**Open Carry in Meadows Place...** 

For the first time in over a hundred years, (licensed) Texans will be free to walk the streets or move about openly wearing holstered handguns. These are the same people that are carrying them now, they will just be wearing them in plain sight. According to the Texas Department of Public Safety, over 900,000 people in Texas have a license to carry a concealed

handgun. Still, it may come as a shock to some Texans when they start to see people openly wearing holstered handguns. Be prepared, we may see some in Meadows Place – but there ARE restrictions.

The Texas Open Carry Law is not based on Constitutional Open Carry, but is a Restrictive Open Carry, which means not everyone has the right to openly carry a handgun. You MUST possess a Concealed Handgun License, or CHL. Private businesses and other establishments have the right to ban open carry under the law. Many have been wrestling with how to proceed.

Here in Meadows Place, you are not allowed to come into City Hall with a weapon. Period. There are a couple of exceptions such as law enforcement and judges, but the rest of us are prohibited from carrying a weapon into City Hall. This is not my decision, or Council's, this is based on State Law that prohibits possessing a weapon in a courtroom or a building with a court clerk office accessible to the public. Meadows Place has both so please do not challenge the city on this, take it to the State. In the meantime, please keep calm and don't panic. However, if you see someone walking down your street with a big old pistol strapped to their hip, feel free to call our Police Department to come check them out.

#### Happy New Year...

I want to wish everyone a Happy New Year, take a look at last year, and then touch base on a few things coming in 2016. December was as busy as I have ever seen Meadows Place.

We had gas lines being replaced, CenterPoint was upgrading electrical circuits, parts of City Hall were getting a fresh coat of paint and we had multiple Public Hearings - one to hear a variance request from the grocery chain Aldi who may want to put a store in Meadows Place. In the meantime we had a Rainbow Trout release, Christmas Memories (huge success) and the birth of the Jingle Bell Jog and Pancake Breakfast proceeds going to support our Police. There was an in depth search for a new City Secretary, and we finalized West Airport. Last year also saw Meadows Place make the "Top Ten Places to Live" and a major repair of the storm bayou by the pool. Meadows Place introduced online utility bill payments and other technological improvements. 2015 saw the creation of the Meadows Place Community Development Program and one I am especially proud of, Fort Bend EMS setting up a station in Meadows Place. Just to name a few.

#### Looking Ahead...

2016 looks to be just as active. We will see the opening of a new bike/walking path from Montecito to Dorrance which will make it safer for our kids to get to school and be a pretty place to walk. Council will receive the final H-GAC recommendations for the revitalization and beautification of Kirkwood and award the contract. We will see a continued push to get family friendly businesses in Meadows Place by our EDC and have an election. PD will hire new officers, Public Works will continue their scheduled street and sidewalk repair program and we will continue to see new programs from our Parks Department. Thanks to Code Enforcement and the Community Development Program, we will see more houses that are currently unoccupied become homes for families once again. Two things I am looking forward to is the construction of a new Tactical Training Center for our PD and continuing the fight in Austin to protect the children of Meadows Place from predators. 2016 should be a VERY good year.

#### What Should I Do If My Wallet Is Lost or Stolen?

 $\mathbf{F}^{\mathrm{irst,\ file\ a\ police\ report\ to\ establish\ a\ record}}$  for your loss. We will need to know when it

was lost or stolen, what you think happened and what was in the wallet.

• Call your bank. You may need to close and reopen your accounts, and you'll definitely need to cancel your ATM card and get a new one.

• If your checkbook disappears, you'll need to close that account and reconfigure any direct deposits and auto-payments you've arranged. Make sure your bank alerts the check verification companies to prevent someone using your checks.

• Start a call log and list the date, time and people you talk to.

• Call your credit card issuers. They will cancel your cards and issue new ones. They'll also ask you about recent transactions.

• Call the three major credit reporting bureaus and ask to put a fraud alert on your file, to prevent identity theft in the future. The initial fraud alert stays on for 90 days. You also can request an extended fraud alert, which stays in effect for seven years.

• If your Social Security card was in your wallet you'll have to call your local Social Security Administration office and explain what happened. They will replace the card for free but you'll have to fill out Form SS-5 and present documentation. Your replacement card will have the same number as the original.

• Order your credit report from each of the three credit reporting bureaus to make sure there's nothing unusual on there. You are entitled to one free report from each of the three bureaus every 12 months through www.annualcreditreport. com – the official site created under the auspices of the Federal Trade Commission.

• Make your life easier next time: Only carry the cards that you need, and never keep your Social Security card or your PIN numbers in your wallet. Keep your other cards in a safe place. Also, write down your credit card numbers and customer service telephone numbers on a piece of paper you'll keep in a safe place. That way, if this happens you can quickly and easily report the missing cards to the card issuers.

## Call 811 before Every Digging Project, Large or Small

Every digging project, no matter how large or small, warrants a free call to 811. Installing a mailbox or fence, building a deck or landscaping are all examples of digging

or landscaping are all examples of digging projects that should only begin a few days after making a call to 811. Calling this number connects you to your local

call to 811. Calling this number connects you to your local one-call utility notification center. A representative from the center will come out and mark the approximate location of utility lines with flags or paint.

Digging without knowing the approximate location of underground utilities can result in damage to gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines, which can lead to service disruptions, serious injuries and costly repairs.

Take the proper precaution while preparing to dig at your residence and place a free call to 811, this will put you on the right path to a successful project.
