The Meadows Place Police Department Reminds Everyone With This Tax Season Alert:

A stax season approaches, cybercriminals are ramping up efforts to exploit unsuspecting taxpayers through sophisticated IRS tax scams. These scams not only threaten financial loss but also risk identity theft. Below, we break down

common tactics, real-world examples, and actionable steps to safeguard your information.

Common IRS Scams in 2025

- 1. Phishing Emails & Texts: Scammers impersonate the IRS via emails or texts claiming you're owed a refund or owe back taxes. These messages often include malicious links or attachments designed to steal personal data.
 - The IRS never initiates contact via email, text, or social media to request personal information.
- 2. Fake "Offer in Compromise" Programs: Fraudulent ads promise to reduce tax debt through secret IRS programs. Victims are directed to fake websites to pay fees or share sensitive details like Social Security numbers 79.
- **3. Ghost Preparers:** Unlicensed tax preparers lure victims with promises of inflated refunds. They often refuse to sign returns, demand cash payments, or disappear after filing fraudulent claims 59.
- 4. Economic Impact Payment Scams: Scammers exploit news of stimulus programs, sending texts like: "You qualify for a \$1,400 payment! Submit your bank details now." These links lead to phishing sites 7.
- **5. Imposter Calls Threatening Arrest:** Aggressive callers spoof IRS phone numbers, threatening arrest or deportation unless immediate payment is made via gift cards or wire transfers 10.

Safety Measures to Avoid Scams:

• Verify Communications: The IRS contacts taxpayers first by mail, not email, text, or phone. Use an Identity Protection PIN (IP PIN): This six-digit code prevents scammers from filing returns in your name. Check URLs: Only use irs.gov for tax-related actions. Avoid clicking links in unsolicited messages. Choose Reputable Preparers: Ensure your tax professional has a valid Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN) and signs your return.

• Enable Two-Factor Authentication: Protect online accounts with encryption and updated security software.

How to Report IRS Scams:

- 1. Phishing Emails/Texts: Forward suspicious messages to phishing@irs.gov.
- 2. Fraudulent Preparers: Submit Form 14157 to report misconduct.
- 3. Identity Theft: File *Form 14039* (Identity Theft Affidavit) IdentityTheft.gov.
- 4. Tax Fraud by Individuals/Businesses: Use Form 3949-A.
- 5. Whistleblower Claims: Submit *Form 211* for potential monetary rewards.

Cities and Utility companies have urged into customers for years to ignore the "flushable "label on wipes and instead throw them in the trash. They've also communicated the fat, oil,

yet both materials have been making their way to the wastewater treatment plants and causing costly issues.

These problems are nothing news. Flushable wipes and FOG have been plaguing wastewater treatment facilities for decades. But for the last few years, water professionals have seen an alarming increase in the level of build-up at their plants.

Why You Should Never Flush Flushable Wipes

It's widely marketed that a flushable wipe are designed to disintegrate once we flush the toilet, but in reality, they don't. Unlike toilet paper that breaks down in roughly 24 hours, wipes remain intact once they make their way down the drain.

These sanitary products have been found in drainpipes months after being flushed. Because they do not break down, they build upon one another and form a massive mound that can clog pipes and back up plumbing systems, which is costly to repair.

If wipes make it to a treatment plant, they become caught on the edge of lift station pumps. As wipes continue to collect on these pipes, they begin to bog down the treatment system, damage equipment, burn up pumps, and in some cases, cause the water treatment system to fail.

Too many wipes in the treatment system can cause raw sewage to back up into homes, which is never a pleasant experience. And when these materials combine with FOG, they create an expensive foe for wastewater treatment systems.

How Bad is it to Pour Grease Down the Drain?

Restaurants are equipped with grease traps to handle the cooking grease they generate, but households are typically not equipped with this key wastewater industry tool. And with more people cooking at home, more fat, oil, and grease (FOG) are building up in treatment systems across the Lone Star State.

FOG combines with flushable wipes as they make their way to a treatment facility. Once there, both materials will accumulate



into a "greaseberg", which is a large mound of non-biodegradable sanitary materials combined with FOG. This material can completely clog a sewer system and requires frequent jetting and chemical additives to break down.

Greaseberg can also cause major issues with lift stations and sewage pumps downstream. When the build-up reaches a wastewater treatment plant, it can block screens and filter systems, clog sludge pumps, and increase sludge volumes – all of which are costly to repair.

Addressing these issues at Meadows Place wastewater treatment plant will include upgrade to the lift station pumps and controls and the installation of a mechanical bar screen to prevent these foreign materials from entering the system. And after the equipment has been installed, the city/operator will have to address the decades long build up of inorganic material in the bottom of the tanks within the facility. Fortunately, the facility can be cleaned without interruption of the treatment process.

Water Meter Box Covers

Residential water meters are typically located at the Right of Way in front of homes. From time to time, the lids on these meter boxes go missing or are damaged. If you notice a meter box that is damaged, please call the City at 281-983-2950 to report them.





Spring Begins



Spring adds new life and new joy, with the tiny buds in March and the full blooms in April. Let's take some time to see the beauty in all things, even the barest branches.

IMPC 304.2: Exterior walls/trims-repaired/replaced repainted: All exterior surfaces, including but not limited to, doors, door and window frames, cornices, porches, trim, balconies, decks and fences, shall be maintained in good condition. Exterior wood surfaces, other than decayresistant woods, shall be protected from the elements and decay by painting or other protective covering or treatment. Peeling, flaking and chipped paint shall be eliminated and surfaces repainted. All siding and masonry joints, as well as those between the building envelope and the perimeter of windows, doors and skylights, shall be maintained weather resistant and watertight. All metal surfaces subject to rust or corrosion shall be coated to inhibit such rust and corrosion, and all surfaces with rust or corrosion shall be stabilized and coated to inhibit future rust and corrosion. Oxidation stains shall be removed from exterior surfaces. Surfaces designed for stabilization by oxidation are exempt from these requirements.



Sec. 150.66. - Replacement of dead, dying or diseased landscaping materials: In the event the building official determines that any required vegetative landscaping material has died, is dying or is so badly diseased that the same cannot be saved or otherwise rehabilitated, the building official may direct the property owner being in control of the street yard to replace the dead, dying or diseased vegetative materials with like or similar replacement materials.



Roof gutters or downspouts:



The roof and flashing shall be sound, tight and not have defects that admit rain. Roof drainage shall be adequate to prevent dampness or deterioration in the walls or interior portion of the structure. Rood drains, gutters and downspouts shall be maintained in good repair and free from obstructions. Roof water shall not be discharged in a manner that creates a public nuisance.

150.01-R104.2: Applications and permits needed. The city shall receive applications, review construction documents and issue permit for the erection and alteration of buildings and structures inspect the premises for which such permits have been issued and enforce compliance with the provisions of this code.


