Preparing for Hurricane Season in Meadows Place, Texas - *Stay Safe, Stay Ready*

As we approach the 2025 hurricane season, residents along the Texas Gulf Coast are urged to begin preparations now. Forecasters are predicting an active season, and early planning can make all

the difference in protecting your home and family.

One of the most important lessons we learned from Hurricane Beryl was the impact of overgrown or weakened trees. In many neighborhoods, untrimmed limbs caused widespread damage to homes and power lines, delaying recovery efforts. Now is the time to assess the trees on your property; remove dead limbs, trim branches away from structures and power lines, and call a professional if needed.

What the City Is Doing to Prepare

The City is also taking proactive steps to prepare for hurricane season. We are currently working with FEMA to secure a Hazard Mitigation Grant, which will fund four new generators; one each for Water Well 1 and Water Well 2, one for City Hall and the Police Department, and a mobile generator for use where needed most. The grant also includes the remediation and rehabilitation of key drainage outfalls throughout the city to improve flood resilience. The grant process is lengthy, and we may not have these upgrades in place this hurricane season; however, the planning and paperwork are well underway. In the meantime, city staff are actively training and reviewing emergency operations protocols to enhance our response capabilities at the Emergency Operations Center.

We are also working closely with local organizations, surrounding city governments, and Fort Bend County to ensure that Meadows Place residents will have access to cooling centers in the event of prolonged power outages. Your safety and comfort remain our top priority during emergencies. Additionally, CenterPoint Energy has been reinforcing our existing power infrastructure and remains optimistic about its performance during the upcoming season.

Did You Know... the City teamed up with Fort Bend County Animal Services on Saturday, April 19, at City Hall for a FREE microchip and vaccine clinic. This clinic served over 100 vaccine and microchips to residents and non-residents. The City plans to continue this partnership and schedule other clinics in the future.

Did You Know... longtime Meadows Place Residents, the Harvey's, were seen continuing their tradition of playing Easter games in their front yard this year. Every year, they gather with family and neighbors to play egg toss, see who can carry an egg the furthest while balancing it on a spoon in their mouth, and rolling eggs across their yard. To add to the fun, the eggs were not boiled which led to some leaving covered in yolk. Do you play any games on holidays?

Did You Know... Dorrance Ln. reopened to traffic in late March. A portion of Dorrance Ln. was closed due to the Dorrance Ln. Improvement Project. Contractors are close to full completion and were able to reopen the road to residents. Thank you for your patience as the road was closed. This project's estimated cost is about \$2,300,000 and funding came from the City Utility Fund and Fort Bend County Mobility Project.

Did You Know... Meadows Place has a new City Secretary and Recreation Coordinator. Let's welcome them both!

As an Officer of the City, the City Secretary makes sure things are running smoothly and ensures the City follows local, state, and federal laws. When they take the oath of office, they promise to serve with integrity, transparency, and accountability.

Will Bolin joined not long after, also in March. Will is our new Recreation Coordinator overseeing the Discovery & Nature Center and programs including Adventure Summer Camp, Youth Action Council, and Club 55+.

Did You Know... our Public Works crew recently spent time working their way around the City putting a fresh coat of paint on street striping lines. You may have seen them out with their masking tape and rollers getting the job done. Thank you for your hard work!

Did You Know... our Police Department continued their partnership with Laser Shot by assisting their creative team in capturing images and videos that will be used for Laser Shot marketing and training videos. This partnership is a great way to feature our officers and save our department money on training.

Did You Know... the Wastewater Treatment Plant Clarifier Rehabilitation Project is reaching completion. In early April, a key component, the traveling bridge, was lifted by a crane and put into place. You can watch a video of this process on the City website and social media. This \$3.95 million project is funded by City Funds and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds.

Be Prepared

Whether you plan to evacuate or shelter in place, make sure your household is stocked with essential supplies:

- · Portable power banks to keep phones and devices charged
- Gas-powered or solar generators to run appliances during extended outages
- Portable air conditioners (with generator compatibility) to stay cool in hot, humid conditions
- Non-perishable food and bottled water for at least 3-5 days
- First aid kit, flashlights, and extra batteries
- · Manual can opener, pet supplies, medications, and cash

Remember to refuel vehicles early and keep important documents in a waterproof container.

Sign Up for CodeRED Emergency Alerts

One step I urge you to take is to sign up for CodeRED. This is a telephone communication service for emergency notifications.

The system allows us to send phone calls, texts, and emails to residents in the event of an emergency that requires immediate action or public notice. We utilized this during Beryl to send out important notifications and will continue to do so in the future if needed. You can find sign-up information on the city website, cityofmeadowsplace.org.

Finally, let's not forget, these storms often bring out the very best in us. After Hurricane Beryl, I was overwhelmed with gratitude for this community filled with people ready to help one another. City of Meadows Place Ordinance Regarding Fireworks

As the weather gets warmer and we look forward to fun celebrations (especially the 4th of July), we wanted to send a friendly reminder about the City of Meadows Place ordinance regarding fireworks. Our goal is to ensure everyone can enjoy a safe and peaceful

environment in our wonderful community.

Our City of Meadows Place Code of Ordinances, specifically Section 130.35, addresses fireworks within our city limits. To keep things clear and simple, here's what you need to know:

In Meadows Place, it is unlawful to:

- Manufacture fireworks
- Store fireworks
- · Sell fireworks
- · Possess fireworks
- Set off fireworks

This means that even possessing or lighting fireworks within the city limits is a violation of our ordinance.

Why is this ordinance in place?

This ordinance is in place to prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all our residents. Fireworks can pose significant risks, including:

- Fire hazards: Dry conditions can easily lead to accidental fires, endangering homes and property.
- **Injuries:** Fireworks can cause serious burns and other injuries to both users and bystanders.

- Noise disturbances: The loud noises can be disruptive to neighbors, especially young children and pets.
- **Stress for pets:** Many animals are easily frightened by the loud bangs and flashes of fireworks.

What happens if the ordinance is violated?

Any person who violates this ordinance, or allows someone else to do so, will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon conviction, they could face a fine of up to \$500.00. Each instance of a violation is considered a separate offense. Let's work together!

We understand that fireworks can be a traditional part of some celebrations, but we kindly ask for your cooperation in adhering to our city ordinance. By doing so, we can all contribute to a safer, quieter, and more enjoyable community for everyone in Meadows Place.

Instead of personal fireworks, we encourage you to enjoy the City's wonderful community events and professional fireworks displays. This event provides a safe and spectacular way to celebrate the 4th of July!

What is Storm Water Pollution?

S torm Water runoff is water from rain that does not soak into the ground. It flows from rooftops, over paved areas, bare soil, and sloped lawns. As it flows, stormwater collects and transports animal waste, trash and litter, pesticides, fertilizers, oil, and grease and

other potential pollutants into the storm drains.

Rain washes pollutants from impervious surfaces streets, parking lots, construction sites, shopping centers and residential yards into storm sewers and flows untreated into nearby bayous, creeks, fish and wildlife habitats, downstream recreational areas, and drinking water supplies. Toxic substances from motor vehicles, as well as the careless application of pesticides and fertilizers also threaten water quality and can kill fish and other aquatic life. Bacteria from pet and animal waste get washed into lakes and waterways making them unsafe for water sports like wading, swimming, water skiing and fishing.


A sanitary sewer system and storm and storm sewer system are not the same. Water that goes down toilets, sinks, showers, or other inside drains flows to the wastewater treatment plant. Storm sewer flows are not treated, so it is important to remember that any type of surface water runoff—not just rainfall—will be collected in the stormwater management system. When you wash your car on the driveway, for example, all that water, road oils, dirt and grime end up in the storm drain. All the runoff from our streets and yards end up in Galveston Bay and if that runoff is polluted then we are polluting the Bay.

Three Types of Storm Water Pollution

- Litter- cigarette butts, food wrappers, plastic bags etc.
- Natural Pollution- leaves, yard clippings and animal feces.
- Chemical pollution- fertilizers, oil, paint, and detergents.

Please be aware of the effects of pollution the water in our State.

Also - all drainage from a pool must be directed to the sanitary sewer system thru an approved "P" trap. And it may not be drained on the street.





Summer is Here!

As summer rolls in, we think of relaxation with warm Climates, generally pleasant.

Below are some common summertime Code Enforcement violations.

Sec. 91.035. - Nuisance declared; duty to abate.(Weeds): Whenever weeds, brush, rubbish and all other objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter of whatever nature shall exist, covering or partially covering the surface of any lots or parcels of any real estate situated within the city, or when any of the lots or parcels of real estate as aforesaid, shall have the surface thereof filled or partly filled with holes or be in such condition that the same holds or is liable to hold stagnant water therein, or if from any other cause shall be in such condition as the cause disease, or produce, harbor or spread disease germs of any nature of tend to render the surrounding atmosphere unhealthy, unwholesome or obnoxious, or shall contain unwholesome matter of any kind or description, the same is hereby declared to constitute a public nuisance, the prompt abatement of which is hereby other person in possession or control the property.



Sec. 150.66. - Replacement of dead, dying or diseased landscaping materials:

In the event the building official determines that any required vegetative landscaping material has died, is dying or is so badly diseased that the same cannot be saved or otherwise rehabilitated,



the building official may direct the property owner being in control of the street yard to replace the dead, dying or diseased vegetative materials with like or similar replacement materials.

Sec. 130.09 Refuse prohibited at or near streets and curbs: (A). It shall be unlawful and in violation of this code and punishable to the maximum extent permitted by law for any resident, citizen or inhabitant of the city to keep, store or to maintain rubbish of any type upon or adjacent to public streets or public street rights-of-way in the city except for the purpose of depositing for a normal and customary trash

pickup, which shall only be permissible not more than 18 hours before a scheduled trash pickup.



90.04: Running at large prohibited. (A) It shall be unlawful for the owner to permit any dog to be at large upon the streets, alleys or public or private grounds of the city, unless the dog is under the control of the owner or keeper or his or her agent by means of a leash, chain, rope or cord not more than ten feet in length and of sufficient strength to control the conduct of the dog.






RESULTS OF OUR COMMUNITY SURVEY
