank Council and all the residents who volunteer for

Boards and Commissions for the City. These folks are an important part of city government and are vital in making sure Meadows Place is always... *Your* Place for *Life*.

In no particular order, I would like to share a few of the noteworthy accomplishments of 2013.

Road Fee

In January 2013, Council began to consider a Road Use Fee. The criteria was simple. Put all funds collected into a separate account to be used for one thing and one thing only - road repair within the city and nothing else. This fee has now been implemented, so far by this time next year we will begin to see a difference in our roads.

West Airport Project

Our business community along W. Airport received notice from TxDot that the reconstruction will begin soon and last 8 or 9 months. Yes, it will be a mess, but it will be worth it.

Meadows Place is Meadows Place!

In a major breakthrough, Meadows Place, working with the Fort Bend Central Appraisals District (CAD), managed to change the situs (location) addresses of Meadows Place homes to Meadows Place. This bodes well in enhancing our own identity and our property values.

Water Meter Transition

Meadows Place has completed the installation of its new "Smart" water meters. We are the first city in this area to make a complete conversion to radio read meters.

Did You Know... we are getting better at dealing with animal control issues? Folks have learned we need to catch - or in some cases trap animals, hold them, and then call Ft. Bend Animal Control for pickup, since the chances of Animal Control catching an animal on the loose is very slim. Thank You to everyone who has helped us keep strays under control and especially those who have found new homes for "lost" pets.

Did You Know... Meadows Place has recycled Christmas trees for years? They are collected on Montecito under the powerlines. This year, they will be ground up and used for mulch here in Meadows Place. Please pull the stand, bulbs and ornaments off before recycling your tree. This year, like last, Steve Bezner was the first one to get his tree to the recycle center. Mine is usually last. Hope you join us bringing in your tree.

Later this month, we will complete the integration with the updated billing system software program. This is a huge technological leap that will allow our utility department to provide even better service than it does now. Staff is hopeful that this time next year we will have online billing.

Meadows Place Bond Rating Raised

Another item I am pleased to announce is that after evaluating and assessing the financial position of the City of Meadows Place, Standard & Poor's (S&P) has raised our bond rating from a AA- to a AA Stable. This took a lot of hard work by staff, Council and especially Elaine Herff and Anna Maria Weston..... our two part time number crunchers. Thanks everyone.

Internal Updates

Staff has been busy working to update many of our codes and ordinances such as the Electrical Code that we use to ensure safety and fairness for everyone. We have worked hard to make sure we are getting them online in a timely, cost effective manner. 2013 also saw the start of a comprehensive update on the City's Personnel Manual.

Water Reuse

More big news. The City of Meadows Place was asked to speak before the nation's largest Water Reuse Symposium in Denver, Colorado. Not bad for a one square mile city! 2013 saw hundreds of visitors from around the world come visit our water reuse system and visit with Public Works Director, Dan McGraw.

Code Enforcement

We have a new Code Enforcement Officer, Jerry Parker, who is also a volunteer Fire Fighter in our City. Late in 2013, Meadows Place, installed new Code Enforcement Software. Thanks to a lot of hard work by Jerry, we go online about 2 months sooner than the company thought we would. More on this system later.

Surveys on Website

There is now a Survey Section on the city website. This has been a great way to gather data on all types of topics. The latest, on Community Gardens (and more), saw the largest response ever. The results will be posted for you to review by mid-January. Thanks to all who participated.

Meadow Place Moving Forward

Technology upgrades are not always easy to spot. This was not the case with the new courtroom technology upgrades, which you will easily see the next time you come to Court, or a Council meeting.

City Secretary

2013 saw a change in our City Secretary position. A panel helped devise a strong slate of candidates from which one was chosen. Her name is Jan Moore, and she comes to Meadows Place from with a world of experience and a strong background in municipal government.

I hope you enjoyed this trip down memory lane as much as I did. These were just some of the items addressed during 2013. The rocks at the lake and new snowflake lights, are part of those, too. Large or small, all were done to make Meadows Place a fun, safe City in which to live and raise a family. Expect more in 2014. Happy New Year.



Recently, several Meadows Place residents were Vehicle (BMV). All these cases had something in common, unlocked vehicle doors with valuables in plain sight. Auto Burglary is a "Crime of Opportunity." Every 2 ¹/₂ minutes in Texas, another vehicle is broken into. To protect the citizens of Meadows Place from becoming a victim of this type of crime, the Meadows Place Police Department has initiated a Burglary of Motor Vehicle (BMV) education program. This program, known as T-L-C, reminds Meadows Place residents and visitors to:

> Take Out Valuables Lock Your Vehicle Close Your Windows

Meadows Place Police Officers randomly check vehicles parked in business parking lots, city streets, and driveways for items that would attract a potential burglar and perhaps make the vehicle owner a victim of a crime. After inspecting the vehicles for valuables left in plain sight, checking for unlocked doors and open windows, the officer leaves a report card on the windshield of the vehicle indicating whether the vehicle passed or failed. If a vehicle fails, the officer will indicate the reason for the failure on the report card.

The intent of this proactive initiative is to educate our citizens and visitors. If everyone follows these simple guidelines, we can work together to reduce the chance that someone will become a victim of this preventable crime. Remember, if we all practice T-L-C, burglars will shop somewhere else!

I am reminding everyone about the 4 of the most common ordinance violations for a very good reason. One of the successes that occurred in Code Enforcement this past year is new Code Enforcement software. Not only is EVERY complaint or violation now tracked by an individual case number, the record NEVER goes away. If a warning is written for a violation, that warning stays in the system, so that when a repeat violation occurs, a citation can be written without having to search for records that may or may not be able to be found.

So again, Happy New Year and Thanks to everyone helping me keep OUR little City a Beautiful place to live!

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is an American federal holiday marking the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year, which is around the time of King's birthday, January 15.

King was the chief spokesman for nonviolent activism in the civil rights movement, which successfully protested racial discrimination in federal and state law. The campaign for a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday



into law in 1983, and it was first observed three years later. At first, some states resisted observing the holiday as such, giving it alternative names or combining it with other holidays. It was officially observed in all 50 states for the first time in 2000. The federal legislation challenges Americans to transform the King Holiday into a day of citizen action volunteer service in honor of Dr. King. Fire Fighter Appreciation Day
