2013 City Election

On May 11, 2013, 12.5% of the registered Meadows Place voters voted. This was significantly higher than the 3.72% turnout for the rest of the county and was by far the largest percentage of voters of any city in the county. Meadows Place has a reputation for turning out to vote and our numbers really stood out. Not only did we impact our own

city government, we played a large role in the school board elections. Congratulations to new Council member Kelle Mills and kudos to all of you who voted. Thank You -You help ensure Meadows Place is always... *Your Place for Life*.

Finally, Meadows Place is Meadows Place!

I would also like to thank everyone who contacted the Fort Bend Central Appraisal District (CAD), and changed their resident addresses to Meadows Place from Stafford. This is already paying off for us. If you haven't changed yours, it is very simple. All you do is fax your request, along with your address and signature, to the CAD. The fax # is 281-762-9666. If you do not have a fax, bring your request to City Hall and we will fax it for you. Then, your home and your mailing address will be Meadows Place. Be Meadows Place proud and have your home listed as being in <u>our</u> wonderful little city.

Road Use Fee Survey now on Website

There is now a Survey Section on the city website. Anytime there is an active survey, you will be able to click on it and take the survey. The survey platform and data compilation is done by a company called Survey Monkey. Silly name. Serious company. This month our first survey is on our internal streets and the possibility of creating a fee to fund an account to be used strictly for road repair of our internal streets. Simply stated, we cannot keep up with the needed street repairs unless we take some sort of action. We have a small, \$50,000, budget for street repairs. One 5' by 5' patch on Airport recently pulled \$6,500 out of the road repair budget so even though we do a good job of using our dollars wisely, this can be eaten up quite quickly.

We currently use a combination of concrete, mud/slurry pumping and blacktop for overlays and patches. We will need to continue to be frugal, but simply put, if we ever want to keep up, we need to look at alternate funding. That is - if <u>you</u> want to. Now is the time to tell us and the survey is the tool. Please go to the website –www.cityofmeadowsplace.org, and click the link under Survey Section. Then all you do is answer a few questions and click done. The survey will be active until June 8th so please do not wait. Take it now. One response per adult per household please. The results will be published on the website and in next month's Newsletter. More importantly, your message will be given to City Council for consideration. The plan is to have at least one survey a month up around the 1st of every month so please take this survey and continue to monitor the website for new opportunities for you to offer your input to the Mayor and Council. Meadow Place Moving Forward

Next time you come to Court, or to a City Council meeting you will see something new - an upgrade in our courtroom technology. There are now two large flat panel screens for our Police Department to show videos taken during interviews, arrests, traffic stops, etc. This allows both the defendant and the jury to watch simultaneously. This is possible due to a new computer control system that allows input from other computers, dvds and thumb drives. There are also four small panels on the dais which allow the judge and prosecutor(s) to see the evidence as well. I am proud to have our courtroom join the 21st century but the best part is that the monies used to install this new technology came from a state mandated Court Technology Fund and not from city funds. Another money saving measure was having our Public Works do most of the labor on the install - including building the new computer control cabinet. Thanks again to Dan McGraw and our Public Works Department. Meadows Place, Moving forward, a little at a time.

Message from the Aquatics Director

Well summer is here and the pool is open! I want to take this opportunity to welcome everyone back for another great season. See a detailed list of pool operating days and hours in the Parks & Recreation section of this newsletter or the marquee inside the pool. Please be sure to read the back of your pool registration card for an updated list of the pool rules. The rules are also posted on the marquee inside the pool area.

Wrist Bands will need to be purchased again this year for pool access. Wrist bands will be available for purchase during normal operating hours at the Pool. Wrist bands are available to residents of the City of Meadows Place for the 2013 summer season. Wrist bands are \$5 per band. Residents must fill out a registration card and show a current driver's license listing Meadows Place as their address in order to purchase wrist bands. Residents are limited to one wrist band per family member; residents may bring one guest with each wrist band.

Lifeguards are not Babysitters. The Meadows Place Lifeguards are the best; they train before the summer and throughout the season and they take their job very seriously. The lifeguards are attentive and work on a rotation so that they will always be alert. But do not depend on them to babysit your kids. The lifeguards are there to make sure swimmers follow the safety rules and to help if anyone is in danger, but in a crowded pool even the best lifeguards can miss things.

When it comes to very young kids, children must not be left unattended at the pool even in the presence of lifeguards. Everyone needs some time to relax, but the time to sunbathe, read a magazine or take a nap is not while your children play unattended in the pool. If you have young kids, especially little ones who cannot yet swim, you should be in the pool with them, close enough to help if they get into trouble. Parenting is your job, and drowning can happen in seconds.

Drowning remains the leading cause of accidental death for kids ages 1-5. The World's Largest Swimming Lesson is taking place at the Pool on **June 18th** to help us send the vital message that Swimming Lessons Save LivesTM to millions of kids and adults around the globe! It's a great way to assess how well your children can swim, get them a free lesson, and see if they need to improve their skills. Swimming Lessons are available through the Parks & Recreation Department. The judging table will be set up at the Community Center to view all entries as they pass. All entries will be categorized and judged accordingly. Line-up for the parade in front of City Hall at One Troyan Drive; enter from W. Airport only and check in with a parade official. Vehicles not in the parade may park or drop-off participants at Sugar Grove Church of Christ.

Judging of the non-motorized entries, according to age groups, will take place at 9:30 am SHARP! Nonmotorized entries do not need to fill out an entry form. All you have to do is show up for the judging!

MEADOWS PLACE TENNIS COURT ACCESS SYSTEM

Current Tennis Court access cards were deactivated at the end of May. Residents may purchase new Tennis Court access cards at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm.

- Only residents of Meadows Place may purchase a card.
- A driver's license AND water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase the access card.
- Access cards are \$50 per card, maximum 2 cards per family.
- Cards are valid through May 2014
- All tennis players must have access card with them while on the courts.
- A maximum of three (3) guests allowed per card and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Do not prop open the gate at any time or allow access to the courts to anyone without a Tennis Court access card.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ALL RULES WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF YOUR ACCESS CARDS AND FUTURE ACCESS WILL BE DENIED.

I wanted to let everyone know of our policy when it comes to inclement weather. If a lifeguard hears thunder or sees lightning, the pool must be immediately evacuated and will remain closed for 30 minutes after every heard thunder or seen lightning. All guests should stay under the covered patio or head home. If the pool has been closed for an hour,

all guests will be asked to leave. If you are questioning whether the pool is open or not, feel free to call the **Pool Telephone at 281.498.9047**.
