***Hurricane Readiness***

As we enter the 2026 hurricane season, residents are encouraged to prepare early by trimming trees, stocking at least 3–5 days of essential supplies, and ensuring you have a plan for power outages, evacuation, or sheltering in place. The City is actively working on long-term resilience projects while also coordinating with regional partners to ensure access to cooling centers and emergency support if needed. We strongly encourage all residents to sign up for CodeRED emergency alerts through the City website so you can receive real-time updates during severe weather.

***Interlocal Agreements***

An interlocal agreement is simply a formal partnership between government entities that allows them to share services, resources, or responsibilities in a way that benefits the public and uses taxpayer dollars more efficiently. Instead of every city independently funding and operating every service on its own, governments can work together to provide high-quality services regionally.

In Meadows Place, we use interlocal agreements in two important ways:

First, we have an interlocal agreement with the county for EMS services. The county operates emergency medical services out of the station that Meadows Place owns and maintains. That means paramedics and EMS crews are stationed here in our city, allowing for fast response times and lifesaving care for Meadows Place residents. At the same time, because EMS systems operate regionally, those crews also respond throughout the surrounding county area when needed. Meadows Place provides the facility, and the county provides the personnel, equipment, and medical operations expertise.

Second, we have an interlocal agreement with the City of Stafford for fire services. Meadows Place owns and maintains the fire station located in our city, while Stafford provides the firefighters, equipment, training, and operational management. Through this partnership, fire protection services are delivered to both Meadows Place and Stafford residents from the Meadows Place station.

We are currently approaching the end of our existing five-year agreement with Stafford Fire, and over the coming months both cities will be working together to negotiate a new agreement that best serves the residents of Meadows Place and Stafford. As with any interlocal agreement, the goal is to ensure high-quality emergency services, strong regional cooperation, and responsible stewardship of

taxpayer resources.

These agreements allow smaller cities like Meadows Place to provide professional emergency services at a level that would be difficult and far more expensive to operate completely independently. They also avoid duplication of services, improve coordination between agencies, and make the best use of public resources while maintaining strong emergency response coverage for residents.

At its core, an interlocal agreement is about cooperation between governments to deliver essential services more efficiently, effectively, and responsibly for the communities we serve.



## Public Works

### Just Because It Can Be Flushed, Doesn't Mean You Should

The City of Meadows Place, like most places has experienced pipes and pumps being clogged due to "flushable wipes" and F.O.G. (fats, oils and grease). Items like baby wipes, wet wipes, dude wipes, and others like these should be disposed of in a trash can and not placed in toilets. The accumulations of these items inside of a pipe act like a dam, preventing wastewater flow from reaching the wastewater treatment plant.

#### Why "Flushable" Wipes Are Not Flushable

- **No Disintegration:** Unlike toilet paper, these wipes do not dissolve in water. They remain intact, causing them to snag on pipes and create blockages.
- **Plastic Materials:** Many contain plastic fibers like polyester or rayon, making them durable rather than biodegradable.
- **System Damage:** They clog household pipes, burn out sewage pumps, and create large, expensive clogs in city systems, costing millions of dollars in damages.
- **Marketing Deception:** The term "flushable" is often a marketing term, not a scientific standard, and many are subject to lawsuits.

#### Proper Disposal Method

Keep a small trash can in the bathroom and dispose of wipes immediately after use, regardless of what the packaging says

F.O.G have been plaguing utility systems for ages. It has long been the leading cause for sewer backups and blockages in wastewater collection systems.

#### Proper Disposal Method

The proper way to dispose of cooking oil is to let it cool, pour it into a sealable container (like a jar or milk carton), and toss it in the trash. Never pour oil down the drain, sink, toilet or storm drain as it causes severe pipe blockages and sewer issues. For large amounts, recycle it at a local facility or solidified with materials like cat litter.

### WHAT NOT TO FLUSH

Many items used in the bathroom were not designed to be flushed and can cause clogs in your toilet, drain lines and at your local water treatment plant.

- Do not flush any wipes not called "flushable"
- Never flush anything that can pose a threat to water quality like motor oil, antifreeze, prescription/over the counter medication, paint or nail polish.
- Never flush list: paper towels or tissues, baby wipes, feminine products, hand or surface wipes.

Look for the Do Not Flush logo that is starting to appear on many products that are not flushable or read the directions on the package on how to dispose of properly.



## Scooters, E-Bikes & Motor Bikes: What's What?

*A Simple, Friendly Guide for Meadows Place Families*

You may have noticed more scooters, e-bikes, mini-bikes and dirt bikes around Meadows Place. They can be fun and useful, but they are not all the same. Some are treated like bicycles. Some are motor vehicles. Some should stay on private property or approved off-road areas.

**Quick Question:** What is it, what is required, and can it be used on the street?

**Vehicle Quick Guide** (friendly reminder - not a technical legal bulletin):

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Regular Push Scooter</b> No motor - rider powered</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> safe condition and careful riding.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> Treat like a bicycle. Use streets, sidewalks or paths where allowed; always watch for pedestrians.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>E-Bike / Electric Bicycle</b> Still a bicycle when it has pedals</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> working pedals, limited electric motor, working brake, and front white light + rear red reflector/light at night. Class 3 riders must be 15+.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> Treat like a bicycle. Ride safely on roads/bike areas where bicycles are allowed.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Motor-Assisted Scooter</b> Small scooter-style device</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> at least 2 wheels, a working brake, a deck to stand/sit on, a small motor, and ability to move by human power.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> May operate on streets 35 mph or less, bike paths, and sidewalks unless posted/local rules say otherwise.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Mobility Device / Electric Wheelchair</b> Accessibility device - not a toy</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> safe operation and control.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> Treated like a pedestrian mobility device. Use with care around pedestrians and crossings.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Pocket Bike / Mini Motorbike</b> Small but NOT an E-bike</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> this is not a bicycle if it has no working pedals and is powered mainly by a motor.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> Not for public street or sidewalks unless fully street legal. Private property only where safe and allowed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Dirt Bike / Unregistered Motor Vehicle</b> Gas or electric – still a motor bike</p> <p><b>MUST HAVE:</b> to be on a public road it must be street legal: proper title/registration, license plate, required lights/brakes/equipment, insurance, and a properly licensed rider.</p> <p><b>WHERE IT CAN GO:</b> Not for public streets or sidewalks unless street legal. Otherwise, private property or approved off-road areas only.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>No pedals usually means not an e-bike.</i></p>

**Easy Way to Remember:**

*E-bike* = working pedals + limited electric assist. *No pedals* + *motor* = probably not an e-bike. *Street legal* = registered, insured, properly equipped, and properly licensed rider.

**Friendly Safety Reminder:**

Wear a helmet • Ride at a safe speed • Watch for pedestrians and driveways • Use lights when needed  
Know what you are riding

**International Property Maintenance Code: Sec 304.1 – Exterior Structure General:** The exterior of a structure shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and sanitary so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare.

**Sec. 150.14: Residential Rental Property Licensing and Inspection:** (B)License required. (1) It is unlawful for any person to rent or provide short term rental to an unlicensed single-family dwelling unit to another. With Holidays approaching we are sure to see more short-term rentals.

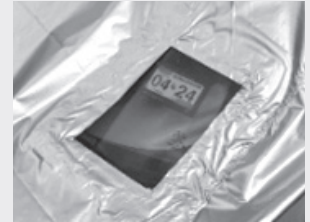


**Sec. 91.050 – Removal of Tree Stumps:** (A)All premises and exterior of a property shall be maintained free from tree stumps of any height. Upon the removal of the tree, all tree stumps shall be ground or cut to ground level.(B)Upon failure of the owner or agent having charge of the property to

cut, destroy or grind the tree stump after service of notice of a violation, he or she shall be subject to prosecution in accordance with the city code and prescribed by the authority having jurisdiction. Upon failure to comply with the notice of violation, any duly authorized employee of the jurisdiction or contractor hired by the jurisdiction shall be authorized to enter upon the property in violation and cut and grind the tree stump down, and the cost of the removal shall be paid by the owner or agent responsible for the property.



**Sec. 91.066. - Nuisance Declared:** (B)The covering of a motor vehicle by the use of a tarpaulin (tarp) or other similar cover which is visible from a public place or public right-of-way, and not in any fully screened enclosure, is prohibited, unless that cover is made of a durable fabric, which is custom fitted to the particular vehicle to which it is attached. The motor vehicle



cover shall have tailored mirror pockets, antennae grommets, and eyelets to allow the cover to be pulled securely around the body of the vehicle. The motor vehicle cover shall not obscure the vehicle's license plate, motor vehicle inspection certificate, or motor vehicle registration certificate. Clear vinyl or cutouts shall be sewn into the cover to ensure the visibility of the vehicle's license plate, inspection, and registration certificate.

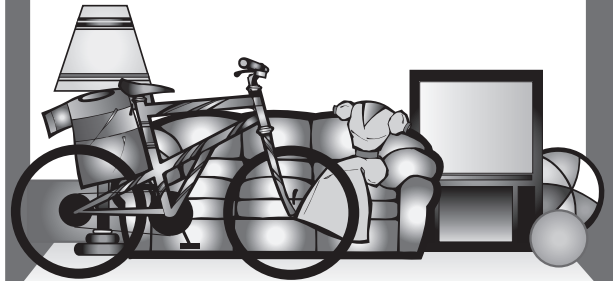
