TAX SEASON SCAM AWARENESS

- The IRS will not call, text, or email demanding payment
- Watch for threats, urgency, or requests for gift cards or cryptocurrency

CYBER SAFETY

- Use strong, unique passwords and multi-factor authentication
- Be cautious of unexpected emails, links, or attachments

HOME & NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY

- Lock doors and windows at all times
- Report suspicious activity immediately

What is Storm Water Pollution?

Storm Water runoff is water from rain that does not soak into the ground. It flows from rooftops, over paved areas, bare soil, and sloped lawns. As it flows, stormwater collects and transports animal waste, trash and litter, pesticides, fertilizers, oil, and grease and other potential pollutants into the storm drains.

Rain washes pollutants from impervious surfaces streets, parking lots, construction sites, shopping centers and residential yards into storm sewers and flows untreated into nearby bayous, creeks, fish and wildlife habitat, downstream recreational areas, and drinking water supplies. Toxic substances from motor vehicles, as well as the careless application of pesticides and fertilizers also threaten water quality and can kill fish and other aquatic life. Bacteria from pet and animal waste get washed into lakes and waterways making them unsafe for water sports like wading, swimming, water skiing and fishing.

A sanitary sewer system and storm and a storm sewer system are not the same. Water that goes down toilets, sinks, showers, or other inside drains flows to the wastewater treatment plant. Storm sewer flows are not treated, so

it is important to remember that any type of surface water runoff—not just rainfall—will be collected in the stormwater management system. When you wash your car on the driveway, for example, all that water, road oils, dirt and grime end up in the storm drain.

All the runoff from our streets and yards ends up the Galveston Bay and if that run off is polluted then we are polluting the Bay.

Three Types of Storm Water Pollution

- Litter: cigarette butts, food wrappers, plastic bags etc.
- Natural Pollution: leaves, yard clippings and animal feces.
- Chemical pollution: fertilizers, oil, paint, and detergents.

Please be aware of the effects of pollution the water in our State.


Also - all drainage from a pool must be directed to the sanitary sewer system thru an approved "P" trap. And may not be drained on the street.

Hello Spring!

I would like to thank all the citizens for their engagement with code enforcement. As we continue to make our newsletter an avenue for information, Let's continue the feedback and insights on our beautiful city.

Things to remember:

Sec. 150.14: Residential rental property licensing and inspection: (B)License required. (1) It is unlawful for any person to rent or provide short term rental to an unlicensed single-family dwelling unit to another. With Holidays approaching we are sure to see more short-term rentals.



Sec. 150.66: Replacement of dead, dying or diseased landscaping materials: In the event the building official determines that any required vegetative landscaping material has died, is dying or is so badly diseased that the same cannot be saved or otherwise rehabilitated, the building official may direct the property owner being in control of the street yard to replace the dead, dying or diseased vegetative materials with like or similar replacement materials. It shall be a violation of the code in the event the same is not replaced upon direction of the building official.



Sec. 91.020: Depositing on public or private property; accumulations prohibited: It shall be unlawful for any person, owner, manager, tenant and/or occupant of any lot, building or premises, in person or by his or her servant, agent or employee, to cast, throw, drop, place, sweep, deposit or allow to accumulate, or allow the same to be done in any manner whatsoever, any solid waste, rubbish, weeds, brush, offal or other substance or thing whatsoever of any offensive nature or deleterious to health, in or upon any street, sidewalk, park, other public place, vacant lot or any yard space of privately owned premises, or in or upon the waters of any canal, stream or

other watercourse or public waters, or in any drain, sewer or receiving basin within the city, or in, upon or about any building or premises within the city, except as herein provided.



Sec. 91.066. - Nuisance declared: (B)The covering of a motor vehicle by the use of a tarpaulin (tarp) or other similar cover which is visible from a public place or public right-of-way, and not in any fully screened enclosure, is prohibited, unless that cover is made of a durable fabric, which is custom fitted to the particular vehicle to which it is attached. The motor vehicle cover shall have tailored mirror pockets, antennae grommets, and eyelets to allow the cover to be pulled securely around the body of the vehicle. The motor vehicle cover shall not obscure the vehicle's license plate, motor vehicle inspection certificate, or motor vehicle registration certificate. Clear vinyl or cutouts shall be sewn into the cover to ensure the visibility of the vehicle's license plate, inspection, and registration certificate.


